Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the

relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023 AND FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following is a brief description of the Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provided for general informational purposes. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. 401(k) Plan is a defined contribution plan as permitted under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan is funded by employee and employer contributions and covers all employees of Baillie Lumber Co., L.P. (the “Plan Sponsor”) and the following companies (related through common ownership): American Lumber Company L.P., Hamburg Aero Leasing, LLC, Greene Lumber Co., L.P., Clendenin Lumber Company, L.P., Medallion Forest Products, L.P., Hawkeye Forest Products, L.P., Superior Forest Products, L.P., and HMI Hardwoods, LLC (collectively the “Companies”). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining the age of 21 and completing one month of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Effective January 1, 2024, Heritage Forest Products, L.P., Heritage Forest Products, Inc., and Horizon Forest Products Company, L.P. became participating employers in the Horizon Forest Products, L.P. 401(k) Plan, and ceased active participation in the Plan. As a result, \$2,716,333 of net assets transferred out of the Plan.

Contributions – The Plan allows for the Companies to declare a discretionary matching contribution on an annual basis. The Companies declared a discretionary matching employer contribution equal to 35% of the participant’s deferral up to 4% of compensation for eligible employees (except for those employed by Hawkeye Forest Products, L.P. and Greene Lumber Co., L.P.) for the year ended December 31, 2024. A discretionary matching contribution was also declared equal to 100% of the first 3% of contributed compensation and 50% of the next 2% of contributed compensation for the benefit of eligible Greene Lumber Co., L.P. employees for the year ended December 31, 2024. A discretionary matching contribution was also declared equal to 50% of the first 4% of contributed compensation for the benefit of eligible Hawkeye Forest Products, L.P. employees for the year ended December 31, 2024. The total employers’ discretionary matching contributions amounted to \$662,419 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also permits additional discretionary contributions. There were no such contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Total contributions made on behalf of each participant may not exceed limits imposed by the IRC. Each eligible employee may make pre-tax and Roth contributions to the Plan in the form of a 1% to 90% salary reduction limited to statutory limits. The Plan also accepts participant rollover contributions from other qualified plans. Eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the plan at 5% of the contributing employee’s compensation, as defined by the Plan, as well as a 1% annual automatic increase up to 10% of compensation, unless the participant makes an election indicating otherwise.

Vesting – Participants are fully vested in their elective deferrals at all times and become 100% vested in the employer discretionary matching contributions after three years of eligible service. Participants become 100% vested in additional discretionary employer contributions on a graded vesting schedule after six years of eligible service.

1. **PLAN DESCRIPTION (continued)**

Excess Contributions Payable – Contributions received from participants are net of obligations of \$47,135 and \$3,861 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, to certain active participants to return excess deferred contributions as required to satisfy certain nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These obligations are recorded as excess contributions payable on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were returned to participants in March 2025 and March 2024, respectively.

Forfeited Accounts – Forfeited accounts are applied to reduce employer contributions or administrative expenses. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$147,833 and \$70,938 were used to reduce employer contributions, respectively. Forfeitures available to reduce future employer matching contributions or administrative expenses amounted to \$36,060 and \$56,688 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and an allocation of employer contributions and Plan earnings. Allocations of earnings are based on participant account balances.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are determined by the final vested value of the participant’s account at the time of distribution. Distributions are made via installments or a lump-sum payment.

Distributions will be made as soon as practical after a participant’s request. Distributions are also permitted in the event of financial hardship and participants who are age 59.5 or older, as defined by the Plan.

Participants may receive their accumulated benefits upon termination of employment or elect to keep their account in the Plan if their account balance exceeds \$7,000. If the participant elects to keep their account in the Plan, the account will continue to receive its allocation of Plan earnings.

Administrative Expenses – The costs of administering the Plan are borne by both the Plan and Companies.

Plan Termination – Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, all participants shall become fully vested in their accounts at the date of such termination.

2. **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan determines the fair value of assets and liabilities which are subject to reporting at fair value based on standards established within accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. These standards establish a hierarchy for the determination of fair value, as well as disclosure requirements relative to those assets and liabilities. The hierarchy identifies three levels of input. Level 1 inputs are generally quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities, which are actively traded on an exchange. Level 2 inputs generally consist of market prices for identical assets which are not actively traded or market prices of similar assets or liabilities which are actively traded on an exchange. Level 3 inputs are referred to as unobservable inputs and consist primarily of information derived by management, where Level 1 and Level 2 inputs are not available. These may include such things as present value of expected future cash flows or other valuation methodologies. Under the hierarchy, Level 1 inputs are the most preferred, followed by Level 2, and Level 3 are to be used only where neither Level 1 nor Level 2 inputs are available.

An investment's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for investments measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds – Valued based on quoted market prices available on an active market, which represent the net asset values of the shares held by the Plan.

The preceding method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation in fair value of investments, which includes unrealized and realized gains and losses on investments that were held or sold during the year.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Guaranteed Investment Account – This account is fully benefit-responsive and is valued based on contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract plus credited interest less participant withdrawals and fees.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Subsequent Events – Management of the Plan has evaluated the effects of all subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, to determine if events or transactions occurring through that date require potential adjustment or disclosure in the financial statements.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan uses fair value measurements to record fair value adjustments to certain assets and liabilities and to determine fair value disclosures. For additional information on how the Plan measures fair value, refer to Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies. The following table sets forth, by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s assets that are measured at fair value as of December 31:

4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan Sponsor has adopted the Empower Retirement, LLC Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan (the “Pre-Approved Plan”). The Pre-Approved Plan received an Opinion Letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the Plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. Accordingly, no provision has been made for Federal income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.
