Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the TWD & Associates, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of TWD & Associates, Inc. (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor” or Employer”) who are at least 21 years old, excluding nonresident aliens, leased, part-time, temporary, and seasonal employees. The Plan was established effective January 1, 1994 and was most recently amended during the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Plan is administered by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan administrator has the overall responsibility and authority as the named fiduciary to manage and control the operations and administration of the Plan and may designate one or more individuals to perform these responsibilities. The Plan’s assets are held in the custody of Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (“qualified institution”).

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Plan Sponsor. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor.

Participant Contributions – Employees who are at least 21 years old are eligible to become participants. Participants can make salary deferral contributions from 1% up to 75% of their compensation, subject to the limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Qualified distributions from other qualified retirement plans can also be contributed to the Plan and retained as a rollover contribution. The Plan offers numerous investment options from which participants can choose to invest their contributions. The Plan has a 3% automatic deferral from participant’s compensation each payroll period unless the participant makes a contrary election. Participants have the opportunity to change their investment combinations and salary deferral percentages at any time during the year.

Employer Contributions – The Plan is a safe harbor plan and provides for the Plan Sponsor to match 100% elective deferrals that do not exceed 5% of each participant’s eligible compensation contributed to the Plan. Additionally, the Plan Sponsor has the option to make a discretionary non-elective contribution to the Plan, with the amount determined annually. There was no discretionary non-elective contribution made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral and rollover contributions plus earnings (losses) thereon. Participants also become 100% vested upon permanent disability, death, or upon reaching normal retirement age. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor’s discretionary non-elective contributions and Qualified Automatic Contribution Arrangement (“QACA”) safe harbor contributions is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Participant Accounts – Individual accounts are maintained for each participant and each account is credited and/or reduced with the participant’s elective contributions and distributions, the Company’s matching contributions, and an allocation of the Company’s discretionary non-elective contributions, if any, and Plan earnings (losses) including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments. Allocations are based on participant earnings on participant-specific transactions or calculated matching contributions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

Note 1—Description of the Plan (continued)

Investment Options – Participants may direct the qualified institution as to the investment of their account balances in accordance with guidelines established by the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections at any time. Transfers of account balances between elected investment options may also be made at any time.

Notes Receivable from Participants – The Plan allows participants to borrow against their vested account balances, subject to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the one-year period prior to the loan issuance, or 50% of the vested interest and IRC restrictions. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000. Participant loans require periodic payments, bear interest at rates charged on similar commercial loans under like circumstances and are due within five years. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on participant loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Benefits Paid to Participants – Amounts credited to an individual participant's account are eligible for distribution in a lump sum upon the participant attaining the age of 59½, termination of employment, retirement, disability, or death. A participant may elect to roll over the value of their account into another qualified plan. The Plan also allows, in certain hardship situations as defined in the Plan, participants to withdraw from their account balances while actively employed. These hardship withdrawals are subject to IRC restrictions and penalties.

Forfeitures – Terminating participants forfeit nonvested Plan Sponsor discretionary non-elective and QACA safe harbor matching contributions. Remaining forfeitures shall be applied against Plan Sponsor contributions in accordance with specific Plan provisions. The forfeited nonvested account balance at both December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$-0-. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$116,890 of forfeitures were applied against Plan Sponsor contributions.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Presentation – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan provides for various investment fund options. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments in the Plan are reported at fair value. U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date and interest income is recognized when earned. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Benefits Paid to Participants – Benefits paid to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses paid directly by the Company on behalf of the Plan include legal fees and accounting fees and are excluded from these financial statements. Expenses paid by the Plan include third party administration fees and investment fees.

Fair Value Measurements – U.S. GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability, and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023:

Mutual Funds – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is a quoted price in an active market and is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Common Collective Trusts – Common collective trusts (“CCT”) invest in a collective trust fund as well as a variety of separate accounts and mutual funds. CCTs are valued using NAV which is not publicly quoted but is made available to investors through the qualified institution. NAV is the basis for current transactions, and the CCT can be redeemed at NAV of a measurement date. Therefore, the CCTs have a readily determinable fair value and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Pooled Separate Accounts – Each of the pooled separate accounts invest in a single mutual fund. The fair value of these funds is a publicly quoted pricing input used to determine the net asset value of the pooled separate account, which, therefore, has a readily determinable fair value and is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 3—Information prepared and certified by the qualified institution (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly Principal Trust Company, the “qualified institution”, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules.

- Investments, at fair value and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividends, other income, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan’s independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to the certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedules.

Note 5—Parties-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan assets are invested in funds managed by the qualified institution as defined by the Plan. Transactions involving these investments are considered to be party-in-interest transactions for which statutory exemption exists under DOL Rules and Regulations. Fees paid by the Plan and deducted from participant accounts for contract administrative expenses amounted to \$28,394 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Fees paid to an investment advisor amounted to \$14,319 for the year ended December 31, 2024. These fees are included in administrative expenses on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Note 6—Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant becomes fully vested with the amount of credit in their individual account and under no conditions will any part of the account revert to the Company.

Note 7—Tax status

The Plan Sponsor adopted a prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) on June 30, 2020, which stated the prototype plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself. However, the Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) and the related trust is tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan has no income subject to unrelated business income tax.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate the tax positions taken by the Plan and to recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8—Delinquent contributions

As required by ERISA Section 2510.3-102, the Company is required to segregate and remit employee contributions to the Plan from its general assets as soon as the funds can be reasonably segregated. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there was a pay period in which contributions were not remitted on a timely basis. Contributions for that pay period are considered prohibited transactions. Subsequent to year end, the Company intends to correct and fund the Plan for late contributions and related lost earnings from the 2024 delay in contributions.

Note 9—Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that no additional subsequent events has occurred that would require recognition or disclosure in these financial statements, except as discussed below.

Effective August 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to operate as an Automatic Contribution Arrangement ("ACA"). Under this new structure, the Plan no longer qualifies as a safe harbor plan, and the Plan Sponsor is not required to make matching contributions. However, the Plan Sponsor retains the option to make discretionary contributions, with the amount to be determined annually. Participants will continue to be automatically enrolled at a 3% deferral rate, unless they elect otherwise.
