NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of T. LaRiviere Equipment & Excavating, Inc. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering qualified employees of LaRiviere, Inc., (Company/Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan at the date of hire for employee deferrals. Non-resident alien employees are excluded from the Plan. Employees are eligible for discretionary matching contributions if they obtain 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and are employed at the end of the calendar year. Employees are eligible for discretionary profit-sharing contributions at the date of hire. Employees who work on prevailing wage jobs are eligible for prevailing wage contributions. Employees may enter the Plan immediately after they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Company may make discretionary matching, discretionary profit-sharing and prevailing wage contributions, to be determined by the Plan Trustee. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made discretionary profit-sharing contributions of \$67,635 and prevailing wage contributions of \$729,815.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company prevailing wage contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct deferrals and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and prevailing wage contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions is based on years of credited service as set forth in the following table:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined annually, is set at 1% above the prime rate listed in the Wall Street Journal. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the note were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the loan terms can range up to 15 years. A participant may have no more than one outstanding note at any one time.

Benefit Payments

Participants may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination of service, death or disability. A terminated employee with a balance of less than \$5,000 may be automatically paid out by the Plan upon termination. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of normal retirement age 65 or hardship as defined in the Plan document.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$19,753 and \$8,632, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and/or offset plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no offsets were utilized from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Liabilities

Other liabilities at year-end are comprised of various excess contribution and reconciliation balances.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's administrator and management determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income Recognition

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year. The classification of investment earnings reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500. Net appreciation includes interest, dividends, and gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. The components of investment earning are not separate out as required by GAAP because the custodian does not provide the separate information.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net asset available for benefits. In addition, certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, and 2023.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the prior year's financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on previously reported changes in net assets available for benefits or changes in net assets available for benefits. The reclassifications were made to improve consistency and comparability between years.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Investment Types: The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used December 31, 2024:

Mutual Funds – Mutual Funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. The mutual funds are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – INVESTMENT RISK

Investment securities are exposed to various risks that can affect the value of the Plan's investments such as interest rate risk, custodial credit risk, and concentration of credit risk. The Plan invests in registered investment companies (Mutual Funds). Mutual fund holdings in equity securities respond to such factors as economic conditions, individual company earnings performance, and market liquidity, while holdings in debt securities are particularly sensitive to credit risk and change in interest rates.

Interest rate risk

Interest rate risk arises from the likelihood that interest rates will rise or fall during the holding period of a fixed-rate security and adversely affect the selling price of the security prior to maturity. NOTE 6 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.

NOTE 8 - PLAN TAX STATUS

The T. LaRiviere Equipment & Excavating, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan is a non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan with CODA. The Internal Revenue Service has issued an opinion letter to the prototype sponsor dated March 31, 2014, stating the prototype plan is acceptable under section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has not requested a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service. T. LaRiviere Equipment & Excavating, Inc. Retirement Plan has adopted only standardized provisions of the prototype plan.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. In general, the Plan's returns are subject to examination by federal tax authorities for a period of three years beginning with the later of the due date of the return or the date they are filed. There are currently no examinations in progress.

NOTE 9 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments consist of investments managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company, the custodian, as defined by the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in interest transactions under ERISA.

The custodian provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a service agreement between the Plan and the custodian. The custodian receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services provided to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to the custodian for its administrative services to the Plan.
