- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of US GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with US GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets held at year-end and schedule of delinquent participant contributions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Epic Staffing Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan and formerly Emerald Health Services 401(k) Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Epic Staffing Group, Inc. (the Company) who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service and are age 21 or older. As of July 1, 2019, the Plan was amended to remove the age and service requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA). The plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan and works with a third-party investment advisory group to determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings. The plan administrator monitors investment performance and reports to the Company's management.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of each participants elective deferrals in excess of 3% but not in excess of 5% of eligible compensation. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions (including rollovers) and Company matching contributions, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Prior matching accounts that transferred to this plan due to the merger could be subject to a 5-year or 6-year vesting schedule. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more detail.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The balance in the participant's account secures the loans. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined by the Plan. Notes receivable from participants for purposes other than to acquire a principal residence are not to exceed a term of five years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 1. Description of Plan

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or a direct rollover to an Individual Retirement Account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Hardship Withdrawals

Distributions may be made in the event of a hardship, as defined by the Plan document. These distributions are taxable and may be subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the distribution amount. A hardship withdrawal is limited to the participant's vested account balance.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$260,009 and \$218,595, respectively. These accounts are used to pay future administrative expenses or reduce future employer contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies, utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net change of the fair value of investments.

Note 3. Certification

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the following information included in the accompanying financial statements, notes, and supplemental schedules was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan. The Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to this information.

- Investments at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net change in fair value of investments
- Dividend and interest income
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs are based on observable inputs corroborated by market data but not quoted on active markets.

Level 3 inputs are based on unobservable inputs and include situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the assets or liabilities and have the lowest priority.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a common/collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodians, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Pursuant to Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2015-07, *Fair Value Measurements*, the common/collective trust measured at NAV have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Related Party and Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Trust Company, LLC is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions and related earnings thereon.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan from of a plan sponsored by Great-West Trust Company, LLC. The non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan practitioner has received an opinion letter from the IRS as to the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan's qualified status. The volume submitter plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, no uncertain positions have been taken or are expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan is no longer subject to Internal Revenue Service examinations for the years prior to 2021.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Non-exempt Transactions

During the year ended December 31, 2024, participant contributions totaling \$213,584 were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time period by the Company. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company has taken the appropriate steps to correct the situation by reimbursing employees for lost earnings and interest, and has further implemented a procedure to ensure that all future remittances are made within the prescribed time period.
