Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Tryon Medical Partners 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Tryon Medical Partners 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Tryon Medical Partners, PLLC on September 1, 2018, and was most recently amended effective September 1, 2021. The Plan includes the following related employers, Tryon Direct, LLC and Tryon Management Group, LLC (collectively, with Tryon Medical Partners, PLLC, the “Practice”, “Employer”, or “Sponsor”). The Plan was established to provide benefits to eligible employees of the Practice as defined in the Plan document. The Plan is currently designed to be qualified under the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Administration: The 401(k) Benefits Plan Committee (the Committee) has been appointed to manage the operation and administration of the Plan, which serves without compensation. The Plan administrator has the overall responsibility and authority as the named fiduciary to manage and control the operations and administration of the Plan and may designate one or more individuals to perform those responsibilities. The Practice has outsourced the recordkeeping function of the Plan to Empower Trust Company, LLC (the “qualified institution”).

Participant Contributions: Participants may elect to have their eligible pre-tax or after-tax compensation (as Roth contributions or traditional after-tax compensation) contributed to the Plan up to the amount allowable under the Plan document and current income tax regulations. Participants who elect to contribute a portion of their compensation to the Plan agree to accept an equivalent reduction in taxable or taxed compensation. Contributions withheld are invested in accordance with the participant's direction. Employee contributions are recognized in the period in which they are deducted from the employee's pay. The Practice makes a safe harbor match of 100% of the first 4% of eligible compensation contributed by participants to the Plan.

Participants are also allowed to make rollover contributions of amounts received from other tax-qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans. Such contributions are deposited in the appropriate investment funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the Plan's provisions.

Employer Contributions: Each Plan year, the Employer will make a fixed nonelective contribution equal to 3% of eligible compensation for all participants, other than physician-owners. In order to receive the fixed nonelective contribution, the participant must be employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Plan also provides for a safe harbor Company match which requires the Company to make matching contributions to the account of each eligible employee equal to the sum off 100% of the first 4% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may, at its discretion, make additional profit sharing contributions to the Plan on an annual basis. The Company made \$1,102,188 in profit sharing contributions in 2024. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Retirement, Death, and Disability: A participant is entitled to 100% of his or her account balance upon retirement, death, or disability.

Catch-Up Contributions: Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up deferrals. The participant may defer an additional \$7,500 into the Plan as a pre-tax contribution subject to certain IRC limitations. Catch-up contributions are not eligible for matching contributions.

Vesting Requirements: Participants are immediately fully vested in their elective contributions, including catch-up contributions, rollover contributions, safe harbor match contributions and earnings thereon. For Employer nonelective contributions, a participant is 0% vested for the first three years and 100% vested thereafter. Employees hired by Tryon Medical Partners whose former Employer was Gaston Medical Partners with an original hire date prior to July 1, 2021 will have all prior service counted towards vesting requirements.

Forfeited Accounts: All forfeitures are held in a suspense account and may be used to reduce future Sponsor contributions or pay Plan expenses. The forfeiture account amounted to \$76,686 and \$43,813 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeitures of \$24,307 were used to pay Plan expenses during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, Plan earnings or losses, and an allocation of the Company's contribution, if any and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocation of the Company's contribution is based on participant contributions or eligible employee compensation, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account balance to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Payment of Benefits: Upon termination, the participants or beneficiaries may elect to leave their account balance in the Plan or receive their total benefits in a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. The Plan allows for the automatic lump sum distribution of participant vested account balances that do not exceed \$1,000. In certain circumstances, participants may make "hardship withdrawals" as defined in the Plan. Active participants may also take distributions from the Plan upon attainment of age 59½.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000. The maximum loan allowed under the Plan is equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance under the Plan. Loans are permitted for specific purposes as stated in the Plan document and terms range from one to five years. The loans are secured by the vested interest in the participant's account and bear interest rates from 4.25% to 9.50% with maturities through December 2029 as of December 31, 2024. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Plan recordkeeping and trustee fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income reported by the Plan.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosure. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity and credit risks, including global event risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

The following presents the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges (Level 1 inputs).

Self-directed Brokerage Accounts: Accounts primarily consist of common stock, preferred stock, corporate bonds, mutual funds, options and U.S. government securities that are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchange (Level 1 inputs).

Money Market Fund: Fair value is estimated to approximate the cost basis of the deposit account balance, based upon the liquidity of the account and the credit quality of the issuer. (Level 2 inputs). The Plan's investments in the money market deposit account occasionally exceed the federally insured balance.

Collective Trusts: The fair value of participation units held in collective trusts is based on the net asset values per unit as reported by the fund managers. The collective trust provides for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share, with no advance notice requirement.

NOTE 5 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company. The Plan utilizes a financial advisor and recordkeeper, Accelerate Investment Advisors, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, respectively, are service providers to the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also reflect party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 indicating that the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended from the original document, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC and that the Plan continues to be tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
