Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of ICW Group Holdings, Inc. Salary Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (an "ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements For the Year Ended December 31, 2024

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the ICW Group Holdings, Inc. (the "Company") Salary Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan includes employees of ICW Group Holdings, Inc., including its wholly-owned subsidiaries, Insurance Company of the West, Risk Insurance Brokers of the West, VerTerra Insurance Company, and On Point Risk Solutions, Inc. The Plan is a combined 401(k) plan and profit sharing plan whereby the Company may contribute cash to the Plan.

Eligibility

Eligible participants in the Plan are employees of the Company and its wholly-owned subsidiaries who are 21 years of age and have completed three months of service. The Plan excludes leased employees, collectively bargained employees, and nonresident aliens with no U.S. source income.

Participant Contributions

Eligible participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of pretax and/or after tax (Roth contributions) annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. In addition, employees who are age 50 or older can elect to defer additional amounts (called "catch-up contributions") to the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified sources. Effective April 2022, the Plan was amended to expand rollover eligibility to employees who have not yet met the age and service requirements for deferrals into the Plan. All participant contributions are subject to limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Any eligible employee hired on or after January 1, 2013, except those who made an affirmative election otherwise, are to be automatically enrolled in the Plan with an automatic contribution rate set at the maximum match percentage for the Plan year in which they become eligible, which will be contributed to the Plan on their behalf as a pretax savings contribution.

The Plan also has an automatic increase program for participant contributions. Each participant's affirmative or deemed election of pretax savings contributions will automatically be increased by 1% each Plan year unless or until the participant is making pretax and/or Roth contributions, in the aggregate, at a rate equal to at least 10% of compensation, or the participant has made an affirmative election to contribute 0% of their compensation to the Plan. Participants may opt out of the automatic increase program at any time. Once a participant opts out, the participant will not be subject to further automatic increases unless they affirmatively elect to participate in the automatic increase program.

Contributions by participants with no investment selection in place are deposited into a qualified default investment alternative.

Employer Contributions

The 2024 discretionary matching contribution is equal to 75% of a participant's deferral (excluding catch-up contributions) up to 6% of eligible annual compensation. The match is remitted on a per-pay period basis and a true-up is computed at the end of the year and subsequently remitted to the Plan. The true-up receivable was \$427,016 and \$129,917 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan sponsor did not make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution for 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and an allocation of (a) the employer's discretionary matching contributions, if applicable, (b) the employer's discretionary profit-sharing contributions, if applicable, (c) Plan earnings and losses, and (d) Plan expenses. Allocations to participant accounts of discretionary profit-sharing contributions are based on the ratio between the participant's base salary and total base salaries of all participants as defined in the Plan document. Allocations of earnings and losses are based upon the ratio between the participant's account balance invested in a particular fund and the total account balances invested in that particular fund. Certain Plan expenses are allocated to the accounts of Participants either proportionally based on the value of account balances or as an equal dollar amount based on the number of participants in the Plan. Other expenses are charged directly to accounts of transacting participants.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their own contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Through January 2022, vesting in employer contributions was 100% upon the completion of three years of credited service by participants. In February 2022, the Plan was amended to change the vesting schedule to 33% for one year of credited service, 66% for two years of credited service, and 100% for three or more years of credited service. A year of credited service is based on a twelve consecutive month period beginning on the participant's date of hire. Any period of service less than twelve consecutive months is disregarded.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants direct their contributions to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. Subsequently, participants may change their allocation and transfer account balances between the investment options in accordance with the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow against their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum generally equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. The notes receivable are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest rates determined by the Plan administrator. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rates ranged from 5.25% to 10.50%. Note terms range from one to five years unless used to purchase a primary residence, which may allow for repayment for up to ten years. Principal and interest is paid regularly through payroll deductions. Outstanding notes receivable become due and payable upon a participant's termination of employment.

Notes Receivable from Participants (Continued)

In April 2020, the Plan operationally implemented the provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the "CARES Act"). Participants requesting relief under the CARES Act were permitted (i) an increased loan limit to the lesser of \$100,000 or 100% of the nonforfeitable account balance (available until September 23, 2020), and (ii) a delay in loan repayments due through December 31, 2020 for up to one year.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, death, disability, attaining age 59½, or hardship, a participant may elect to receive: 1) a lump sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account balance; 2) periodic payments by selecting a predetermined number of payments or a fixed dollar payment of a selected frequency assuming specific requirements are met; or 3) elect to leave such funds on deposit in the Plan.

Pursuant to the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (the "SECURE" Act), which became law on December 20, 2019, and the SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 ("SECURE Act 2.0") which became law on December 29, 2022, participants may defer taking distributions as follows:

- If a participant reached the age of 70½ in 2019, the participant may defer receiving distributions until the later of April 1, 2020, or the April following the calendar year in which the participant retires;
- If a participant reaches the age of 70½ in 2020 or later, the participant may defer receiving distributions until the later of the April following the calendar year in which the participant reaches age 72 or retires, except that -
- Beginning in 2023, the age a participant must begin taking distributions was raised to 73. If a participant reaches the age of 72 during 2023, the participant may defer receiving distributions until April 1, 2025, the latest date that a required minimum distribution may be taken for 2024.

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance at the time of distribution.

Upon employee termination, the Plan may roll over a participant's vested account balance greater than \$1,000 and less than \$5,000 into an individual retirement account ("IRA") selected by the Plan sponsor, if the participant has not elected to receive a cash distribution or have the balance rolled over into an IRA of his/her choosing. Beginning on January 15, 2025, this amount will be raised from \$5,000 to \$7,000. Also at its discretion, the Plan sponsor may elect to distribute accounts with vested balances of less than \$1,000 in the form of a lump sum payment.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Company contributions may be used to reduce employer matching contributions or pay for Plan expenses. Forfeitures that were unallocated to participants totaled \$270,113 and \$446 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024, \$264,075 in forfeitures were credited to the forfeiture account due to distributions, and there were \$5,592 in earnings and other miscellaneous items, net.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value with the exception of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (Note 5) because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative Expenses

Certain costs and expenses related to the administration of the Plan are paid by the Plan sponsor. Other costs and expenses such as distribution expenses, loan expenses, and participant direction expenses, including brokerage fees are charged to the accounts of the applicable Plan participants.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events through the date of the independent auditors' report, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and the ERISA-required supplemental schedule (Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i), including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity"), the Plan's custodian.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement for the asset or liability at the measurement date. These inputs reflect Plan management's best estimate of what market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Consideration is given to the risk inherent in the valuation technique and in the inputs to the model.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Cash, interest-bearing: Interest bearing deposits are valued at carrying value, which approximates fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts: Valued at net asset value ("NAV") using the fair value of underlying funds of the respective common/collective trust ("CCT"). The fair value of funds held is used in determining the NAV of the CCT, which is publicly quoted. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the CCT can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, it is believed that these investments have a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is calculated in a manner consistent with U.S. GAAP for investment companies. Because they are valued similarly to mutual funds, it is believed that CCTs should be a Level 1 asset.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts consist primarily of common stocks, cash, exchange traded funds, and publicly-traded stocks for which identical securities are observable in active markets.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5. FULLY BENEFIT RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Lincoln National Life Insurance Company

The Plan has a group annuity insurance contract with Lincoln National Life Insurance Company ("Lincoln"). This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount which would be received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest credited and less participant withdrawals.

The Plan owns a promise to pay interest at crediting rates which are announced in advance and guaranteed for a specified period of time as outlined in the group annuity contract. This product is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract defines the circumstances and amounts for which the contract may be terminated by the Plan.

NOTE 5. FULLY BENEFIT RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (Continued)

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the Lincoln contract is dependent on Lincoln's ability to meet its financial obligations which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value. Such events include but may not be limited to the complete or partial termination of the Plan or the establishment or activation of, or material change in, an investment fund, or an amendment to the Plan or a change in the administration or operation of the Plan, including the removal of a group of employees from Plan coverage as a result of the sale or liquidation of a subsidiary or division or as a result of group layoffs or early retirement programs. Plan management does not believe these events are probable of occurring. The guaranteed minimum interest rate for all years is 1%.

NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7. TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan, and relies upon the pre-approved plan's opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that, in its opinion, the pre-approved plan's design was in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Company has not applied for a determination letter from the IRS specific to the Plan. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 8. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain of the Plan's operating expenses are paid by the Plan sponsor. The Plan sponsor provides administrative services for the Plan at no cost to the Plan. In addition, certain investments are managed by the custodian of the Plan's assets. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10. OPERATIONAL FAILURE

During 2024, the Company discovered an operational failure relating to missed deferral contributions for a participant, which had been ongoing since 2022. The Company and the Plan administrator have determined that only one participant was affected, and intend on taking corrective action as necessary under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System's Self-Correction Program. The total amount to be contributed by the Company is \$16,107, which is included in employer contributions receivable in the accompanying 2024 statement of net assets.

Based on the actions intended to be taken, Plan management and the Company believe the aforementioned operational failure will not cause the Plan to be disqualified by the IRS and that the self-corrective actions will allow the Plan to be in compliance with the Plan documents and ERISA. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements.

NOTE 11. DELINQUENT REMITTANCES

The Company identified four instances where amounts withheld from employee paychecks totaling \$1,294,409 in 2023, and four instances where amounts withheld from employee paychecks totaling \$1,869,397 in 2024 were not remitted to the Plan within the reasonableness timeframe established by the Department of Labor. The Company is in the process of calculating and remitting lost earnings and interest thereon.

NOTE 12. SECURE ACT 2.0

On December 29, 2022, the SECURE Act 2.0 became law. The purpose of the legislation is to expand access to retirement plans and to help working Americans increase their retirement savings. In addition to the changes to minimum required distributions described in Note 1, the SECURE Act 2.0 includes various required and optional provisions that will become effective through 2033, certain of which are described below.

- Beginning January 1, 2025, a participant from the ages 60 to 63 can elect catch-up contributions up to the limit of the greater of \$10,000 or 150% of the catch-up contribution limit imposed by the IRS.
- Starting January 1, 2025, long-term part-time workers (defined as employees who have worked for two consecutive 12-month periods during each of which they have at least 500 hours of service) will become eligible to enroll in their employer's retirement plan after two years.
- Beginning in 2027, catch-up contributions will be made on a Roth basis, unless the participant earns \$145,000 or less.

The deadline for SECURE 2.0 amendments is December 31, 2026. Plan management has not yet determined which of the optional provisions the Plan will implement, and intends to amend the plan document by December 31, 2026.
