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## **INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT**

To the Plan Administrator, Participants and Beneficiaries  
of the Premier Health Consultants, LLC Retirement Savings Plan

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Premier Health Consultants, LLC Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

## **NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Premier Health Consultants, LLC Retirement Savings Plan (formerly known as the Convenient Care, LLC Retirement Savings Plan) (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

### **[1] General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Premier Health Consultants, LLC, Freedom Urgent Care, Indiana Urgent Care Physician Group, LLC, and the Premier Health Clinical Group (collectively, the Company or the Employer).

Under the provisions of the Plan, employees who have attained 21 years of age are eligible to participate in the Plan. Once eligible, employees are immediately able to enter the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

### **[2] Contributions**

Employees electing to participate in the Plan may contribute up to 100% of their compensation to the Plan, not to exceed the maximum amount allowable under the Internal Revenue Code. Employees who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The Plan provides for a safe harbor matching contribution of 4% of eligible compensation. The Company may also provide discretionary contributions for eligible employees that have completed one year of service. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no discretionary contributions made by the Company. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

### **[3] Investments**

Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan, and they may change their investment options daily. The Plan also allows for self-directed brokerage accounts upon the approval of the plan administrator.

### **[4] Participant accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Company's contributions as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary contribution and Plan earnings (losses). Participants are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are charged to the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**[5] Notes receivable from participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years, but may be extended if the loan is used to purchase the primary residence of the participant. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**[6] Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and safe harbor Employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is as follows:

5 years	100%

**[7] Payment of benefits**

On termination of service due to reasons other than death, a participant will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. On termination of service due to death, the distribution will be made pursuant to the election of the participant or designated beneficiary. Partial or installment distributions may be permitted to satisfy minimum distribution rules.

**[8] Forfeitures**

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in the forfeited nonvested account totaled \$5,221 and \$24,345, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Employer contributions and reduce fees paid by the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of approximately \$20,077 were used to reduce employer contributions.

## **NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

### **[1] Basis of accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

### **[2] Use of estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### **[3] Investment valuation and income recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### **[4] Notes receivable from participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment in accordance with the terms of the Plan document.

### **[5] Excess contributions payable**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

### **[6] Payment of benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**[7] Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses while expenses for items such as recordkeeping and investment advisory services are allocated to participants. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to the valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America are described as follows:

- Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 - inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement which is determined using model-based techniques such as option pricing models, discounted cash flow models, and similar techniques.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

**NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)**

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Mutual funds (including all self-directed brokerage accounts) / money market account:* valued at the daily closing price as reported by the mutual fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan administrator believes the valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE D - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY**

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with the Nationwide Life Insurance Company which maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate, which is based on a formula established by the contract issuer, is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting (1.91% and 2.27% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively). The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### **NOTE D - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY (CONTINUED)**

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Nationwide Life Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; or (5) premature termination of the contract. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at the contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events could allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

### **NOTE E - INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan sponsored by CCH Incorporated, dba FT Williams. On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated in an advisory letter that the Volume Submitter adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

### **NOTE E - INCOME TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)**

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability nor disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### **NOTE F - PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their portion of the Employer contributions. See Note K.

### **NOTE G - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan's investments are managed by the Nationwide Trust Company (Nationwide). One of the assets of the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract issued by the Nationwide Life Insurance Company, an affiliate of Nationwide, a third-party administrator for the Plan. The Nationwide Trust Company and the Nationwide Life Insurance Company are qualified institutions as defined by ERISA for the Plan and, therefore transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA. The Plan paid administrative fees totaling \$21,192 to the Nationwide Trust Company and its affiliates during the year ended December 31, 2024, and these fees are included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The Plan pays accounting / recordkeeping and investment advisory fees which also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The fees paid by the Plan to these service providers during the year ended December 31, 2024, totaled \$111,979.

### **NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks as well as risks related to the financial strength of the insurance company. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2024, may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

### **NOTE I - INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONS**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Nationwide Trust Company and the Nationwide Life Insurance Company, qualified institutions as defined by ERISA, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

### **NOTE J - MUTUAL FUND FEES**

Certain investments in mutual funds are subject to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. 12b-1 fees are ongoing fees allowable under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940. These annual fees are used to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity, and thus not separately identifiable as an expense.

### **NOTE K - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Subsequent to year end, management has noted their intention to terminate the Plan with an anticipated effective date of December 31, 2025. The participants of the Plan will either be merged into a new plan or offered distributions of their participant balance on the effective date. Management has evaluated events through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, October 13, 2025, and determined that no other matters required additional disclosure in the financial statements. No events occurring after this date have been evaluated for inclusion in these financial statements.
