To the Luminis Health Retirement Plan (Employer Contributions)
and its Participants:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Luminis Health Retirement Plan (Employer Contributions) (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Luminis Health Retirement Plan (Employer Contributions) (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Anne Arundel Medical Center, Inc. effective July 1, 1983. Effective March 28, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow Luminis Health Doctors Community Medical Center, Inc. to become a participating employer in the Plan. Effective, April 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to change the name of the Plan to Luminis Health Retirement Plan (Employer Contributions) and effective January 1, 2022, to change the Plan sponsor name from Anne Arundel Medical Center, Inc., to Luminis Health Anne Arundel Medical Center, Inc. (the Company).

All employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan immediately upon commencement of employment, except leased employees (unless they meet certain requirements, as defined by the Plan) and those covered by a collective bargaining agreement with the Company that does not expressly provide for participation in the Plan.

Participant contributions are made into the Luminis Health Retirement Plan (formerly the Anne Arundel Medical Center Employees' Salary Reduction Thrift Plan) (the 403(b) Plan), and the Company's related matching contributions are deposited into the Plan. As such, participant contributions are not assets of the Plan and are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan provides that only regularly scheduled full-time and part-time employees scheduled to work at least 1,000 hours in the current calendar year are eligible to receive matching contributions. In addition, as of the last day of the Plan year, Company matching contributions are allocated to the accounts of those participants who were not scheduled to work at a rate of at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year, but who actually completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the year. Additionally, part-time employees who work on an unscheduled basis and meet the 1,000 hours of service requirement are also eligible for matching contributions for the following Plan year. If they do not reach 1,000 hours, those matching contributions are forfeited in accordance with Plan provisions. Participants may roll over funds from other qualified plans into the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Company's basic contributions to the Plan are limited to the first 6% of qualified earnings deferred into the 403(b) Plan, and calculated on a per payroll basis. The Company, at its discretion, may make additional supplemental matching contributions to the Plan in excess of 6% of qualified wages. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any additional discretionary supplemental contributions.

The Company's contributions are based on participant contributions in the 403(b) Plan and years of service as described below:

Contributions, net of forfeitures applied, totaled \$14,932,641 and \$14,117,587 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the Company's contributions and participant's withdrawals. Participants have the option to have their account professionally managed by an investment adviser that is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower), the Custodian of the Plan. Allocations of earnings or losses and administrative expenses are based on the proportion of each participant's account balance to the total of all account balances within the respective fund. Participants may roll over funds from other qualified plans into the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their rollover contributions to the Plan. Participants who were terminated prior to December 31, 2001 vested in the amounts contributed on their behalf by the Company according to the following graduated vesting schedule:

Upon retirement, death, or disability, a participant becomes 100% vested in their Company contributions.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. Forfeitures applied to reduce Company contributions totaled \$417,237 and \$228,068 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses totaled \$26,581 and \$6,528 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited balances available as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$410,037 and \$104,517, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability, retirement (age 65) or attainment of age 59½, a participant or their beneficiary, in the event of death, is entitled to a distribution of their vested account balance. Distributions are made in either a lump sum equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account or installments for a specified term, as defined by the Plan. Prior to retirement, distributions from the Plan are payable in the form of a lump-sum payment. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59½. The Plan does not allow for hardship distributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no net assets of the Plan allocated to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan who had not received such distributions as of year-end.

Plan Expenses

All administrative expenses are paid with the assets of the Plan, unless paid by the Company, at its discretion. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company elected to pay a portion of the Plan's direct expenses. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to benefit payments are paid by the Plan and its participants. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

The Plan has a revenue sharing arrangement with Empower whereby the Plan receives .25% of the revenue rate that is credited to the Plan's investment options, prorated quarterly, and based on account balances as of the calculation date. This revenue is credited by Empower into the Plan account. The funds credited to this account are used by the Plan to pay recordkeeping fees. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance in this account totaled \$4,417 and \$24,239, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, administrative fees paid through this arrangement totaled \$141,165 and \$148,812, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to net assets available for benefits and deductions from net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in assets that are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities may occur and materially affect the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (Note 4). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Custodian.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Fair Value Measurement

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Fair Value Measurement – cont'd.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Interests in registered investment companies: Valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the funds are traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated for disclosure any subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there were no material events that warrant disclosure, except as disclosed in Note 8.

3. INVESTMENTS

All investment data contained in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including assets held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value of investments for the years then ended was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by both Empower and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the Custodian and Trustee of the Plan, respectively.

4. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

The Plan holds a portfolio of traditional investment contracts. These contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The following represents the disaggregation of traditional contract values held by the Plan as of December 31,:

With traditional investment contracts, the Plan owns only the contract itself, and not the underlying investments. Traditional investment contracts are designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuers.

The traditional investment contracts held by the Plan are a guaranteed interest fund contract and a guaranteed fixed fund contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than zero percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a periodic basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated by the issuer before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations.

4. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS – cont'd.

The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Code.
2. Premature termination of the contracts.
3. Plan termination or merger.
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options.
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines.
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
3. A material misrepresentation.
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers or that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are managed by Empower. Empower acts as Custodian for the Plan and is a related entity to the Trustee. The Company provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. All such transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan sponsor and ERISA counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

ASC 740, *Income Taxes*, prescribes a recognition threshold and a measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return as well as guidance on de-recognition, classification, interest and penalties and financial statement reporting disclosures. For these benefits to be recognized, a tax position must be more-likely-than-not to be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS – cont'd.

As the Plan is tax exempt and has no unrelated business taxable income, the provisions of ASC 740 do not have an impact on the Plan's financial statements. The Plan recognizes interest and penalties accrued on any unrecognized tax exposures as a component of income tax expense. The Plan does not have any amounts accrued relating to interest and penalties as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Internal Revenue Service and Department of Labor; however, there are currently no audits for any periods in progress.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. OPERATIONAL FAILURES

Subsequent to December 31, 2024, the Company became aware of certain operational failures with respect to missed Company contributions for a small subset of participants who work on an unscheduled basis but completed over 1,000 hours in a Plan year. Management believes this error occurred for the Plan years 2023 through 2024. Management is working with the Plan's Trustee and legal counsel to calculate missed contributions for these participants and will correct these errors in accordance with procedures under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System. The Company does not believe that the correction of such operational failures are material to the Plan's financial statements.

During 2024, the Company became aware of certain operational failures with respect to missed required minimum distributions for certain Plan participants. Management is working with the Plan's Trustee and legal counsel to correct these matters in accordance with procedures under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System to avoid any penalties to the Plan or Plan sponsor and preserve the tax status of the Plan. The Company does not expect that the correction of such operational failures will result in any material adjustments to the Plan's financial statements.
