Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of the Evansville Surgical Associates, Inc. (Company) Profit Sharing/Savings Retirement Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees, except leased and union employees, of the Company who are age 21 or older and have completed one year of service with at least 1,000 hours of service or three consecutive years of service with at least 500 hours each year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Plan's Investment Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute up to 100 percent of their eligible compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investments of their contributions into various investment options and self-directed brokerage accounts offered by the Plan. Once participants have one year of credited service, the Company contributes a Safe Harbor contribution equal to four percent of a participant's eligible compensation. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. The profit sharing contribution uses a class allocation based on each participant in an individual group. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a \$948,732 profit sharing contribution to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company's Safe Harbor matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and Safe Harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's profit sharing contributions portion of their accounts, plus earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after four years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at two percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interests in his or her account, or partial distributions. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Participants may request a hardship withdrawal of a portion of their account attributable to participant deferrals. Any hardship withdrawal is limited to the amount needed to meet the financial need. In-service distributions are also permitted upon meeting certain requirements as defined by the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$55 and \$0, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and to pay Plan expenses. In 2024, employer contributions and Plan expenses were reduced by \$17,304 and \$5,130, respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to certain recordkeeping as well as the administration of distributions and notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds, common stocks, US treasury bonds, exchange traded funds, and money market funds that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Money market fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Money market funds held by the Plan are open-end money market funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The money market funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 5 - Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and a money market fund managed by Ascensus Trust Company. Ascensus Trust Company is the Trustee for the Plan and; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan made a direct payment to the Trustees, recordkeepers, and investment advisors of \$94,822 for the year ended December 31, 2024, which was not covered by revenue sharing. The Company pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7 - Tax Status

The Plan adopted a nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing plan with Cash or Deferred Arrangement sponsored by Employee Benefit Services, Inc. The plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS as to the plan's qualified status. The Plan Sponsor can rely on the qualified status to the extent the Plan Document does not deviate from the IRS pre-approved provisions. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and; therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - Nonexempt Transactions

During 2023, the Plan Sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit participant contributions totaling approximately \$5,578 within the time frame required by Department of Labor regulations. The Plan Sponsor deposited corrective contributions on May 23, 2024.
