Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the TMC HealthCare 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the TMC HealthCare (Company) 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a deferred arrangement covering all employees of the Company who have completed one hour of service. Employees are eligible for discretionary matching contributions after completing one hour of service. Employees are eligible for discretionary employer non-elective contributions (legacy contributions) if employed by the Company since January 31, 1996 and employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants may also make Roth contributions to the Plan. In addition, participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may make discretionary matching contributions on behalf of the participants. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, discretionary matching contributions were equal to 50% of each participant's deferral contribution up to a maximum of 6% of the participant's eligible compensation. The Company may also make discretionary non-elective contributions. The Company did not make any discretionary non-elective contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the Company's contributions, forfeitures and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, rollover contributions, legacy contributions, qualified non-elective contributions and qualified matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in discretionary matching contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after two years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or one-half of their vested account balance, but less than the highest outstanding balance on any note that participants have had for the twelve months prior, whichever is less. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest from 4.25% to 9.50%, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. The notes receivable must be repaid through payroll deductions over a period of no longer than five years unless the principal was used to purchase a primary residence, in which case, the principal may be repaid over a period of no longer than 20 years.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan allows certain administrative expenses to be paid from Plan assets. Administrative expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, included recordkeeping fees in the amount of \$416,082 and \$410,716, investment management fees of \$82,964 and \$49,994, and other fees of \$31,990 and \$-0-.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement or other reasons, a participant will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited non-vested account balances may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and/or reduce future employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,105,356 and \$716,013, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$173,587 and \$291,618, respectively, in reductions of employer matching contributions due to forfeitures. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, administrative expenses of \$118,365 and \$57,661, respectively, were paid from forfeitures.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net change includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' accounts balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

4. Income Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed plan management, by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. As of December 31, 2024, management is not aware of any uncertain tax positions that are potentially material. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. However, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

5. Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board has established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Common Trust Funds: is valued at net asset value based on the market value of the underlying investments.

Common stocks: are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following tables set forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investment assets:

10. Net Assets Available for Benefits Restatement

Net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2023 has been restated to reflect an employee contribution receivable in the amount of \$787,892 and an employer discretionary match contribution receivable in the amount of \$284,404. The contributions for the 2023 Plan year were deposited during the first month of the 2024 Plan year. As a result, net assets available for benefits has been increased by \$1,072,296 over the amount previously reported in the audited financial statements as of December 31, 2023.

11. SECURE 2.0 Act

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which included SECURE Act 2.0. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. Since SECURE Act 2.0 provisions include both required and optional elements, the plan administrator will determine the optional provision to elect and amend the Plan document accordingly. Most of the significant provisions will become effective in 2024 and thereafter. Accordingly, there is no material impact to the Plan's 2024 financial statements.

12. Subsequent Events

The Company was unaware of any subsequent events as of September 24, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
