Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements



NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Smislova, Kehnemui Associates, P.A. Profit Sharing Trust (the Plan) of Smislova, Kehnemui & Associates, P.A. (the Company) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan established April 1, 1980, covering all employees of the Company. All employees are immediately eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan also covers employees of a related company; SK&A Structural Engineers. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Code limitations. The Plan has an automatic enrollment provision for all new participants at 2%. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

A discretionary matching contribution to the Plan may be made at the option of the Company. No matching contribution was made during the year. A discretionary nonelective contribution may also be made into the Plan for all participants who have completed one year of service, or 1,000 hours. The Company elected to make a 1.5% contribution of employee compensation to all eligible employees for the year. In addition, the Company made an additional 2 - 3% contribution to principals of the Company for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and their actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the employer matching and nonelective contributions is based on years of service. Employer contributions and earnings thereon are vested in accordance with the following schedule:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$ 1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$ 50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate as listed in *The Wall Street Journal*, plus one percent. Loan terms range from one to five years or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or may transfer the balance to an individual retirement account or another employer's tax qualified plan. The Plan allows in-service distributions to participants that meet certain age and service requirements.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures on nonvested account balances are allocated as an additional discretionary nonelective contribution. The Plan reallocated \$7,700 to pay for Plan expenses for the year ended December 31, 2024. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$10,536 and \$771, respectively, in unallocated forfeited nonvested accounts.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and the custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are deducted from the loan amount approved. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Excess Contribution Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding deduction of corrective distributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the following year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts in the 2023 financial statements have been reclassified to conform with the 2024 presentation. These reclassifications do not affect net assets available for benefits as previously reported.

NOTE 3 INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY EMPOWER ANNUITY INSURANCE COMPANY AND EMPOWER TRUST COMPANY, LLC

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians of the Plan, have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
- Investment activity and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.
- Schedule H, Line 4i—schedule of assets (held at end of year).

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023, except for the pooled separate accounts and common/collective trust fund previously valued using NAV as a practical expedient. Management determined the funds have a readily determinable fair value based on no liquidity restrictions and daily valuation at which the funds transact at. Accordingly, the accounting change has been retrospectively applied to the prior period presented as if the policy had always been used. The change in method did not impact the amount recorded at fair value.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds and are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled Separate Accounts/Common/Collective Trusts – Valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The 2023 common/collective trusts value has been corrected to separately report the pooled separate accounts rather than as a total common/collective trust fund as originally presented in the 2023 financial statements. The amounts previously reported in the 2023 financial statements have been corrected to reflect this change.

NOTE 5 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH GREAT-WEST INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company. Great-West maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than zero percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Great-West, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments include shares of common collective trusts and a guaranteed interest fund managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company and Empower Trust Company, LLC, which are the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions and notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, ACEC Retirement Trust qualifies as a party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan for investment and record-keeper amounted to \$51,284 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 8 TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted the Great-West Trust Company Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan. An IRS opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, has been obtained for the Prototype Plan. The current version of the Plan has been amended to conform to the most recent requirements of applicable laws. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's federal tax return is subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service and tax authorities, generally for a period of three years after the returns are filed.

NOTE 9 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
