INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Administrator of the
AOTCO Metal Finishing LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the AOTCO Metal Finishing LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the Statement of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the AOTCO Metal Finishing LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is intended to provide only general information regarding the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established by AOTCO Metal Finishing, LLC (the Employer) on June 1, 1994. The Plan is a contributory single-employer defined contribution plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1975 (ERISA). Employees of the Employer, other than nonresident aliens and employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, who are 21 years of age or older and have been employed for six months or more are eligible to participate in the Plan effective the first day of the calendar quarter after meeting eligibility requirements.

The Employer is also the Plan Administrator. As Plan Administrator, the Employer has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Ascensus, LLC (Ascensus) is the recordkeeper of the Plan, as an affiliate for Ascensus Trust Company, who is the trustee of the Plan.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute any dollar amount or percentage of their eligible compensation to the Plan, on a pre-tax and after-tax basis, so long as those contributions do not exceed annual limitations set by the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans.

The Employer can elect to contribute a discretionary matching contribution as determined by the Employer's Board of Directors. Employer discretionary matching contributions are allocated to the accounts of the individuals who are participants in the Plan during the period for which such contributions are made and who meet the eligibility requirements, as defined. Employer discretionary matching contributions are allocated based on the participant's elective deferral. Employer discretionary matching contributions made to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled approximately \$89,400.

The Employer, at its discretion, may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan on behalf of all employees who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and are employed as of the last day of the Plan year. The Employer discretionary profit-sharing contribution is allocated in the ratio that each eligible individual's eligible compensation, as defined, bears to total eligible compensation. Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions are recorded annually and remitted in the following Plan year, if applicable. No Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and their allocations of (a) the Employer discretionary and profit-sharing match contributions, (b) Plan earnings (losses) and (c) administrative revenue (expenses). Plan earnings (losses) and administrative revenue (expenses) are allocated to participant accounts based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, rollover contributions, and accrued earnings thereon. A participant becomes fully vested in the Employer's discretionary matching and profit-sharing contributions and the annual allocation of Plan earnings on those contributions after three years of service. A year of vesting service is equal to at least 1,000 hours of service in a plan year. Each participant shall be 100% vested in their Employer contribution accounts upon death, disability or attainment of normal retirement age.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms range from one to five years, with the exception of notes whose proceeds are used for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, which must be repaid over a reasonable period of time, as determined by the Plan Administrator. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with the local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may only have two loans outstanding at any given time.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, death, disability or termination of service, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) can elect to receive 100% of their vested account balance, payable in a single lump-sum distribution or a rollover to a qualifying retirement account, or defer receiving payments until age 72. Participants who have reached the age of 59½ may elect to withdraw all or a portion of their account while still employed by the Employer.

If a participant's vested balance is equal to or less than \$1,000, the participant will receive an immediate cash-out of their vested account balance in a single lump-sum distribution, and the non-vested portion shall be treated as a forfeiture. If a participant's vested balance exceeds \$1,000 and is equal to or less than \$5,000, the amount will be rolled over to an individual retirement plan designated by the trustee, unless otherwise directed by the participant.

Hardship Withdrawals

Hardship distributions are permitted from the participant elective deferral accounts subject to limitations imposed by the IRC.

Forfeitures

Participants in the Plan who leave the employment of the Employer before completing the applicable vesting requirements forfeit the non-vested portion of their accounts. Forfeited non-vested accounts of approximately \$8,400 and \$50 were available to reduce future Employer contributions or pay administrative expenses at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, no forfeitures were used to offset Employer contributions or to reduce administrative expenses.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (Note 3). The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest and are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Interest income on participant notes receivable is recorded when it is earned. A receivable is considered past due if payment has not been received within stated terms. Delinquent participant notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Contributions

Participant and Employer discretionary matching contributions are recorded weekly when the Employer remits the payroll deductions for investment into the Plan. Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions are recorded and remitted annually, if applicable. An Employer profit-sharing contribution receivable of \$160,000 related to the 2023 Plan year remained outstanding at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Employer intends to contribute this Employer profit-sharing contribution receivable during 2025.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recognized when paid to participants or their designated beneficiaries.

Excess Contributions Refundable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants subsequent to year end.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Employer, unless the Employer directs that the expenses be paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Participant notes receivable set-up and maintenance fees are paid directly by the participants through a reduction in their account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment management fees for certain investments are included as a reduction of investment return (net appreciation or depreciation) from the related investment fund.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported change in net assets. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options with various investment objectives. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest risk, market risk and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits.

The Plan invested in two mutual funds that accounted for approximately 24% of total Plan investments as of December 31, 2024. The Plan invested in three mutual funds that accounted for approximately 36% of total Plan investments as of December 31, 2023.

Financial Instruments with a Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan's investments are held by a single trustee. The Plan's exposure to credit risk is associated with the outside entity's non-performance of their fiduciary responsibilities relating to these amounts as specified in the agreements. Benefits provided by the Plan are not insured or guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy and inputs to the valuation methodologies are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs are other than quoted prices in active markets that are observable either directly or indirectly for the asset. Such inputs are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data for similar assets by correlation or other means, over substantially the full contractual term of the asset, if applicable.

Level 3 inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Such inputs generally rely on the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis:

Cash and Cash Equivalents: The carrying amounts of cash and cash equivalents are deemed to be valued at deposit amount plus accrued interest, as determined according to the stated terms.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments in cash and cash equivalents and mutual funds are reported at level 1 within the fair value hierarchy.

4. Plan Termination

The Employer expects to continue the Plan indefinitely. However, the Employer reserves the right to amend the Plan at any time and in any manner that it deems advisable, provided that no amendment shall have the effect of diverting the Plan assets for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan participants and any Plan termination would be subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, the participants would become fully vested and entitled to receive all amounts credited to their accounts.

5. Summary of Financial Data Certified by the Trustee

The following is a summary of financial information and data certified by Ascensus:

6. Income Tax Status

The Plan is an adoption of a non-standardized pre-approved plan sponsored by Ascensus, LLC, who received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter in order to comply with the latest applicable tax laws and regulations. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Differences from Form 5500

Differences between the Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan, Form 5500, and these financial statements are a result of different classifications between line items. Total Plan assets are in agreement.

8. Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are held and managed by Ascensus, the Trustee of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan made direct payments to Ascensus and its affiliates for administrative services totaling \$4,700 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also made direct payments to its investment advisor totaling approximately \$7,100 during 2024. Such costs are allocated to participants in the Plan. In addition, participant notes receivable also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

9. Non-exempt Transactions

During the years ended December 31, 2022, and 2021, the Employer failed to remit participant contributions of \$169 and \$4,214, respectively, to the Plan on a timely basis as prescribed in the applicable Department of Labor Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-10. Defined contribution plans must remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions are withheld or received by the employer.

During 2023, the Employer remitted untimely participant contributions of \$169 due to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2022. During 2024, the Employer remitted the lost earnings associated with this late remittance. During 2022, the Employer remitted untimely participant contributions of \$4,214 due to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2021. The Employer is currently working with its third-party administrator to calculate and remit any lost earnings associated with this late remittance.
