We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. ## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about KIA of LaGrange 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of KIA of LaGrange 401(k) Plan (“Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

*General.* The Plan is a single-employer defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Plant City Automotive, Inc., Tiger City Automotive Investment, Inc., Tallassee Automotive, Inc., Liechty Key West Investments, Inc. and JS Liechty Charters, LLC (collectively the “Company”) regardless of age or services. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

*Contributions.* Participants may contribute to the Plan the maximum percentage allowable by the Internal Revenue Service, as defined by the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified retirement plans. Eligible participants that reach the age of 50 before the close of the Plan year shall be eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations of Section 414(v) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Company may contribute a discretionary dollar amount, the percentage or dollar amount to be determined by the Company on a uniform basis for all participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Through 2024, no discretionary Company contributions have been contributed.

*Participant Accounts.* Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution along with the allocation of (a) the Company’s contributions, if applicable (b) Plan earnings, and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. In addition, some types of expenses may be charged only to some participants based upon their use of a Plan feature or receipt of a Plan distribution. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. The accounts are participant-directed.

*Investments.* Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers pooled separate accounts and a stable value fund as investment options for participants.

*Vesting.* Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service for any Company discretionary contributions.

*Notes Receivable from participants* – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant notes fund. Loan terms may not exceed five years unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence. The Administrator may permit a longer repayment term. The loans are secured by the vested interest in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate equal to one percent above the prime rate. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

*Payments of Benefits.* On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum payment. Participants may also rollover all or part of their account to an eligible retirement plan. At age 70 ½, 72 or 73 (depending on when a participant was born) and separated from service, a portion of the balance will be required to be distributed each year.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

*Basis of Accounting.* The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting generally accepted in the United States of America.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition.* Investments in pooled separate accounts are valued based on the net asset value of the underlying mutual funds or securities. Investment in stable value funds are measured at contract value, which equals the value of deposits made to the contract plus earnings at guaranteed crediting rates, less withdrawals and fees.

The plan presents, in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, the net appreciation/(depreciation) in the fair value of its investments, which consists of the realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation/(depreciation) on those investments.

Interest income is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis.

*Payment of Benefits.* Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

*Use of Estimates.* The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Notes Receivable from Participants.* Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan agreement.

*Excess Contributions Payable.* Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as accounts payable, with a corresponding reduction to participant contributions.

*Administrative Expenses.* The Plan has entered into a trust agreement with Transamerica Retirement Services to act as the Trustee and record-keeper of the Plan and Pension Financial Services to act as the third-party administrator. All expenses, charges, or fees incurred by the Trustee, recordkeeper, and third-party administrator in the administration of the Plan shall be deducted from the Plan in accordance with procedures established by the Trustee unless paid by the Plan Sponsor.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is defined as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability in the principal market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. U.S. GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. U.S. GAAP prescribes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1     Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices of identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include: (a) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (b) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (c) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and (d) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Refer to Note B for the valuation methods used to fair value Plan assets.

The mutual funds held in pooled separate accounts are reported at their NAV. The NAV reported by the underlying fund approximates the fair value of the investment and these investments are redeemable with the fund at NAV. Plan participant transactions of investments or withdrawals may occur on a daily basis and there are no redemption restrictions on these funds. There are no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024.

NOTE D – INVESTMENTS REPORTED AT CONTRACT VALUE

The Plan has a Stable Value Fund that is a fully benefit-responsive investment and is a non-tradable obligation of Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company. The investment's contract or proceeds cannot nor will not be assigned or sold to another party without the consent of Transamerica.

NOTE D – INVESTMENTS REPORTED AT CONTRACT VALUE (continued)

The repayment of principal and interest credited to participants holding this investment is a financial obligation of Transamerica. However, if an event should ever occur such that realization of full contract value for a particular investment contract is no longer probable – for example, a significant decline in creditworthiness of Transamerica, the Stable Value Option investment choice may no longer be considered fully benefit-responsive.

The terms of Transamerica’s Group Annuity Contract require all permitted participant-initiated transactions involving the investment to occur at contract value with no conditions, limits, or restrictions.

Permitted participant-initiated transactions are those allowed by the underlying defined contribution plan such as withdrawals for benefits, loans or transfers to other investment choices within the Plan.

Since the Stable Value Option investment choice is an obligation of Transamerica, the occurrence of an event that limits the ability of the investment to transact at contract value between Transamerica and a participant holding the investment is not probable.

The Stable Value Option investment choice allows a participant reasonable access to their assets. The redemption frequency is daily. There are no unfunded commitments.

Prior to January 1 and July 1, the effective annual rate of interest is established for the corresponding six-month period. Interest is credited, based upon the daily balance, at a rate that is the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. The average yield earned was 1.58% for 2024.

NOTE E – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan and any person who provides services to the Plan. Certain plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and a stable value option fund managed by Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company Inc. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

NOTE F – INFORMATION CERTIFIED

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Transamerica Life Insurance Company has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate.

NOTE G – INCOME TAX STATUS

The underlying prototype volume submitter profit sharing plan with CODA obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the written form of the underlying prototype document is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, and that any employer adopting this form of a prototype plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan evaluates all significant tax positions as required by generally accepted accounting principles in the United States. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan does not believe that it has taken any tax positions that would require the recording of any additional tax liability nor does it believe that there are any unrealized tax benefits that would either increase or decrease within the next twelve months. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the appropriate regulatory authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE H – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE I – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE J – PLAN AMENDMENT

The Plan was amended effective February 1, 2023 to expand the number of participating employers.

NOTE K – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
