Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2024 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the 2024 financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - 2024 Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, Schedule H, Line 4(a) - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, and Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Other Matter – Auditors’ Report on the 2023 Financial Statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2023 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report, dated October 14, 2024, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2023 supplemental schedules, other than the information in the 2023 supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2023 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the LDX Solutions 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan was adopted by Dustex, LLC (the Company or Employer) effective October 1, 1989, and restated effective January 1, 2021. The Plan is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility

All active employees of the Company, excluding union employees and non-resident aliens, who have completed 90 days of service, as defined by the Plan, are eligible to participate in the Plan. Enrollment is allowed on the first day of the month following the date when eligibility requirements are met.

Contributions

Each year, Participants may contribute, on a pre-tax basis, up to the dollar limitation set forth in Section 402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) in effect at the beginning of the Plan year. In addition to pre-tax contributions, Roth contributions also may be made to Participant accounts. Participants who have attained age 50 before the close of the Plan year are allowed to make catch-up contributions up to the maximum allowed under the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company has elected to operate the Plan under a safe harbor provision whereby Participants in the Plan receive a matching contribution of 100% of the amount of the Participant's elective deferrals that do not exceed 4% of the Participant's compensation, plus 50% of the amount of the Participant's elective deferrals that exceed 4% of the Participant's compensation but do not exceed 6% of the Participant's compensation.

The Company may also make additional discretionary Employer matching contributions or discretionary Employer profit-sharing contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not make discretionary matching or profit-sharing contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each Participant's account is credited with the Participant's salary deferral contributions, allocations of any Company safe harbor matching contributions and any discretionary contributions (collectively, Employer contributions), and his/her share of the Plan's income (loss). The Plan's income, with respect to each investment fund, is allocated based on the proportion that each Participant's account balance invested in such fund compared to the total of all Participants' account balances invested in such fund.

1. Description of the Plan (cont.)

Vesting

Participants are immediately and fully vested in their employee deferrals, Employer contributions, as well as any rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits equal to the vested value of the funds allocated to a Participant's account will be paid upon the Participant's death, disability, retirement, hardship, termination of the Plan, or termination of employment in a lump sum amount. Upon attainment of age 59½, Participants may request an in-service withdrawal. Participants may request hardship withdrawals in accordance with the rules in the Plan document. The Plan also allows for partial withdrawals for required minimum distributions. If a terminated Participant's balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of lump-sums, as designated by the Company.

Forfeitures

Forfeited accounts totaled \$3,276 and \$16,041 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited funds may be used to pay any administrative expenses or to reduce any Employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$14,246 of forfeited funds were used to pay Plan expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan does not allow loans to be taken from the Participant's fund accounts. The balance in notes receivable from Participants on the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 represent loans that were transferred into the Plan. The notes receivable from Participants are secured by the balance in the Participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest as defined by the Plan. Principal and interest payments occur ratably through regular payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years unless the notes receivable were used to purchase a primary residence.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan follows accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). The FASB sets accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income (Loss) Recognition

The investments of the Plan are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price).

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (cont.)

Investment Valuation and Income (Loss) Recognition

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Investment income (loss) is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan Participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Plan Expenses

Certain expenses for maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of distributions are taken out of the gross distribution to the Participant. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investment.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from Participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a Participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to Participants are recorded upon distribution.

3. Certified Information

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, John Hancock Life Insurance Company (U.S.A.) (John Hancock), the Custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024. Such information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by a qualified institution.

4. Fair Value Measurement

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs in which little or no market data exists (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under GAAP are described below:

Notes to Financial Statements

4. Fair Value Measurement (cont.)

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities;

Level 2 - Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly;

Level 3 - Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts - The fair value of the pooled separate accounts is based on the net asset value (NAV) of each account calculated by John Hancock and is based on the NAV of the underlying investments. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The Plan's investments at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 are made up entirely of a pooled separate accounts, which are measured at the NAV as a practical expedient. In accordance with GAAP, certain investments that were measured as such are not classified in the fair value hierarchy. The Plan has no assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023 that are classified in the fair value hierarchy.

The methodology described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan (pre-approved plan) sponsored by Pension Planners Northwest. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has opined and informed Pension Planners Northwest by a letter dated June 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, Participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts.

7. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the Company, and certain others. Certain Plan investments are managed by John Hancock, the custodian and recordkeeper for the Plan. Transactions with this entity qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The notes receivable from Participants are also defined by ERISA as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan's investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect Participants' account balances and amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2024, employee withholdings of \$219 were not remitted within the appropriate time period by the Company. The Company remitted the delinquent contributions of \$219 and the related lost earnings during 2025. These transactions constituted prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA.

10. SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the year ended December 31, 2024, and continues to evaluate the impact of the adoption and implementation of this legislation on the Plan. The application of SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements.
