Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 (referred to as the “supplemental schedule”) is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Franklin Square Holdings, L.P. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan documents for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Franklin Square Holdings, L.P. (the “Company”) that have reached age 21. Interns and co-ops are excluded from participation in the Plan except those that have reached age 21 and have completed 1,000 Hours of Service during an Eligibility Computation Period. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

Contributions: Subject to certain limitations as outlined in the Plan, participants may elect to contribute from 1% to 70% of their eligible compensation, as defined, to the Plan on a pre-tax or after-tax basis. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company may make matching contributions (allocated based on participants’ contributions for the year) to the Plan. All active participants will be eligible to receive an employer matching contribution immediately, including Highly Compensated Employees. In addition, an active participant shall only be entitled to receive an employer matching contribution if the participant is employed on the last day of the plan year. The Company may also make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan. There were no discretionary contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations.

Funding Policy: The Company remits employee deferral contributions to the Plan on a semi-monthly basis, concurrent with payroll frequency, and company matching contributions to the Plan on an annual basis.

Rollovers: Rollovers represent transfers of account balances of certain participants’ contributions into certain investments of the Plan from other qualified plans or individual retirement accounts.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s elective and rollover contributions, the Company’s contributions and an allocation of plan investment earnings, and charged with withdrawals, distributions, fees and a share of plan investment gains and losses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Except as limited by applicable law, participants may change their investment options at any time.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus or minus actual earnings or losses thereon. Matching employer contributions, which includes Discretionary Matching Employer Contributions, shall vest on a 3-year cliff schedule.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures arising from non-vested company contributions and other sources are used first to pay the administrative expenses of the Plan and then to reduce the Company’s contributions for such plan year. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was approximately \$47,000 and \$73,000, respectively, of forfeited amounts. During 2024, approximately \$167,000 was used to reduce administrative expenses.

Notes from Participants: Participants may borrow from their vested accounts, not to exceed the lesser of (a) \$50,000 reduced by the excess (if any) of the highest outstanding balance of plan loans during the one-year period ending on the day before the loan is made over the outstanding balance of plan loans on the date the loan is made, or (b) one-half the present value of the participant’s vested interest in his account. The loans are collateralized by the vested

balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan Administrator. These rates range from 3.25% to 8.50% and mature through 2031.

All loans require the repayment of principal and interest to be amortized in level payments, not less than quarterly, over a period not extending beyond five years from the date of the loan, unless such loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, which may not extend beyond 10 years from the date of the loan.

Payment of Benefits:

A participant who separates from service before retirement, death or disability may request early payment of their vested benefits. Benefits are paid as soon as administratively feasible following the date on which a distribution is requested.

Participants, upon attainment of age 59 ½, may elect to receive in-service distributions. Benefits are payable in lump-sum payments.

Beginning January 1, 2025, the Portfolio Advisors LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, the profit sharing plan of the Company's subsidiary, merged into the Plan and all participants were enrolled into the Plan.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Participant Contributions: Participant contributions and related employer matching contributions are recognized in the Plan's financial statements in the period in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation while the related employer matching contributions are accrued in the Plan's financial statements at year-end.

Net Appreciation/Depreciation in Fair Value of Investments: The Plan presents, in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of its investments, which consists of the net realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation or depreciation on these investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses: The Plan generally pays certain administrative expenses which consist of plan administration, management and consulting fees. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

Notes from Participants: Notes from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid, interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Note 3. Information Certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Trustee”)

Certain information related to investments and notes from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information provided to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) Topic 820 defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a three-tier hierarchy that is used to identify assets and liabilities measured at fair value. The hierarchy focuses on the inputs used to measure fair value and requires that the lowest level input be used. The three levels defined in ASC Topic 820 are as follows:

- Level 1 – observable inputs based upon quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities within active markets.
- Level 2 – observable inputs other than Level 1 that are based upon quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, based upon quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities within inactive markets, or inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable through market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 – inputs that are unobservable for the particular asset or liability due to little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value of the asset or liability. These inputs reflect assumptions that market participants would use when valuing the particular asset or liability.

ASC Topic 820 requires the Plan to describe the methodologies used to measure the fair value of assets and liabilities. These methodologies were consistently applied to all assets and liabilities carried by the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan has described below, the methodology used to measure each major category of investment assets.

- Mutual funds are valued at the total market value of the underlying assets based on published market prices as of the close of the last day of the plan year. These values represent the net asset values of the shares held by the Plan and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.
- Self-directed brokerage account assets consist of shares in common stocks, mutual funds and a money market mutual fund. These assets are valued at quoted market prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The following table presents the fair value of investment assets as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 by type of asset and by the valuation hierarchy described above. The Plan had no assets that were classified as Level 2 or Level 3 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 6. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Fidelity Management Trust Company is the trustee of the Plan; therefore, transactions with the trustee qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company also paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan and these expenses are not reflected within the accompanying financial statements.

Note 7. Tax Status

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any uncertain positions that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by federal, state and/or local taxing authorities. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods currently in progress.

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the written form of the underlying pre-approved document is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code, and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
