Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Rich's 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Rich's 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Rich's 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules listed in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

RICH'S 401(k) PLAN

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION

Rich's 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") was established on January 1, 1985, and most recently restated effective January 1, 2024. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering most salaried, clerical and non-union production associates of Rich Products Corporation (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor"), certain of its subsidiaries, and an affiliated company. Eligible employees may make pre-tax deferrals and Roth contributions and receive the Company match upon completing 30 days of credited service, and eligible employees may receive the Company contribution upon completing one year of credited service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Effective March 27, 2020 (the "Effective Date"), the Plan adopted certain provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") which provided economic relief to plan sponsors and participants of employee benefit plans. The Plan has not been formally amended for the adoption of these provisions, however, under the CARES Act, the Plan must be formally amended by December 31, 2026.

Participant and Company contributions are credited to each participant's accounts as follows:

- Designated Roth Contribution Account – The Plan permits voluntary Roth after-tax contributions of no less than 1% and no more than 40% of their annual gross wages to a Designated Roth Account up to the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").
- Salary Reduction Contribution Account – Participants can elect to contribute voluntary pretax contributions of no less than 1% and no more than 40% of their annual gross wages to this account up to the maximum allowed under the IRC.
- Company Matching Account – The Plan is a safe harbor 401(k) Plan. As a result, the Plan Sponsor will match 100% of participant contributions up to 1% of pay, and 50% of any additional contributions, up to a maximum match of 3.5% of eligible compensation.
- Company Contribution Account – The Plan Sponsor, subject to Board of Director approval, will contribute between 0.5% and 2.5% of each participant's compensation based upon years of credited vesting service. Not all participants are eligible to receive Company contributions. These Company contributions amounted to approximately \$7,084,000 and \$6,069,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

All contributions are invested in the various investment options based on a participant's elections.

Plan earnings are allocated based on participant account balances. Eligible benefits are those benefits which can be provided from the participants' accounts.

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their Salary Reduction Contribution Account, Designated Roth Contribution Account, and Company Matching Account, and after two years of service, 100% of their Company Contribution Account. Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account balance and may make one or more affirmative elections at any time to have any portion of the Participant's Accounts distributed in the form of a lump sum, partial payment, or installments, provided that no partial payment or lump sum amount is less than \$100.

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION (continued)

Employer matching contributions forfeited by terminated employees are used at the direction of the Plan Sponsor to reduce employer contributions, and to the extent not so utilized, they may be used by the Plan administrator to pay administrative expenses. Forfeitures applied against employer contributions amounted to approximately \$86,000 and \$656,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were approximately \$335,000 and \$3,000 forfeitures available as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan also has a provision allowing participants to borrow funds from the Plan. Minimum borrowings are \$1,000 with a maximum limited to 50% of the vested account balance not to exceed \$50,000. The term of the note may not exceed five years, unless used to acquire a dwelling unit, in which case the maximum is twenty years for new borrowings prior to June 1, 2017. Effective June 1, 2017, the term for new borrowings may not exceed 10 years when used to acquire a dwelling unit. The notes are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%, with maturity dates through November 2036. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions.

The Plan allows for in-service withdrawals for employees who attain the age of 59 ½.

The reasonable costs, expenses, taxes and liabilities incurred in connection with the administration of the Plan or in connection with any litigation involving the Plan shall be paid from the assets of the Plan, unless paid by the Company.

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

On December 21, 2022, the Christie Cookie 401(k) Savings Plan was merged into the Plan. A portion of the assets of the Christie Cookie 401(k) Savings Plan, which totaled approximately \$1,358,000, were transferred to the Plan in 2022. Approximately \$107,000 and \$24,000 were left to be transferred to the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Information about the Plan agreement and the vesting and benefit provisions is contained in the summary plan description. Copies of the pamphlet are available from the plan administrator.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan utilizes a hierarchy system as prescribed by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America to determine the fair value of assets and liabilities which are subject to reporting at fair value. Level 1 inputs are generally quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities which are actively traded on an exchange. Level 2 inputs generally consist of market prices for identical assets which are not actively traded or market prices of similar assets or liabilities which are actively traded on an exchange. Level 3 inputs are referred to as unobservable inputs and consist primarily of information derived by management where Level 1 and Level 2 inputs are not available. These may include such things as present value of expected future cash flows or other valuation methodologies. Under the hierarchy, Level 1 inputs are the most preferred followed by Level 2 and Level 3. Level 3 inputs are to be used when neither Level 1 nor Level 2 inputs are available.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

An investment's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Registered investment companies: Valued based on quoted market prices available on an active market, which represent the net asset values (NAV) of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

Common collective trusts: The trusts primarily hold guaranteed and other similar investment contracts, that are fully benefit-responsive. The fair value of the trusts are based on the net asset values (NAV contract value) of the shares held by the Plan at year end, and generally have no redemption restrictions or unfunded capital commitments.

Stable Value Fund: The fund primarily holds guaranteed and other similar investment contracts, which are fully-benefit responsive. This investment has been valued based on net asset values of the underlying investments in the fund. The fund has been measured at fair value using the NAV practical expedient.

Cash management funds: Valued based on the quoted market price available on an active market, which represents net asset value (NAV) of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

The Plan presents in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation in the fair value of its investments, which consists of realized gains (losses) and unrealized gains (losses) on those investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest is accrued as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Contributions Receivable and Allowance for Estimated Credit Losses – Contributions receivable consist of amounts due from the Plan sponsor. The Plan maintains an allowance for estimated credit losses to account for the total expected credit losses on receivables from the date of origination. Management estimates the expected credit losses based on the receivables' historical experience, the current state of the Plan sponsor's business and financial health, and other reasonable and supportable forecasts. Based on this assessment, no allowance for estimated credit losses was considered necessary as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. All contributions receivable were collected subsequent to the respective year-end. If conditions were to deteriorate, management would increase the allowance accordingly.

Revenue Sharing Agreement – Certain investment funds in the Plan provide for revenue-sharing whereby the investment managers return a portion of their investment fees to offset Plan expenses. The Plan has an agreement with the Plan's recordkeeper for the revenue-sharing proceeds to be credited to the participants who invested in the funds that generate those proceeds, thereby reducing the expenses those participants incur with respect to those funds. The Plan held no undistributed revenue-sharing credits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits – Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events – Management has evaluated the effects of all subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, to determine if events or transactions occurring through that date require potential adjustment or disclosure in the financial statements.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan uses fair value measurements to record fair value adjustments to certain assets and to determine fair value disclosures (as discussed in Note 2). The following table presents the balances of the assets of the Plan measured at fair value on a recurring basis at December 31, 2024 and 2023, with the exception of the common collective trusts and stable value fund, which are measured at fair value using the NAV practical expedient. The fair value of the common collective trusts and stable value fund are provided below to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits:

4. TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES IN INTEREST

Certain Plan investments were managed by The Vanguard Group. As Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (“Vanguard”), the trustee of the Plan for the period from January 1, 2024 through March 28, 2024, is a member of The Vanguard Group, transactions during this period qualify as party in interest transactions. Certain legal and accounting services were provided at the expense of the Plan Sponsor. Fees paid during the year for other services rendered by parties in interest were based on customary and reasonable rates for such services.

5. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated April 19, 2017, that the Plan is designed in accordance with Section 401(a) of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust net investment income is tax exempt.

6. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan, included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule. The information was prepared by Vanguard and Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower"), the Plan's trustees, and furnished to the Plan administrator. Empower and Vanguard have certified that certain investment information is complete and accurate as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Vanguard has certified that certain investment information is complete and accurate for the period from January 1, 2024 through March 28, 2024, and for the year ending December 31, 2023. Empower has certified that certain investment information is complete and accurate for the period from March 29, 2024 through December 31, 2024.
