Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

### **Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental schedules of Schedule of Assets Held for Investment Purposes and Schedule of Reportable Transactions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedules is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

**1. Description of Plan**

The following description of RWLS Corporation Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – RWLS Holding Corporation, a Delaware corporation, (the Employer) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 2022. The Plan operates as a leveraged employee stock ownership plan (ESOP), and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan also includes a component for a profit-sharing plan (the Profit-Sharing Component) under Section 401(a) of the Code.

The Plan purchased Employer common stock using the proceeds of a note guaranteed by the Employer, and holds the common stock in a trust established under the Plan. The note is to be repaid over a period of 50 years by fully deductible Employer contributions to the trust fund. As the Employer makes each payment of principal, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the Internal Revenue Code.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Employer. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated under the provisions of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years ended, present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- 1) The accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (Allocated) and
- 2) Common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

Eligibility – All employees over age 21 are eligible for participation in the Plan after one year of service providing they worked at least 1,000 hours during such plan year. Participants who do not have at least 1,000 hours of service during such plan year or are not employed on the last working day of a plan year are generally not eligible for an allocation of Employer contributions for such year. Plan entry dates are on January 1<sup>st</sup> or July 1<sup>st</sup> coincident with or next following the satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. For rehired employees, who had satisfied the eligibility requirements before they terminated employment, they will become a participant immediately on the date they are rehired. Otherwise, they will be eligible when they meet the eligibility requirements noted above.

Contributions – The Employer is obligated to make contributions to the Plan which equals the amount necessary to enable the Plan to make its regularly scheduled payments of principal and interest due on its term loan. Employees are not permitted to make contributions.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment before becoming entitled to their full benefits under the Plan. Employer contributions and Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. Forfeitures of terminated non-vested account balances allocated to remaining participants were 1,209 and 2,382 shares during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts – The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Employer as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant's account based on the ratio of the participant's beginning of the year account balance to all participants' beginning of the year account balances.

Vesting – If a participant's employment with the Employer ends for any reason other than retirement, permanent disability or death, he or she will vest in the balances in his or her account based on total years of service with the Employer. Participants become fully vested after three years of service.

Put Option – Under federal income tax regulations, the Employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Employer buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The put option allows participants to elect to sell Employer stock to the Employer within 60 days after the Employer stock is distributed. If a participant does not elect to sell the Employer stock within the first 60-day period, they must wait to sell the Employer stock until the next 60-day period, which begins on the first day after the new determination of the fair market value of the Employer stock is made in the next Plan year. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification – Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Employer's stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of shares allocated to his or her account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify may elect to receive a cash distribution or may make a transfer of a portion of their account holding Employer stock to the 401(k) feature of the Plan.

Payment of Benefits – Distributions on account of death, disability, or retirement are made in a lump sum in the Plan year following the event. Distributions for other separations from service commence no later than the sixth plan year following the separation from service and are made in equal annual installments over a period of time not to exceed five years.

Under the provisions of the Plan, the Employer is obligated to repurchase participant shares which have been distributed under the terms of the Plan as long as the shares are not publicly traded or if the shares are subject to trading limitations.

## **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Certain amounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform with the presentation in the current year financial statements.

All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Employer.

## **3. Administration of Plan Assets**

The Plan's assets, which consist principally of Employer common stock, are held by the Trustee of the Plan.

Employer contributions are held and managed by the Trustee, which invests cash received, interest, and dividend income and makes distributions to participants. The Trustee also administers the payment of interest and principal on the loan, which is reimbursed to the Trustee through contributions as determined by the Employer.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Employer or its subsidiaries. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses for the Trustee's fees are paid directly by the Employer.

**5. Fair Value Measurements**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Employer Stock:* The common stock of RWLS Holding Corporation is not publicly traded on any stock market and is not quoted on any exchange. RWLS Holding Corporation does not make a market for its shares of common stock. The stock is valued by an independent appraiser annually as of December 31.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan's level 3 depreciated (realized and unrealized) during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 of \$3,450,250 and \$152,190,862, respectively, and is included in net investment depreciation from Employer Stock in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**6. Loan Payable**

During 2023, the Plan entered into a \$155,902,212 loan agreement with the Employer. The proceeds of the loan were used to purchase Sponsor Employer's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants when principal and interest payments are made. The number of shares released in any year is the number of shares held as collateral, multiplied by the ratio of the current year payments, divided by the total of this year's payments, plus all future year's principal and interest payments. This resulted in 21,711 and 57,293 of shares being released and allocated for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The agreement provides for the loan to be repaid over fifty years. The fair value of the note payable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$140,615,384 and \$142,182,688, respectively. The scheduled amortization of the loan for the next five years and thereafter is as follows: 2025 - \$1,625,921; 2026 - \$1,686,731; 2027 - \$1,749,814; 2028 - \$1,815,258; 2029 - \$1,883,148; and thereafter - \$131,854,512. The loan bears an interest rate of 3.74%.

**7. Tax Status**

During 2023, RWLS Holding Corporation adopted a new plan that includes Employee Stock Ownership Provisions. The Plan is a qualified plan under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, the Plan is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The Plan has adopted the "uncertain tax positions" provisions of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The primary tax position of the Plan is its filing status as a tax exempt entity. The Plan determined that it is more likely than not that its tax positions would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), or other State taxing authority. There were no penalties or interest recognized during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan is no longer subject to U.S. federal income tax examinations by federal taxing authorities for years before 2021.

**8. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

**9. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan's investments consist primarily of the Employer's common stock, which is exposed to various risks, including interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings and cash flows. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonable possible that changes in the value of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**10. Related-Party and Party in Interest Transactions**

The Plan invests in Employer common stock and has indebtedness guaranteed by the Employer. These are related party and party-in-interest transactions. As described in Notes 2 and, the Employer pays the expenses of the Plan. The Plan has a number of service providers. Such parties are parties-in-interest under ERISA.

**11. Subsequent Events**

The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available for issue.
