NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the New Healthworks, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of New Healthworks, Inc. (The "Company") who have two months of service and are age 21 or older. Employees are enrolled in the Plan on the first day of the month following when eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each participant may make pre-tax or after-tax contributions of eligible compensation up to the annual maximum amount allowable by the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees, hired after May 31, 2019, are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to participants based on eligible compensation. During 2024, the Company made discretionary matching contributions based 50% of 2% of employee deferral with additional and 25% match on the next 4%. Additionally, the Company may also make qualified nonelective contributions. No nonelective contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary matching and nonelective contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately and fully vested in their salary deferral contributions and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary and nonelective portion of each participant's account is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service. Participants who terminated prior to November 15, 2023, are subject to a five-year vesting schedule.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN - CONTINUED

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set 2% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For payments of benefits for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or through a partial amount (payments of a portion of a participant's account that are not regularly scheduled). In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$583 and \$11,781, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions or offset Plan expenses. Also, in 2024, plan expenses were reduced by \$24,170 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Discretionary contributions are recorded in the year services are rendered.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of benefit payments and notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 4 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Lincoln National Life Insurance Company ("Lincoln") totaling \$4,002 and \$11,781 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Lincoln maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Lincoln, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

NOTE 4 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT - CONTINUED

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 5 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc, Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc is the custodian for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Other transactions, which may be considered related-party or party-in-interest transactions, relate to normal plan management and administrative services, and the related payment of fees.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer discretionary contributions.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing plan with CODA sponsored by M2B Retirement Consulting LLC. The non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated July 13, 2021, as to the non-standardized profit sharing plan's qualified status. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, related to investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Lincoln Financial Group Trust Company, Inc. (the custodian of the Plan).

NOTE 10 - DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

The Company did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan totaling \$506 during 2024 on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor. The delinquent participant contributions result in a prohibited transaction totaling \$506, which is separately reported on Schedule H, Line 4a - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions. The Company computed lost earnings on these 2024 deferrals and subsequently remitted the deferrals and has made a contribution for lost earnings to the Plan in 2025.

NOTE 11 - OPERATIONAL DEFECT

During the year ended December 31, 2024, it was discovered that certain of the Plan's provisions were not properly applied in the daily operation of the Plan. The calculation of employer contributions as per the plan agreement were not properly applied when calculating contributions for select participants. The plan administrator determined the affected participants and deposited \$1,324 into the Plan during 2025, to make the affected participants and the Plan whole, plus lost earnings. This amount was recorded as employer contributions receivable on the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024.
