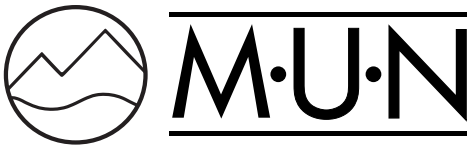

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Bachem Americas, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Bachem Americas, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Bachem Americas, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description or Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Bachem Americas, Inc. ("the Company") who have completed one calendar month of service (elective deferrals, safe harbor contributions and employer profit sharing contribution) and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan and subject to certain limitations. Participants may also contribute Roth contributions and amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of elective deferral contributions not to exceed 3% of annual compensation, plus 50% of elective deferral contributions which are over 3% of annual compensation, but not to exceed 5% of annual compensation. The Company may make discretionary profit sharing contributions determined by the Company each year. Participants must be employed on the last day of the plan year and have completed one month of service to receive an allocation. The Company did not make a discretionary profit sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Plan has an auto-enroll provision where eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a 3.0% deferral rate unless a participant opts out. Participants who are auto-enrolled will have their deferral rate automatically increased by 1% each year until the deferral rate reaches 10.0%.

Participant Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions, and (b) Plan earnings, and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and safe harbor non-elective contributions plus actual earnings thereon. All discretionary contributions vest in accordance with the following schedule:

In case of retirement, disability or death, the participant becomes 100% vested.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment due to death, disability, retirement, or any other reason, a participant with a vested account balance of \$5,000 or less will automatically receive a lump-sum payment. Terminated participants with vested account balances greater than \$5,000 may elect to leave their account in the Plan, receive a lump-sum payment, or receive installment payments over a period of time not more than a participant's assumed life expectancy. A participant may receive in-service withdrawals from certain portions of his or her vested account balance at any time, as defined in the Plan. Under certain conditions participants may receive a hardship distribution. There were no benefit payments requested by participants that had not been paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions.

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan, represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures are utilized to reduce the employer contributions for the plan year. The balance in the forfeiture account as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$69,063 and \$73,577, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$12,685 of the non vested forfeiture accounts was used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses

Loan origination fees associated with notes receivable from participants and the Plan's record keeping and custodian fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses of the Plan. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income reported by the Plan. All other expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements and a description of the method(s) and significant assumptions used to determine the fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on ex-dividend dates. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest with no allowance for loan losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participant's account balances. Defaulted participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and actual results may differ from those estimates.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Future Accounting Pronouncements

In 2022, The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2022-03, *Fair Value Measurement* (Topic 820): Fair Value Measurement of Equity Securities Subject to Contractual Sale Restrictions.

The amendments in this ASU clarify that a contractual restriction on the sale of an equity security is not considered part of the unit of account of the equity security and, therefore, is not considered in measuring fair value. The amendments also clarify that an entity cannot, as a separate unit of account, recognize and measure a contractual sale restriction. The amendments in this ASU also require the following disclosures for equity securities subject to contractual sale restrictions: 1. The fair value of equity securities subject to contractual sale restrictions reflected in the balance sheet 2. The nature and remaining duration of the restriction(s) 3. The circumstances that could cause a lapse in the restriction(s).

The new requirements are effective for the Plan's December 31, 2025 year end. Management has not yet determined the impact of this accounting standard on the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 3: INVESTMENTS CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Substantially all information pertaining to the Plan's investments included in the financial statements, including the associated investment income, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, the trustee. This information has not been audited by independent accountants.

NOTE 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

FASB Accounting Standards Codification 820, Fair Value Measurement, established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded, resulting in a Level 1 valuation.

Collective Trusts: The fair values of participation units held in the collective trusts are based on the net asset values of per unit as reported by the fund managers. The collective trusts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share, with no advance notice requirement. However, redemptions by plan participants to reinvest in options that compete with the fund may be delayed up to 90 days. Currently the Plan does not provide for any competing stable value funds.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5: TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated July 16, 2014 indicating that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the Plan has been amended from the original prototype document, Plan management believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6: PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Notes receivable from participants also reflect party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer discretionary contributions and earnings thereon.
