Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Star Tribune Retirement Plan O (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following description of the Star Tribune Retirement Plan O (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a noncontributory defined benefit pension plan that covered substantially all nonunion employees prior to December 31, 2009, of the Star Tribune Media Company LLC (the Company) and its affiliates. The Company is a single member LLC wholly owned, through a series of intermediate parents, by Star Tribune Media Holdings Company. The Plan is controlled and managed by Star Tribune Media Company LLC (the Plan Administrator). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan's trustee is The Bank of New York Mellon/BNY Mellon, N.A. (Trustee).

Effective December 31, 2009, the Plan was frozen. As of such date, no new participants are admitted to the Plan, and no further benefits are earned by any participant in the Plan whether they remain in the Company's employment or not. The Plan was last amended January 1, 2022, to allow for the option to receive small annuity payments for accounts with a vested balance of \$5,000 or less.

The Plan is funded with an annual contribution within the minimum and maximum limits under ERISA, representing current cost, plus amortization of prior service costs. There were no contributions required to be made for the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, after applicable funding balances were applied, however, the Company made an employer contribution of \$1,293,000 for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024. No contributions were made for the Plan year ended December 31, 2023.

Pension Benefits

Under the terms of the Plan, participants are eligible for monthly benefit payments upon reaching regular retirement age. Early retirement is available after either attaining age 55 with a minimum of ten years of service or completing 25 years of vesting service. The Plan provides for 100% vesting after five years of service (ten years prior to January 1, 1988).

Monthly benefit payments are determined by application of a formula based on 1% of the final average monthly earnings up to the integration level for the Plan year in which termination of employment occurs, plus 1.5% of the final average monthly earnings in excess of the integration level for such Plan year, multiplied by years of service (not exceeding 30) prior to December 31, 2009. Participants will receive a lump-sum distribution in the event that the actuarial equivalent present value of the participant's entire vested benefit is \$5,000 or less. If the actuarial equivalent present value of a participant's entire vested benefit exceeds \$1,000, but does not exceed \$5,000, the amount shall be paid as an automatic rollover as required by regulations. The normal form of payment is a qualified joint and survivor annuity for married participants, and a single life annuity for nonmarried participants.

Death Benefits

In the event of a death of a participant prior to retirement, the beneficiary will receive a death benefit equal to the value of the employee's accumulated pension benefits.

Note 2 - Plan Termination

While the Company has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan or to discontinue contributions, it has the right to do so at any time, subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. Should the Plan be terminated at some future time, all participants become 100% vested in benefits earned as of the termination date.

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

1. Annuity benefits that former employees or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the lowest benefit that was payable (or would have been payable) during those three years. The amount is further limited to the lowest benefit that would be payable under the Plan's provisions in effect at any time during the five years preceding the Plan's termination.
2. Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) (a U.S. Government agency) up to the applicable limitations.
3. All other vested benefits (that is, vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).
4. All non-vested benefits.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivors' pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect at the date of the Plan's termination.

Whether all participants receive their benefits, should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations, and may also depend on the financial condition of the Plan sponsor and the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

If, however, the Plan is terminated for any reason other than the bankruptcy or near bankruptcy of the Company, and the Plan has insufficient assets, the Company will be required to pay the Plan an amount which, together with Plan assets, will satisfy all benefits accumulated to the date of the Plan's termination.

Note 3 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investment in the Star Tribune Master Trust (the Master Trust) is stated at current fair market (see Note 7). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Benefit Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by its investment advisers and custodians. See Note 7 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis, and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net investment income (loss) from the Master Trust includes interest, dividends, net gain on sale of assets, and unrealized asset appreciation (depreciation), less investment advisory fees and management fees.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Derivative Financial Information

The Plan's investment policy allows the use of derivatives by investment managers of the Master Trust for investment portfolio strategies that include enhancing returns and facilitating shifts in asset allocation. See Note 7.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits at the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

As described in Note 7, the Plan (through the use of the Master Trust) invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made, and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment-related expenses may be included in investment income (loss) of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Federal Income Taxes

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated January 18, 2017, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Subsequent to the issuance of this determination letter, the Plan was amended. However, the Company, Plan management and the Plan's tax counsel believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and the Plan and related trust continue to be tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 4 - Funding Policy

Contributions by the Company that meet the funding requirements of ERISA are determined by actuarial valuations and are made to the Master Trust (see Note 7). The contributions are determined by the Plan's independent actuary and are expected to be sufficient to provide the Plan with assets to pay estimated pension benefits to Plan participants.

Contributions to the Plan are determined based upon calculations made by the actuary and are designed to annually fund current normal costs, and to amortize the unfunded liability over 30 years, as specified in the Newspaper Relief Act, or a period of time that results in annual contributions equal to, or in excess of, the minimum funding requirements. The Plan met the minimum funding standards for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and there were no required contributions attributable to 2023 after applicable funding balances were applied. The Company made an employer contribution of \$1,293,000 for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 5 - Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits (APB)

APBs are those future periodic payments, including lump sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered. APBs include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan are accumulated based on the employee's compensation during each year of credited service. The APB for active employees will equal the accumulation, with interest, of the annual benefit accruals as of the benefit information date. Benefits payable under all circumstances (retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment) are included to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee service rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of APBs is determined by an independent actuary and is that amount which results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the APBs to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

Computations of the actuarial present value of APBs were made as of January 1, 2024. Had the valuation been performed as of December 31, 2023, there would be no material differences.

Note 6 - Information Certified by the Trustee

Note 7 - Master Trust

Assets for the Plan are held in the Master Trust under a Master Trust Agreement with the Trustee. The participating plans in the Master Trust are the Star Tribune Retirement Plan A, Plan G, and Plan O. The purpose of combining the assets of the three plans is to pool investment transactions and achieve uniform rates of return on comparable funds under all plans. Each plan owns an undivided interest in net assets of the Master Trust based on its equity in the Master Trust.

The Plan's share of net investment income or loss is determined by the Trustee based on the daily weighted-average ratio of the fair value of the Plan's equity in the Master Trust to the total net assets of the Master Trust. The fair value of the Plan's interest in the Master Trust was based on the value of the Plan's interest in the trust, plus actual contributions and allocated investment income, less actual distributions and allocated administrative expenses.

Under the terms of the trust agreement, the Trustee manages trust funds on behalf of the Plan. In accordance with the trust agreement, certain assets of the Plan are held together with assets of other plans sponsored by the Company.

Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Equity and mutual funds (including money market mutual funds) – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust – Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the collective trust. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the fund is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis used by the fund for current transactions. Investment managers may use hedging or derivative strategies to generate income yield and to hedge against adverse changes in the market.

Alternative investments (including investment partnership) – The investment partnership is valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the fund. The NAV, as provided by the custodian is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Other alternative investments are valued on other unobservable inputs of fund holdings in real estate and alternative investments (including, but not limited to, long/short equity/credit investment partnerships). Investment partnership funds may use hedging or derivative strategies to generate income yield and to hedge against adverse changes in the market.

Note 10 - Subsequent Events

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended for the following:

- Pension payments will begin on the date elected by the participant, but no later than the participant's Normal Retirement Date. If a participant has not had a termination of employment and the Normal Retirement Date has been reached, pension payments will begin on the first of the month after the participant's termination.
- If a participant fails to complete the application to begin pension payments before the dates mentioned above, Star Tribune will make reasonable assumptions to compute the participant's pension payments and shall pay the participant as a normal pension or Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity as applicable.
- A participant or beneficiary must maintain his or her current address on file with Star Tribune. If Star Tribune is unable to locate a participant or beneficiary his or her benefit will be forfeited. If the participant or beneficiary is later located, his or her benefits will be reinstated (without adjustment for investment gains or losses) and any missed payments owed will be made without interest. Unclaimed benefits no longer have a five-year limitation period and no longer are to be used solely to defray Plan expenses.

Effective April 1, 2025, the Plan is subject to benefit restrictions due to the Plan's funded status.

The Plan Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

The method of computing the actuarial value of assets complies with rules governing the calculation of such values under the Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA). These rules produce smoothed values that reflect the underlying market value of plan assets but fluctuate less than the market value. As a result, the actuarial value of assets will be lower than the market value in some years and greater in other years. However, over the long term under PPA's smoothing rules, the method has a significant bias to produce an actuarial value of assets that is below the market value of assets.

The plan sponsor furnished participant data and claims data as of 1/1/2024. Information on assets, contributions and plan provisions was supplied by the plan sponsor.

Data and other information were reviewed for reasonableness and consistency, but no audit was performed. Based on discussions with the plan sponsor, assumptions or estimates were made when data were not available, and the data was adjusted to reflect any significant events that occurred between the date the data was collected and the measurement date.

Plan Provisions

Plan sponsor

Star Tribune Media Company, LLC

Effective date and most recent amendment

April 1, 1949. The most recent amendment reflected in this valuation was adopted and effective on December 22, 2009. The plan has also been amended to freeze all benefit accruals as of December 31, 2009. The plan was amended in 2016 to provide a one-time lump sum option during 2016 to deferred vested participants with lump sum values less than \$50,000. The plan was amended in 2021 to purchase a group annuity contract for participants with benefits less than \$500 per month.

Plan year

The twelve-month period ending December 31.

Covered employees

Any person regularly employed by Star Tribune Media Company or the Cowles Media Company, who receives regular payment of wages by checks issued from the Minneapolis Office, and who is not a Plan A, Plan G, or a bargaining unit employee in the fleet department, or prior to December 30, 1996, except for an Employee Salesperson, who is not in a position which is classified as an independent contractor. On and after December 30, 1996 Employee Salespersons are not covered employees. Certain former employees of Cowles Media Company who transferred to ADX in March 1993 are also covered employees.

Effective April 1, 1988, employees of the Cowles Enthusiast Media, Inc. (CEM), who were participants under the Historical Times, Inc. Pension Plan became qualified employees following merger of the HTI Plan into this plan. CEM employees who were previously employed by Blue-J, Inc. and Gum Tree Store Press, Inc., became qualified employees on January 1, 1989 and January 1, 1990, respectively. Certain employees that are employed in operations that were acquired by CEM are not eligible to become qualified employees. Employees of Bowhunter Magazine, Inc. were eligible to participate as of December 5, 1991.

Effective January 1, 1995, employees of additional specified subsidiaries of CEM, Cowles Business Media, Inc. (CBM), Cowles Creative Publishing (CCP), became covered employees. Subsequent to January 1, 1995 employees of certain additional specified subsidiaries have become covered employees as provided by plan amendment.

Participation date

January 1 or July 1 following age 21 and one year of service of 1,000 hours.

Continuous service

Uninterrupted service of at least 20 hours per week as a Plan O, Plan G or Plan A employee after March 31, 1942.

Definitions

Vesting service

One year for each 1,000-hour calendar year of employment, but not less than continuous service. Service prior to age 18 is disregarded.

Credited service

Prior to January 1, 1976, years and months of continuous service after age 21.

After December 31, 1975, one year for each 1,000-hour calendar year of employment after age 21, but not less than continuous service during the same period.

Special provisions apply for determining credited service of eligible participants who were employed by the Great Falls Tribune Company and Rapid City Journal Company prior to March 28, 1990.

Certified earnings

Effective January 1, 1988, regular salary, straight-time base pay, overtime pay, management incentive bonuses, incentive pay plan for advertising or circulation department personnel and payments under a commission plan. Prior to 1994, certified earnings for an Employee Salesperson equal 80% of the individual's gross profits. For 1994 and later, certified earnings for an Employee Salesperson equal the individual's gross profits for that plan year, reduced by the amount of automobile allowance paid to the individual for that plan year.

Final earnings

The average of the highest four consecutive plan years of certified earnings during the 15-year period ending on the earlier of the participant's termination date or retirement date.

Integration level

An amount equal to \$1,400 multiplied by a fraction, the numerator of which is the Social Security taxable wage base in effect in year of termination and the denominator of which is \$48,000.

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Normal retirement date (NRD)

Last month in which person attains age 65, or if over age 60 at entry, the fifth anniversary of participation or completion of five years of vesting service, if earlier.

Regular retirement date (RRD)

The later of normal retirement date and the last day of the month following regular retirement age based on the following:

Year of Birth	Regular Retirement Age
Before 1938	65
1938-1954	66
After 1954	67

Monthly pension benefit

The greater of (1) and (2):

1. An amount equal to years of credited service (not exceeding 30) times the sum of:
 - (a) 1% of final earnings up to the integration level
 - (b) 1.5% of final earnings in excess of the integration level
2. An amount determined as if termination of employment occurred on December 31, 1988 under the plan provisions in effect on that date.

Effective December 31, 2009, the plan is frozen and benefits will cease to accrue under the formulas described above.

Monthly cash balance annuity

For CEM, CBM and CCP employees, a monthly annuity payable for life commencing on the participant's elected distribution date equal to the immediate annuity equivalent to the participant's cash balance account.

Effective December 31, 2009, the plan is frozen and benefits will cease to accrue under the formula described above.

Monthly preretirement spouse benefit

50% of the monthly pension benefit as of the date of death, reduced for the 50% joint and survivor election and reduced for payment as early as the participant's 55th birthday. If eligible for early, regular or late retirement, benefit is based on joint and 100% survivor election.

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Eligibility for Benefits

Normal retirement	Retirement on RRD.
Early retirement	Retirement before RRD and on or after both attaining age 55 and completing ten years of vesting service, or 25 years of vesting service with no age requirement.
Late retirement	Retirement after RRD.
Deferred vested	Termination for reasons other than death or retirement after completing five years of vesting service.
Preretirement spouse benefit	Death while eligible for normal, early, late, or deferred vested retirement benefits, with a surviving spouse.
Cash balance survivor benefit	Death after accrual of a transition credit or benefit credit and vested.

Monthly Benefit Paid Upon the Following Events

Normal retirement	For employees of Star Tribune, monthly pension benefit determined as of RRD. For employees of CEM, CBM, and CCP, the greater of the monthly pension benefit (if applicable) or the cash balance account. Participants may elect to receive cash balance account as a lump sum or as an equivalent monthly cash balance annuity.
Early retirement	<p>For employees of Star Tribune monthly pension benefit determined as of early retirement date, reduced according to a table graded by age and years of service. For other participants, the monthly pension is reduced 6.667% for each of the first five years if payment before the participant's RRD, then 3.333% for each year to age 55.</p> <p>For employees of CEM, CBM, and CCP, the greater of the monthly pension benefit (if applicable) reduced for early retirement, or the cash balance account. Participant may elect to receive cash balance account as a lump sum or as an equivalent monthly cash balance annuity.</p>

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Late retirement	Monthly pension benefit determined as of actual retirement date. For employees of CEM, CBM, and CCP, the greater of the monthly pension benefit (if applicable) or the cash balance account. Termination with deferred vested benefit	Monthly pension benefit determined as of termination date, reduced 6.667% for each of the first five years of payment before the participant's RRD, then 3.333% for each year to age 55. Death with preretirement spouse benefit	Monthly preretirement spouse benefit is payable. Other Plan Provisions

Forms of payment

Preretirement spouse benefits are payable only as described above. Monthly pension benefits are paid as described above, if the participant has no spouse as of the late payments begin, or if the participant so elects. Otherwise, benefits are paid in the form of the 50% joint and survivor annuity option or, if the participant elects and the spouse consents, another actuarially equivalent optional form offered by the plan. Optional forms are a 100% joint and survivor annuity, a 75% joint and survivor annuity, a ten-year certain and life annuity, or (for married participants) a life annuity. Participants may elect a reduced pension in any of the available forms to provide an additional \$1,000 death benefit. Participants who retire after early retirement age may elect a reduced pension in any available option and a \$10,000 lump sum payment.

Cash balance account benefits that are paid as annuities are paid in the form of the 50% joint and survivor annuity option or, if the participant elects and the spouse consents, another actuarially equivalent optional form offered by the plan.

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For purposes of determining optional forms of payment, actuarial equivalents shall be based on the 1971 Group Annuity Mortality Table, male rates, with ages set back one year for participants and five years for joint or contingent annuitants, and interest at 8%.

Maximum on benefits and pay

All benefits and pay for any calendar year may not exceed the maximum limitations for that year as defined in the Internal Revenue Code. The plan provides for increasing the dollar limits automatically as such changes become effective.

Future Plan Changes

WTW is not aware of any future plan changes that are required to be reflected.
