Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule(s) Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Part IV, line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment

1. **Description of the Plan**

The following is a brief description of the Leviton Manufacturing Co., Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”), which is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan document, related adoption agreement and individual statements provided to each Plan participant should be referred to for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a qualified defined contribution plan covering eligible employees who are members of a controlled group which includes Leviton Manufacturing Co., Inc. and certain affiliates (the “Company”). The Plan provides deferred compensation benefits and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Bank of America, N.A. is the trustee and custodian of the Plan (the “Trustee”). The Trustee is a qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner, & Smith, Inc. (“Merrill Lynch”), an affiliate of the Trustee, is the record-keeper of the Plan. The Plan administrator is responsible for overseeing and ensuring compliance with the Plan document. The Plan’s trustee, custodian, record-keeper, and administrator are appointed by the Company.

During 2024, there were transfers in amounting to \$185,779 and transfers out amounting to \$7,474 between the Retirement Savings Plan of Leviton Affiliated Employers (“Affiliated Plan”) and the Plan. These transfers were in conjunction with highly compensated participant accounts being transferred into the Plan’s Trust while non-highly compensated participant accounts were being transferred out of the Plan’s Trust.

During 2024, there were transfers in amounting to \$5,597,497 between Leviton Employees Defined Benefit Pension Plan (“Defined Benefit Plan”) and the Plan. These transfers were in conjunction with the Defined Benefit Plan terminating and liquidating all of their assets. The surplus in the Defined Benefit Plan after liquidating their assets to be utilized to fund profit-sharing contributions of the Plan.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all eligible employees as of the first day of the month following the date of hire. Eligibility for all purposes of the Plan has no age limit requirement. The Plan excludes those employees who are: employed in the capacity or designated as an intern or temporary employee, leased employees, collectively bargained and for the affiliates of the Company, its Non-Highly Compensated Employees and Key Employees, as defined.

1. Description of the Plan

Participant Contributions

The employees may make rollover contributions and voluntary contributions, to be placed into a trust fund for their benefit. Each participant may elect to defer, on a pre-tax or post-tax basis, up to 60% of his or her eligible compensation, as defined, up to the maximum contributions allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) as discussed below. Participants who do not affirmatively elect to have a specified amount contributed automatically have 4% of their eligible compensation, as defined, deferred, automatically escalating by 1% per year, up to a maximum of 10% unless they opt-out of the Plan or elect a different deferral percentage. If a participant does not make an election as to how the Plan should invest their directed account, then the directed account will be invested in accordance with the default investment alternatives established under the Plan.

For 2024, the maximum amount of compensation that may be considered for deferral purposes by participants and employer contributions is \$345,000. For 2024, total participant contributions are limited to a maximum of \$23,000. Additionally for 2024, individuals who are at least 50 years of age can make a “catch-up” contribution not to exceed \$7,500. The maximum annual addition for 2024 that may be contributed or allocated to a participant’s account under the Plan shall not exceed the lesser of 100% of a participant’s compensation or \$69,000 for employees under age 50 and \$76,500 for employees over the age of 50.

Eligible compensation in relation to contributions means wages, tips and other compensation on Form W-2. Compensation is also adjusted to exclude reimbursements or other expense allowances, fringe benefits (cash or non-cash), moving expenses, deferred compensation (other than deferrals specified as being included in compensation) and welfare benefits.

Employer Matching Contributions

The Company provides for matching contributions of elective deferrals after the participant has completed one year of service. This matching contribution vests 100% to a participant immediately. Highly compensated employees from the employer Leviton NS Data Center, Inc. received a matching contribution in an amount equal to 25% of the first 5% of compensation for a maximum of 1.25% of total compensation. Highly compensated employees from the employers Intense Lighting, LLC and Conservation Technology received a matching contribution of 50% of the first 3% of compensation and 25% of the next 3% of compensation for a maximum of 2.25% of total compensation. All other employees of the Company received a matching contribution in an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% of compensation and 50% of the next 2% of compensation for a maximum of 4% of total compensation. All matching contributions are limited to the maximum covered compensation level mentioned previously.

1. Description of the Plan

Employer Profit Sharing Contributions

The Company provides at its sole discretion a profit sharing contribution. The profit sharing contribution, if any, will be allocated based on a point system, in which points are allocated based on an eligible employee's years of service with the Company and level of compensation. To share in the profit sharing contribution, an eligible employee must have completed one year of service, be employed for the entire Plan year and was not eligible to receive a distribution from the Company's Long-Term Incentive Plan, as defined. Certain subsidiaries of the Company are not eligible for the profit sharing contribution. The profit sharing contribution, if any, is 100% vested immediately. The Company elected to make a profit-sharing contribution of \$3,957,819 for 2024 which was recorded as Employer contribution receivable in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024.

Rollover Contributions

A Plan participant may make a transfer to the Plan of benefit from a qualified retirement plan of another employer, referred to as a rollover even if they are not a Plan participant.

Investments

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary and rollover contributions, Company matching and profit-sharing contributions and Plan earnings thereon.

Participant Accounts

The Plan's record-keeper establishes and maintains a separate account for each participant, which is credited for rollover and voluntary contributions the participants make, Company matching and profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Income earned and net appreciation or depreciation on Plan investments, for a given investment, are allocated in proportion to the participant's account balances in that investment. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Each participant may borrow up to the lesser of 50% of the participant's vested interest in the account or \$50,000. The notes are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account. No note shall be less than \$1,000 and only one note at a time is allowed. The notes shall bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan administrator. The interest rate on notes outstanding at December 31, 2024, ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% per annum.

1. Description of the Plan

Notes Receivable from Participants

An outstanding note is repayable, with interest, in full at any time or in monthly installments by means of a payroll deduction from the participant's salary over a term not to exceed five years. However, if the note is for the purchase of a principal residence, the Plan administrator may permit a longer repayment term not to exceed 20 years. A note becomes immediately due and payable upon a participant's termination of employment, death, or disability.

ERISA Budget Account

The Trustee, through its revenue sharing arrangements ("Shared Revenue") with investment companies, shares a portion of the Shared Revenue with retirement plans which it services. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan earned \$224,808 of Shared Revenue from the Trustee. Such revenues have been recorded within Interest and other income on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. The Shared Revenue can be used to either reduce Plan expenses or be reallocated to participant accounts. During 2024, Shared Revenue in the amount of \$205,492 was reallocated to participant accounts. At December 31, 2024, and 2023 the remaining portion of Shared Revenue received by the Plan but not yet reallocated to participant accounts was \$7,047 and \$5,583, respectively, and is included in the Investments, at fair value balance on the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. At December 31, 2024, and 2023 the amount of Shared Revenue earned from the Trustee, but not yet received by the Plan, amounted to \$36,964 and \$17,647 respectively.

Retirement

The normal retirement age is defined as when the participant reaches the age of 65. At the normal retirement date, the participant is entitled to 100% of their account balance. The participant can elect late retirement after the age of 65. A participant who becomes disabled, as defined in the Plan document, is eligible for a disability retirement. There are no early retirement provisions.

Distribution of Benefits

An active participant, or a designated beneficiary, is entitled to withdraw the entire vested amount (or in some cases, a portion thereof) in the event of normal retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, termination of the Plan, attainment of age 59 ½, or under hardship circumstances, as defined in the Plan document. Participants may elect to receive distributions in the form of a lump sum, installment payments, or partial payments of at least \$1,000 and not to exceed more than twelve separate partial payments in a Plan year.

Terminated employees whose vested balance exceeds \$5,000 at termination may elect to leave their account balances in the Plan. Participants must begin receiving Required Minimum Distributions, under IRS guidelines, upon reaching the age of 73. Terminated employees whose vested balances are under \$5,000 will be subject to an involuntary distribution.

1. **Description of the Plan**

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid out of the Plan or by the Company. Administrative expenses that are to be paid from the Plan are paid from the Plan's trust funds and allocated to all participants on a pro rata basis. The Company incurred certain administrative expenses relating to the Plan without charge to the Plan during 2024.

2. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Interest and dividend income are recorded when earned. The Plan presents, in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, the net appreciation (depreciation) of the fair value of its investments, which includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income from notes receivable is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the Plan documents. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants or beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks including but not limited to, interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Income Tax Status

The Plan is an adoption of a pre-approved plan that received an IRS opinion letter on June 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved plan, as then designed, was then in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. An employer adopting this pre-approved plan is considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualified status. The Plan administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the Plan is tax-exempt. No provision for income taxes has been included in the financial statements since the Plan has no unrelated business income tax.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or the DOL. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and had concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS and the DOL, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

3. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

4. Investments

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan's investments appreciated (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) in value by \$35,698,260.

5. Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2: Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities; quoted prices for identically similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active and models for which all significant inputs are observable either directly or indirectly.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024, and 2023:

Interest-bearing cash and mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Interest-bearing cash and mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

5. Fair Value Measurements

Common collective trusts: Valued at the NAV of the units of the respective trust company's common collective trusts. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan were to initiate a full redemption of the common collective trusts, the Trustee reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
