We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of **Endicott College DC Retirement Plan**, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of **Endicott College DC Retirement Plan's** financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Endicott College DC Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan, adopted September 1, 1975, is a tax-favored retirement program. The Plan is intended to operate in accordance with Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Board of Trustees (the "Board") of Endicott College (the "College") is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Board and its investment advisors determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Plan is comprised of both a Voluntary Salary Reduction Program ("VSRP") and an Employer Matching Contribution Program ("EMCP"). The VSRP permits eligible employees to voluntarily defer a portion of their salary on a pre-tax basis. Employee salary deferrals made under the VSRP are not matched by employer contributions. The EMCP is a program whereby eligible employees may defer a portion of their salary to the Plan and the College will contribute that same percentage of the employee's salary to the Plan.

Eligibility: Full-time employees and part-time employees who work over 1,000 hours in a 12 consecutive month period using the date of hire for computing purposes, who have attained the age of 25, and completed and returned the required forms in a timely manner, are eligible to participate in the VSRP and EMCP part of the Plan after one full year of service. Years of service with any educational organization during the 12-consecutive month period immediately preceding the date of employment will count towards meeting the requirements. Any employee who has previously been enrolled in the Plan will be able to participate immediately upon hire.

Participants eligible for the EMCP are automatically enrolled at a rate of 2% of their compensation unless directed otherwise by the participant.

Contributions and Allocations: Plan participants receive an employer contribution from the College equal to 6% of their compensation under the VSRP. Under the EMCP, participants voluntarily contributing at least 2% of their compensation receive an additional College contribution of 2% of base pay (bonuses, overtime and stipends are excluded from the College's contributions), not to exceed the maximum annual contribution allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Participants contributing 1% of their compensation receive an additional College contribution of 1% of their base pay.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Upon enrollment, a participant may direct his or her contributions, the employer matching contributions, and income earned on those contributions into any combination of the investment options offered under the Plan.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (i) the College's contribution, if any and (ii) Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in all contributions plus earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or one-half of the participant's vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant notes fund. Loan terms range from one to five years or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' account and bear interest between 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are usually paid ratably.

Payment of Benefits: On termination of service, participants may elect to receive their distributions equal to the value of their account in a lump-sum amount or in a period of installments, subject to the terms and conditions of investment options selected, partial payments or annuity contract. In addition, participants may elect to roll their account into another qualified plan.

Plan Loans: Plan loans are available to participants through Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America ("TIAA") and College Retirement Equities Fund ("CREF") ("TIAA and CREF") (the "Custodian"), subject to certain limitations. Plan loans are issued directly from the funds owned by the Custodian and loan proceeds are not removed from a participant's account balance. However, a portion of a participant's TIAA Traditional Annuity account balance is reserved, or held in collateral, to cover the outstanding loan amount for the period of time the loan is outstanding. For active loans, investments equal to 110% of the outstanding loan amount are reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits and serve as collateral for the loan. Investments underlying defaulted loan balances are reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits until a distribution event occurs. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, outstanding Plan loans were \$101,580 and \$123,441, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, Plan loans in default were \$72,972 and \$73,518, respectively.

Revenue Credit Program Account: As part of their recordkeeping and administrative service fee arrangement, the Custodian agrees to reimburse revenue to the Plan in excess of agreed upon service fee structure. The revenue credit is reported net with administrative expenses on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. The Plan may use the credit to pay direct and necessary expenses of the Plan or allocate unused credit to eligible participants. The revenue credit program account balance was \$200,609 and \$134,021 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). The financial statements and supplementary schedule have been prepared to satisfy the reporting and disclosure requirements of ERISA.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative Expenses: Certain administrative expenses are paid from the participants' assets held in the Plan and other expenses are paid by the College. Expenses that are paid by the College are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Plan assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits: Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 3: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate it at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 4: TAX STATUS

The Plan is intended to comply with the applicable requirements of Section 403(b) of the IRC. A tax determination letter program is not yet available for IRC Section 403(b) plans through the IRS. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC and as such is exempt from federal income taxes.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 5: CERTIFICATION OF TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, TIAA and CREF certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at year end) are complete and accurate.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - inputs other than quoted market prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - inputs that are unobservable for the asset or liability.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Investment options available to participants include the TIAA Traditional Annuities, TIAA Real Estate pooled separate account, CREF Variable Annuities and select Vanguard mutual funds.

NOTE 6: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds and Variable Annuities: The fair value of shares of mutual funds and variable annuities are valued at the market quoted net asset value ("NAV"), except those held by the CREF Money Market Account, whose holdings are valued at amortized cost. Mutual funds and variable annuities offered by TIAA and CREF are generally redeemable daily. However, participants are locked out of an account for 90 days if a purchase, sale and repurchase within that account is made within a 60 day period. Some of TIAA and CREF's mutual fund offerings incur a 2% fee if redeemed in less than 60 days from purchase. Other mutual fund offerings are redeemable on a daily basis. Mutual funds and variable annuities are deemed to be actively traded.

Insurance Annuity Contract, Non Benefit-Responsive: The TIAA Traditional Annuity is reported at fair value which approximates contract value. The contract value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the Plan's contracts, and transfers, if any, less any withdrawals and transfers, if any.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The fair value of the pooled separate accounts has been estimated using the NAV per unit based on the underlying investments and audited financial statements. The NAV, as provided by the contract issuer, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the pooled separate account will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 7: INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan invests in unallocated guaranteed fixed annuity contracts with TIAA. As part of the contracts, the Insurance Company maintains a portion of the contributions in a “guaranteed account”, which is called the Traditional Annuity. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by the Insurance Company. The guaranteed minimum rate of interest is based on a formula established by the Insurance Company and is between 1% and 3%. Any additional interest is not guaranteed.

All Traditional Annuity individual annuity contracts are considered to be non-benefit responsive. These contracts are included in the financial statements at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering credit worthiness of the issuer. These contracts are subject to a 10-year withdrawal period. Upon termination of the contracts, the amount of each transfer payout annuity payment will be determined as of the annuity starting date for the transfer payout annuity by the amount of the Traditional Fixed Account accumulation and the interest rates in the rate schedules under which any premiums, additional amounts, and internal transfers were applied to the account.

NOTE 8: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of the fund managed by TIAA and CREF. TIAA and CREF is the Custodian as defined by the Plan and therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are covered by an exemption from the “prohibited transaction” provisions of ERISA and the IRC, as amended. Fees paid by the Plan to TIAA and CREF for the year ended December 31, 2024 were \$93,802.
