INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Savings and Profit Sharing Committee of the
Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

NOTE 1 - GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

Effective February 2, 1998, the Lowndes Corporation Savings and Profit Sharing Plan changed its name to the Tindall Savings and Profit Sharing Plan.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Tindall Corporation (“the Company”), designed to comply with Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan provides benefits to participants upon retirement, hardship, attainment of age 65, death, or termination of service. From time to time, the Plan has been amended and restated.

The Plan is administered by the Savings and Profit Sharing Committee (the “Committee”) appointed by the Company’s Chairman, the President, and Chief Executive Officer. They have the right at any time to remove members of the Committee who serve without compensation. The Committee has complete responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan including, without litigation, the power to construe and interpret the Plan and to resolve all questions that arise thereunder. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) applicable to defined contribution or individual account plans. The Committee believes the Plan meets all significant requirements of ERISA.

Contributions

Participants in the Plan may contribute up to 50% of their total pre-tax compensation, as defined in the Plan (“salary reduction contribution”). Salary reduction contributions were limited by the Internal Revenue Code to \$23,000 and \$22,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who attain age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Such contributions were limited to \$7,500 and \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

All newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they elect not to participate in the Plan. Their contributions are invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The automatic deferral percentage for an automatically enrolled participant is set at 2% of eligible compensation, unless the participant makes a contrary election. The automatic deferral percentage will increase by 1% per year up to a maximum of 7% of compensation each May 1st. However, the participant’s first automatic deferral percentage increase will be a “change date” at least twelve months following the participant’s start date of the automatic deferral program, unless a contrary election is made.

The Company may match a discretionary amount of participants’ salary reduction contributions to the Plan. The Company may also provide further discretionary contributions, known as a profit share. The profit share is allocated based on each participant’s annual compensation as a percentage of the total annual compensation of all participants. Company contributions for highly compensated employees may be limited to comply with Internal Revenue Code discrimination requirements.

At the discretion of the Committee, participants may be permitted to deposit amounts received from other qualified plans. These amounts are deposited into the Plan under its rollover provisions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The matching contributions are invested in the same options. Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Plan Eligibility and Vesting

Employees are eligible to make salary reduction contributions and receive employer matching contributions if they have completed one hour of service. Employees are eligible to receive the employer discretionary contribution (profit share) if they have completed 500 hours of service. The Plan entry date is the first day of the month, immediately following the date eligibility requirements are met. For the period from January 1, 2019 through July 31, 2019, participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon and became fully vested with respect to contributions by the Company as follows:

Effective August 1, 2019, the Plan's vesting schedule was amended. The Plan amendment states participants with one hour of service on or after August 1, 2019 will be subject to the 3-year graded vesting schedule in the Plan for purposes of matching and nonelective contributions. Prior participants who do not have one Hour of Service on or after August 1, 2019 will remain subject to the 5-year graded vesting schedule for purposes of matching and nonelective contributions.

Payments and Withdrawals

Following a participant's retirement, death, or other separation from service, distribution of amounts credited to the participant's account will occur. The participant or the named beneficiary will receive an amount equal to the vested value of the participant's account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Company contributions serve to reduce future Company contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan includes a loan to participant feature, which allows participants to borrow against their vested account balances. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the previous twelve months. Loan transactions are treated as transfers between the investment fund and the loan fund. Loan terms may not exceed 5 years, with the exception of loans for the purchase of a primary residence, which may extend to 15 years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Participants may have up to two outstanding loans at a time. Interest was set at the prime rate during 2024 and 2023 and ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% for loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participant loans are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Under ASC 326, management evaluated expected credit losses and determined that no allowance was necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, because loans are fully secured by participant account balances and repayment is typically made through payroll deductions.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reported period. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at the unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

A fair value hierarchy was established that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and have the highest priority, and Level 3 inputs consist of significant unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds) are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts are valued at the net asset value of units held by the plan at year-end. The NAV is determined by the custodian of the fund and is based upon the fair value of the underlying assets held by the fund.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that is not indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 9 - TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The Plan pays for certain trustee expenses to the individual investment funds, including the common/collective trusts, along with investment advisory fees. These administration expenses totaled \$258,647 and \$235,779 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. In addition, certain fees with parties-in-interest of \$29,500 and \$27,000 were paid by the Company during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. All fees paid to parties-in-interest were based upon customary and reasonable rates for such services.

NOTE 10 - TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated May 12, 1995, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Under the present federal income tax laws, a participating employee will not become subject to federal income tax with respect to contributions or income earned thereon until the participating employee's account is distributed to the employee from the Plan.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 11 - RECONCILIATION TO FORM 5500

Certain information reported on the Plan's annual report on the Form 5500 (the "Form") differs from the related information presented in the accompanying financial statements. There is a difference resulting from the Form reporting the fair value of the underlying investments of the common/collective trusts, instead of using NAV as a practical expedient to estimate fair value (as described in Note 4).

NOTE 12 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for plan benefits.

NOTE 13 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to provisions of ERISA. If the Plan should be terminated, each participating employee will become fully vested and will be entitled to receive payment from his or her account as provided in the Plan. Because the Plan is an individual account plan, it is not insured under the plan termination provision of ERISA as administered by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

NOTE 14 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 14, 2025, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Subsequent events after that date have not been evaluated.
