Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Century Therapeutics, Inc. 401(K) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Century Therapeutics, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, copies of which may be obtained from the plan sponsor.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers eligible employees of Century Therapeutics, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer") who are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Reliance Trust Company and ADP Inc. are the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively, for the Plan through May 31, 2024. As of June 1, 2024, Fidelity Management Trust Company and Fidelity Workplace Services LLC are the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively. The Century Therapeutics, Inc. Compensation Committee is responsible for the general administration of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants are entitled to make pre-tax deferral or Roth contributions from 1% to 95% of their eligible compensation, up to the annual Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") contribution limit. The Company offers a safe harbor matching contribution to the Plan for each participating employee in an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation and 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation. The Company may elect to make the profit-sharing contributions; however, no such amounts were contributed for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions and/or transfers from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. All contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Upon enrollment, a participant may direct the investment of employee and employer contributions to any of the Plan's fund options. Participants may change their investment options at any time. The Company's contributions are invested in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Participant Accounts

A separate account is maintained for each investment option of a participant by type of contribution. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's contributions and allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with the investment fund's underlying administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based upon the participant's share of net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. Allocations of administrative expenses are based on the participant's account balances, as defined in the Plan's provisions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants immediately vest in their own contributions, Company matching contributions and actual earnings or losses thereon. In addition, vesting in the Company's profit-sharing contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the last twelve months, or 50% of their vested account balance. This amount will be transferred from the participant's account and placed in a separate participant loan fund. Interest charged on participant loans is credited to the individual participant accounts. The term of the loan may not exceed five years unless it qualifies as a primary residence loan, in which case the loan may not exceed ten years. A participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any point in time, and a participant must wait at least three months following repayment in full of the prior loan before applying for a new loan. Participant loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime Rate, plus two percent. Foreclosure on defaulted participant loans does not occur until a distributable event, as defined in the Plan, occurs. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, participant loans are shown as a receivable of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on loans outstanding ranged from 6% to 10.50%.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the vested portion of a participant's account, less any loans outstanding, may be distributed in a lump sum or, in certain defined situations, in substantial equal installments or partial withdrawals with a minimum of \$500. A participant whose vested account balance is \$7,000 or less shall immediately receive the entire vested account balance. In addition, hardship withdrawals are permitted if certain criteria are met. Hardship withdrawals do not require a suspension of contributions to the Plan.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan's provisions. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan include recordkeeping and trustee fees. Expenses relating to purchases, sales, and transfers of the Plan's investments are charged to the particular investment fund to which the expenses relate. Participants pay recordkeeping fees that are deducted from their accounts quarterly. All other administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the Plan's net assets available for benefits, after Plan expenses, will be distributed to each participant according to his or her account balance.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with GAAP, requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes, and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements. Shares of registered investment companies and mutual funds are quoted at market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at the end of the year. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) of the common collective trust fund may occur daily as this fund has readily determinable fair value. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is accrued when earned. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Participants pay administrative fees upon request of a loan and throughout the duration of the repayment period.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and note receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained or derived from information provided to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company and Fidelity Management Trust Company.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

In accordance with ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, assets and liabilities measured at fair value are categorized into the following fair value hierarchy:

Level 1 Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Significant unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity).

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measure in its entirety.

NOTE 5 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate and market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan holds notes receivable from participants and certain of the Plan's assets are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, these represent exempt party-in-interest transactions. However, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the written form of the underlying pre-approved document is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code, and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator has indicated that it will take the necessary steps, if any, to bring the Plan's operations into compliance with the Code.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Company has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through October 14, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Century Therapeutics, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, copies of which may be obtained from the plan sponsor.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers eligible employees of Century Therapeutics, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer") who are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Reliance Trust Company and ADP Inc. are the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively, for the Plan through May 31, 2024. As of June 1, 2024, Fidelity Management Trust Company and Fidelity Workplace Services LLC are the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively. The Century Therapeutics, Inc. Compensation Committee is responsible for the general administration of the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants are entitled to make pre-tax deferral or Roth contributions from 1% to 95% of their eligible compensation, up to the annual Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") contribution limit. The Company offers a safe harbor matching contribution to the Plan for each participating employee in an amount equal to 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation and 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation. The Company may elect to make the profit-sharing contributions; however, no such amounts were contributed for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions and/or transfers from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. All contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Upon enrollment, a participant may direct the investment of employee and employer contributions to any of the Plan's fund options. Participants may change their investment options at any time. The Company's contributions are invested in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Participant Accounts

A separate account is maintained for each investment option of a participant by type of contribution. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's contributions and allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with the investment fund's underlying administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based upon the participant's share of net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. Allocations of administrative expenses are based on the participant's account balances, as defined in the Plan's provisions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants immediately vest in their own contributions, Company matching contributions and actual earnings or losses thereon. In addition, vesting in the Company's profit-sharing contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the last twelve months, or 50% of their vested account balance. This amount will be transferred from the participant's account and placed in a separate participant loan fund. Interest charged on participant loans is credited to the individual participant accounts. The term of the loan may not exceed five years unless it qualifies as a primary residence loan, in which case the loan may not exceed ten years. A participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any point in time, and a participant must wait at least three months following repayment in full of the prior loan before applying for a new loan. Participant loans are collateralized by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime Rate, plus two percent. Foreclosure on defaulted participant loans does not occur until a distributable event, as defined in the Plan, occurs. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, participant loans are shown as a receivable of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on loans outstanding ranged from 6% to 10.50%.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the vested portion of a participant's account, less any loans outstanding, may be distributed in a lump sum or, in certain defined situations, in substantial equal installments or partial withdrawals with a minimum of \$500. A participant whose vested account balance is \$7,000 or less shall immediately receive the entire vested account balance. In addition, hardship withdrawals are permitted if certain criteria are met. Hardship withdrawals do not require a suspension of contributions to the Plan.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan's provisions. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan include recordkeeping and trustee fees. Expenses relating to purchases, sales, and transfers of the Plan's investments are charged to the particular investment fund to which the expenses relate. Participants pay recordkeeping fees that are deducted from their accounts quarterly. All other administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the Plan's net assets available for benefits, after Plan expenses, will be distributed to each participant according to his or her account balance.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with GAAP, requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes, and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements. Shares of registered investment companies and mutual funds are quoted at market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at the end of the year. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) of the common collective trust fund may occur daily as this fund has readily determinable fair value. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is accrued when earned. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Participants pay administrative fees upon request of a loan and throughout the duration of the repayment period.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and note receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 was obtained or derived from information provided to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company and Fidelity Management Trust Company.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

In accordance with ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, assets and liabilities measured at fair value are categorized into the following fair value hierarchy:

Level 1 Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Significant unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity).

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measure in its entirety.

NOTE 5 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate and market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan holds notes receivable from participants and certain of the Plan's assets are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, these represent exempt party-in-interest transactions. However, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the written form of the underlying pre-approved document is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code, and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator has indicated that it will take the necessary steps, if any, to bring the Plan's operations into compliance with the Code.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Company has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through October 14, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.
