Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Inc. Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Inc. Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Inc. Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Note 1. Description of Plan - The following description of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Inc. Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Inc. (the Orchestra), who meet certain eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Retirement Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan and along with determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors the investment performance.

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Sponsor may also decide to make a nonelective contribution to the Plan, which will be allocated to all employees eligible to participate in the Plan, based on the proportion of eligible earnings. Core musicians (as defined by the plan document and under the musician agreements), fulltime administrative staff, and part-time administrative staff are eligible to receive non-elective contributions after meeting service requirements. The non-elective contributions for staff are discretionary. The non-elective contribution rate is 3.5% for core musicians for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Rochester Philharmonic "B" Contract players are eligible to receive matching contributions after meeting service requirements. Each "B" Contract player can receive a match at the rate of 50% of the Contract Player's individual contribution percentage after five or more years of service, not to exceed 4% of wages earned by that individual in a contract year. The match also cannot exceed 1.4% of the core musician's (as defined) minimum annual salary for the season. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Plan Sponsor's contribution, as well as Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Rochester Philharmonic "B" Contract players are immediately vested in employer matching contributions. Core musicians, full-time administrative staff, and part-time administrative staff are 100% vested in the non-elective contributions after three years of service.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, if the value of the participant's account does not exceed \$1,000, the vested account balance will be paid to the participant in a lump sum. If the value of the employee's vested account balance exceeds \$1,000, but does not exceed \$5,000, the vested balance shall be paid as a lump sum or as a direct rollover into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. If the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant must consent to any distribution from such account balance.

Forfeited Accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$855 and \$7,970, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or Plan expenses. Also, in 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$- from forfeited nonvested accounts and \$7,350 of Plan expenses were paid by from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Orchestra. Expenses that are paid by the Orchestra are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through the date of the report, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee

Certain information in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity and Empower Trust Company, LLC, both are qualified institutions.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower and Fidelity. Empower is the main recordkeeper of the Plan's assets. Fidelity provides recordkeeping for some individual custodial accounts. Fidelity is a custodian of the Plan's assets. Empower Trust Company, LLC is the custodian and trustee, as defined by the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for recordkeeping and contract administrator fees amounted to \$19,288 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Fees paid by the Plan for investment advisory and management fees amounted to \$17,528 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Effective January 2016, Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower") provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a Master Plan Services Agreement (MSA) between the Company and Empower. Empower receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Empower provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Empower for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by Empower from such mutual fund service provides exceeds the amount owed under the MSA, Empower remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a monthly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2024 the excess funds amounted to \$-. The Plan or Plan Sponsor may make a payment to Empower for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Orchestra has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7. Tax Status

The Plan uses a volume submitter plan document sponsored by CCH Incorporated dba ftWilliam.com. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed CCH Incorporated dba ftWilliam.com, in a letter dated March 31, 2017, that the volume submitter document satisfied the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. The plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and is being operated under the volume submitter plan which is in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Certain employer contributions were not calculated in accordance with the plan document and were not remitted to the Plan within the time frame specified by the Department of Labor's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102, thus constituting nonexempt transactions between the Plan and the Orchestra for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan is currently reviewing the calculation in order to apply for correction.
