Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Saputo USA 401(K) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all non-union employees of Saputo Cheese USA Inc., Saputo Dairy Foods, LLC, Saputo International Services, Inc., Saputo International Inc., and Saputo Inc. (collectively, the Company or Plan Sponsor) along with the union employees defined below who have attained 18 years of age, regularly scheduled to work for at least 1,000 hours per year or the completion of the twelve-month period following the employee's date of hire, which commences after such date during which period the employee completes 1,000 hours of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The employees of Saputo Dairy Foods, LLC were transferred to Saputo Cheese USA Inc. effective April 2, 2023.

Effective January 1, 2020, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act increased the required minimum distribution age from 70 (1/2) to 72. Under the SECURE Act, the change in minimum required distribution age may be adopted before amending the Plan so long as the Plan is amended by December 31, 2025. The Plan elected to adopt the change in required minimum distribution age in 2020, and written amendments will be adopted as of a later date in accordance with applicable law.

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 (SECURE 2.0) became law. SECURE 2.0 makes various changes applicable to tax qualified retirement plans. Plan management is evaluating the impact of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the IRS and the Department of Labor. The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

As of March 15, 2024, an amendment was established to bring Saputo International Inc. into the Plan.

As of August 15, 2024, an amendment was established to bring Saputo Inc. into the Plan.

Participant Contributions

Each year, participants are able to contribute up to 75% of compensation, as defined, subject to certain limitations.

The Company may also make a profit-sharing contribution for eligible participants at the discretion of the Board of Directors of the Company. No discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made in 2024 or 2023.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company contributions and allocations of investment income (loss) and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocation of investment income (loss) is based on the proportion of each individual account balance to the total of all account balances. Allocation of administrative expenses is based on the number of participants. Discretionary Company contributions are allocated based on the ratio of the participant's compensation to the total eligible compensation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants may self-direct the investment of their account balances among various designated investment fund options. Participants may change their allocation of contributions and their investment options daily.

Rollovers

The Plan permits participants receiving distributions from other qualified plans to rollover such distributions into the Plan.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on the plan document.

Note 1 - Description of Plan (Continued)

Vesting (continued)

Forfeitures of the Company contributions from non-vested terminated participants are used to offset employer contributions and further to reduce plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,495 and \$6,019, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$109,549 and \$94,440 was used to reduce employer contributions, respectively.

Participant Loans

Loans are not permitted by the Plan.

At December 31, 2024, the outstanding balance of participant loans is related to the transfer of the former Saputo Dairy Foods, LLC Plan assets and are being paid down. As of December 31, 2024, participant loans have maturities through 2041 at interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 6.25%.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment by reason of normal retirement or death, the entire balance of the participant's account is distributable pursuant to the provisions of the Plan. There are no amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Upon termination of employment prior to normal retirement or death, the vested balance of the participant's account from company contributions and the entire amount attributable to the participant's salary reduction contributions shall be distributable pursuant to the provisions of the Plan.

Withdrawal of part of a participant's vested balance funds may be authorized by the Plan prior to any of the above in the event of certain defined financial hardships of a participant. No more than one hardship withdrawal is allowed for a participant per plan year.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the participants as provided in the plan document.

Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, it may do so at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA and upon proper resolution of the Board of Directors of the Company. Should the Plan be terminated, participants would become fully vested in their account balances.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides various investment options to its participants. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate risk, credit risk and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the value of the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value, as determined by the trustee, T. Rowe Price Trust Company (the Trustee), as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Employee and the related employer matching contributions are recorded in the period the employee contribution is withheld by the Plan Sponsor.

Benefit Payments

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions based on the terms of the plan document.

Note 3 - Federal Income Tax Status

Effective January 1, 2012, the Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Note 4 - Information Certified by the Plan's Trustee

The Plan Sponsor has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Trustee of the Plan has certified the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity and notes receivable from participants and related activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the notes to the financial statements, and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 5 - Fair Value Measurements

In accordance with GAAP, the Plan classifies its investments into Level 1, which refers to securities valued using quoted prices from active markets for identical assets; Level 2, which refers to securities not traded on an active market but for which observable market inputs are readily available; and Level 3, which refers to securities valued based on significant unobservable inputs. Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used to measure fair value:

- Mutual funds - Valued at daily closing price by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Notes to Financial Statements (Continued)

Note 5 - Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

- Common collective trusts (CCT) - Valued at NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV as provided by the Trustee is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily, and there are no unfunded commitments. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of a collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to confirm that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The Plan invests in a stable value CCT, whose trust units may be redeemed on a daily basis to meet benefit payments and other participant-initiated withdrawals. The Plan may be required to provide either 12 or 30 months' advance written notice for the stable value fund CCT or up to 30 days advance written notice for the other CCTs to the Trustee prior to redemption of trust units; the notice period may be shortened or waived by the Trustee in its sole discretion.

Note 6 - Exempt Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds and common collective trust funds managed by the Trustee and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the percentages of funds managed by the Trustee were 78.55% and 78.26%, respectively, of the overall portfolio. These transactions are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under Section 408(b) of the ERISA regulations. Loans to participants also represent party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, personnel and facilities of the Plan Sponsor have been used to perform administrative functions for the Plan at no charge to the Plan.

Administrative revenues arise when investment managers return a portion of the investment fees to T. Rowe Price Trust Company to offset administrative expenses. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately \$109,412 and \$94,021, respectively, of revenue sharing was allocated to participant accounts.
