Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Ray Skillman 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the Years Ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Ray Skillman 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Ray Skillman GMC Truck, Inc. and participating employers (collectively, the Companies). Employees become eligible to participate January 1, April 1, July 1 or October 1, following the completion of one year of eligible service (1,000 hours) and the attainment of age 21. Effective April 1, 2024, the Plan excludes residents of Puerto Rico. Prior to April 1, 2024, the Plan excludes leased employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective April 1, 2024, the Plan changed recordkeepers from Empower Retirement Services to Merrill Lynch and trustee from Empower Trust Company, LLC to Bank of America, N.A. In conjunction, the Plan was restated due to this change in recordkeepers and trustees. Significant changes to the plan provisions as a result of the restatement are disclosed in each applicable area.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants are permitted to designate up to 100% of annual compensation as after-tax contributions, with the exception of highly compensated employees who are limited to 25%. Effective April 1, 2024, participants are permitted to designate a portion or all of their deferral contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

The Companies may elect to make discretionary matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Companies matched 100% up to 2% of eligible compensation of eligible employees.

Contributions (Continued)

Additionally, the Companies may elect to make discretionary non-elective contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Companies did not elect to make any discretionary non-elective contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations as mandated by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Investment Options

Participants may direct all their contributions among one or more funds subject to the allocation limitations set forth in the Plan. Changes in allocation of future contributions and transfers among funds of presently invested contributions are permitted pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Companies' contributions and (b) plan earnings (losses) and charged with the participant's benefit payments and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings (losses), account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Companies' discretionary matching contribution portion and the discretionary non-elective portion of their accounts is based on the following table:

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. If a participant's account is worth at least \$1,000, the participant may elect to receive their benefit payment at termination or the normal retirement date. In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of the participant's vested account balance are also permitted upon the participant's attainment of age 59½ or if the participant is still employed after having reached the required minimum distribution age. In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of the participant's vested employer contributions account balance are also permitted upon the participant's attainment of age 40 or if the participant is still employed after having reached the required minimum distribution age. Under certain conditions participants may receive a hardship distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$178,197 and \$28,388, respectively. These amounts will be used in accordance with the applicable plan provisions. During 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$83,859 and \$29,493, respectively, were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Non-Interest-Bearing Cash

Non-interest-bearing cash is defined as currency on hand, in demand deposits.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) and requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, trustee, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Distribution fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. The Plan also pays certain investment advisory and plan administration fees from plan assets. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Recent Accounting and Regulatory Pronouncements

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Department of Labor (DOL). The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

3. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the contract value of the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was \$379,424 and \$3,567,058, respectively. The Plan elected to initiate the 12-month put option in March 2024 and the contract will be fully liquidated in March 2025.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully-benefit responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include the following: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,
- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of a different methodology or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. CERTIFICATION OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The financial data included in the accompanying financial statements as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, have been certified as complete and accurate by, Bank of America, N.A., a qualified institution certifying from April 1, 2024 to December 31, 2024 and Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, qualified institutions certifying prior to April 1, 2024. The following certified information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate, and has not been audited by the independent auditors for the Plan: investments at fair value, investment at contract value, non-interest bearing cash, interest and dividends, other income, and net appreciation in fair value of investments.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Companies may determine.

7. TAX STATUS

The Companies collectively adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document, which received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself and has been amended since adopting the non-standardized pre-approved plan document; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

US GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. In December 2024, the Plan was notified that it was selected for a DOL audit for the plan year ended December 31, 2023. The DOL has begun their fieldwork, however, has not proposed any adjustments or assessed any penalties as of the date of the report.

8. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the previous custodian, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain administrative expenses were paid by the Plan or the Companies. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Employees of the Companies provide administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

In addition, the Companies are eligible for expense reduction credits from the previous custodian. Total amounts received from the custodian and used to offset expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$45,548 and \$125,849, respectively.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

11. EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

Excess contributions represent amounts withheld from participants in excess of IRS limitations that are to be refunded at year end. As of December 31, 2024, \$166,565 of excess contributions and earnings thereon are required to be refunded prior to December 31, of the subsequent year. These amounts were refunded to participants prior to March of the year following the plan year end. Excess contributions and earnings are netted against employee contributions and net appreciation in fair value in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

12. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During 2024, 2023, and 2022, the Companies failed to remit to the Plan's trustees certain employee contributions totaling \$7,279,254 within the period prescribed by Department of Labor's regulations. Delays in remitting contributions to the trustee were due to administrative errors, and the Companies has made and will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delays.

13. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, which was the date that the financial statements were available for issuance and noted the following subsequent events:

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to remove the auto-enrollment provision. Additionally, employees are now eligible to participate following the completion of two months of service and the attainment of age 21 and will be enrolled on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date participants satisfy eligibility requirements.
