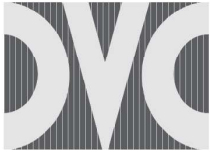

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Friendly Holding Company Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Friendly Holding Company Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Betten Friendly Motors, Inc.; Friendly Holding Company; TOGR, LLC (d/b/a Toyota of Grand Rapids); Preferred Automotive Group, LLC (d/b/a Preferred Ford of Grand Haven); Betten Auto Center (d/b/a Preferred Chevrolet Buick GMC); and PCGH, LLC (d/b/a Preferred Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram of Grand Haven) (together, the "Company") who have attained 90 days of service as defined by the Plan and are at least 21 years of age. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Participant and Employer Contributions

Contributions to the Plan are made as follows:

Participants

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of base compensation, up to the statutory limit, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options for participants.

Employer Matching Contributions

The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan on behalf of each participant that contributes to the Plan. For 2024 and 2023, the contributions were equal to 25% of the first 4% of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan.

Employer Discretionary Contributions

The Company may make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan in an amount determined by the board of directors. Discretionary contributions are allocated on a ratio of each participant's compensation to total compensation. For 2024 and 2023, the Company elected not to make a discretionary contribution to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contribution, the Company's discretionary contribution, as well as allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on investment earnings on account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in compensation deferrals and rollover contributions plus earnings thereon at all times.

Participants are vested in employer matching and discretionary contributions according to the following schedule:

0% up to 2 years of service
20% after 2 years of service
40% after 3 years of service
60% after 4 years of service
80% after 5 years of service
100% after 6 years of service

Participants are 100% vested if they die, become disabled, or attain retirement age prior to termination of employment.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The notes have various maturities and annual interest rates, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of services, a participant may elect to receive their vested interest as a lump sum or installment payments. In-service and hardship distributions are permitted pursuant to the terms of the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$65,988 and \$42,626, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or administrative expenses. The Company applied \$11,590 and \$-0- of forfeitures to reduce administrative expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

Date of Management's Review of Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent transactions and events through October 13, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that no items require additional disclosure.

NOTE 4 – GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower). Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract meets the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$66,039 and \$42,679, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE 5 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in administrative expenses.

The Plan also made payments to Plante Moran for auditing services, and Principal Securities and Leafhouse Financial Advisors for investment advisory and brokerage services provided to the Plan's participants. These amounts are included in administrative expenses and net appreciation in fair value of investments, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the plan sponsor has the right to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, participants would receive their account balance in accordance with the plan provisions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted Empower Retirement, LLC’s defined contribution pre-approved plan. It has been determined to be acceptable under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) by a letter dated November 14, 2022. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to December 31, 2021.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect the participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN’S CUSTODIANS

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians of the Plan’s investment assets.
