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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

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**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Wedbush Securities Inc. Employees' Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**1. General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Wedbush Securities Inc. and affiliates Wedbush Capital, Lightspeed Financial Services Group, LLC, Coinigy Inc., and Wedbush Financial Services, LLC (collectively, the "Employer") under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). Effective April 30, 2024, Lightspeed Technology Services LLC was added as a participating employer, and Coinigy Inc. was removed as a participating employer (see Note I). The Plan provides for a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Employer. The plan administrator is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Wedbush Securities Inc. Employees' Retirement Plan Committee is responsible for determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance. Charles Schwab Trust Bank (the "Trustee") is responsible for the custody and management of the Plan's assets.

**2. Eligibility**

All non-union, non-intern, and non-leased employees who are U.S. residents may participate in the Plan upon attainment of age 18. Employees may begin contributing to the Plan on the first day of the month following eligibility. Eligible employees who are employed on the last day of the plan year and have attained 1,000 hours of service are also eligible for Employer discretionary matching contributions and Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions. Employees from Lightspeed Financial Services Group, LLC, employees from Coinigy Inc through April 30, 2024, and effective April 30, 2024, employees from Lightspeed Technology Services LLC are not eligible to receive Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions (see Note I).

**3. Contributions**

Participants may elect to contribute, on a tax-deferred basis, a Roth 401(k) basis, or as an after-tax contribution, up to 50% of their eligible compensation, subject to certain limitations under the IRC. Participants may direct contributions, as desired, in any of several investments offered by the Trustee or available through the self-directed brokerage account option and may change their investment options daily. In addition, the Employer may make annual discretionary matching contributions as determined on an annual basis by the Board of Directors of the Employer.

The Employer may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution for each active and eligible participant, in an amount subject to determination on an annual basis by the Board of Directors of the Employer.

**4. Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Employer's discretionary matching contribution, as well as allocations of the Employer's discretionary profit-sharing contribution, if applicable, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**5. Notes Receivable From Participants**

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of 50% of their vested account balance (not to exceed \$50,000 less the highest outstanding loan balance during the prior twelve-month period). The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Participants may have one loan outstanding at any time. All loans shall bear interest at a reasonable rate as determined by the plan administrator upon issuance. Loans must be paid back within five years of the date of issuance in accordance with terms established by the plan administrator. Loans for the purchase of a principal residence may be paid back over a longer period of time as determined at the time of origination. Loans are due and payable upon the participant's termination of employment with the Employer.

**6. Vesting**

Employee contributions, Employer qualified nonelective contributions, safe harbor contributions related to Coinigy Inc. participants from a 2021 plan merger in 2021, rollovers and actual earnings on all such contributions are fully vested at all times. For employees terminated after March 1, 2019, Employer discretionary matching contributions, Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions and actual earnings thereon, are vested 100% after two years of service. For employees terminated prior to March 1, 2019, vesting of Employer discretionary matching contributions, Employer discretionary profit-sharing contributions, and Employer prior money purchase plan account balances and actual earnings thereon, are based upon the participant's years of service with the Employer as follows:

#### 7. Benefit Payments

Upon termination of employment with the Employer, a participant may receive a lump sum disbursement if his or her vested account balance is less than \$1,000. If the vested account balance is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, a lump sum will be distributed directly to an individual retirement account unless the participant elects otherwise. For balances greater than \$5,000, the participant is entitled to a lump sum amount or installment payments. In the event of normal retirement age, death or total and permanent disability, a participant's beneficiary or the participant is entitled to the total value of the participant's account. In addition, participants may receive distributions upon attaining age 59½ or upon completing five years as a participant with a fully vested account that has accumulated for two years or more. Hardship withdrawals are also permitted if certain criteria are met.

#### 8. Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid from the assets of the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### 9. Forfeitures

Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts will be applied against future Employer contributions or to pay plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$84,108 of forfeitures was applied against Employer discretionary matching contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was \$127,682 and \$84,108, respectively of unallocated forfeitures included in net assets available for benefits. The Employer contributions receivable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 have been reduced by \$127,682 and \$84,108, respectively, for forfeitures utilized in the subsequent year.

#### 10. Plan Amendments and Termination

Although it has not expressed such intent, the Employer, by action of its Board of Directors, reserves the right, at any time, to amend or terminate the Plan. Upon termination of the Plan, further contributions to the Plan shall cease and all participants who are affected by such termination shall become 100% vested. Net assets available for benefits would be distributed to the participants based on each participant's interest in the Plan.

### NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1. Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**2. Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**3. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Investments in interest bearing cash consist of a money market deposit account with the Trustee that is reported at fair value, determined to equal cost, and protected (subject to limits) by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC"). The Plan's management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**4. Notes Receivable From Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

**5. Excess Contributions Payable**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability with a corresponding increase to deductions from net assets.

**6. Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**7. Subsequent Events**

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025 the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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**NOTE C - CERTIFICATION BY TRUSTEE**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, all of the investment information, and notes receivable from participants and related interest income, included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules has been certified as complete and accurate by the Trustee of the Plan.

**NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Interest bearing cash:* Valued at cost, which is determined to equal fair value.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Valued at the daily closing prices reported on active markets on which the underlying securities are traded, quoted prices for markets that are not active or based on inputs that are observable for markets that have little to no market activity.

*Common collective trust:* Valued at the NAV of the underlying investments expressed as units. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investments for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different value measurement at the reporting date.

The Invesco Stable Value Trust – Class III is a common collective trust whose objective is to seek the preservation of principal and to provide interest income reasonably obtained under prevailing market conditions and rates, consistent with seeking to maintain required liquidity. The Invesco Stable Value Trust – Class III invests primarily in fixed-income securities or bond funds, enters into “wrap” contracts issued by third-parties, and invests in cash equivalents through money market mutual funds. As of December 31, 2024, the plan administrator does not believe any events which would limit the unit holders to transact at NAV are probable of occurring. However, there is a possible market value adjustment when funds are withdrawn prior to their maturity.

**NOTE E - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Trustee is a party-in-interest with respect to the Plan. Investments are held with and managed by the Trustee. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing rather than direct payment. Additional fees may be paid directly to the Trustee or other parties-in-interest. Notes receivable and the related interest income are considered related party transactions.

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**NOTE F - INCOME TAX STATUS**

The IRS has issued an opinion letter to an affiliate of the Trustee dated September 21, 2020, that the adopted non-standardized pre-approved plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan did not seek a favorable determination letter with respect to the initial adoption of the plan document, nor with any plan amendments or restatements, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

**NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE H - PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS**

During the years ended December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, the Employer failed to remit employee contributions to the Plan on a timely basis, as required by DOL Reg. 2510.3-102, resulting in prohibited transactions. The Employer is in the process of computing the lost earnings related to the late remittances for deposit to the Plan.

**NOTE I - PLAN AMENDMENT AND RESTATEMENT**

Effective April 30, 2024, the Plan was amended to add Lightspeed Technology Services LLC as a participating employer and remove Coinigy Inc. as a participating employer (see Notes A-1 and A-2).
