We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Northstar Recycling Company, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN:

The following description of the Northstar Recycling Company, LLC 401(k) Plan (“Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement or summary Plan description for a more complete description of the Plan provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, established January 1, 2011, which qualifies under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”), covering all employees of Northstar Recycling Company LLC, the Plan sponsor. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and all requirements of Sections 401(k) of the IRC. The Plan was amended and restated, effective March 1, 2022 to bring the Plan into compliance with the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) Notice 2017-37, cumulative list of changes in Plan qualification requirements for pre-approved defined contributions plans.

Effective January 26, 2023, employees of Sonoco Sustainability Solutions became eligible to participate in the Northstar Recycling Company, LLC 401(k) Plan. Sonoco Sustainability Solutions did not have a retirement plan, so no assets needed to be transferred.

Eligibility

Each employee who is at least 21 years of age following three months of service is eligible to participate in the Plan. Once eligibility requirements have been met, participants may enter the Plan on January 1st, April 1st, July 1st, or October 1st of each year. Collectively bargained, leased, interns, seasonal or temporary employees are excluded. Most employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan and will have elective deferral contributions made to the Plan in the amount of a 3% of eligible compensation unless the employee affirmatively elects not to participate in the Plan.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible compensation as defined in the Plan agreement, subject to certain limitations and Roth deferrals are allowed. The Plan provides for a safe-harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of a participant's elective deferral up to 4% of eligible compensation. Amounts allocated to participant's compensation as a percentage of total participant's contribution. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. In order to be eligible for the employer match, a participant must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the employer safe harbor was paid on a per payroll basis with a true up payment of \$46,226 and \$53,272 made in 2025 and 2024 for total employer safe harbor contributions of \$613,290 and \$547,269, respectively.

In addition, the Plan also provides for a discretionary non-elective contribution subject to certain eligibility requirements and is allocated in accordance with the Plan agreement. Management has determined that no discretionary non-elective contribution would be made for years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

Participant accounts

Participant accounts are credited with participant rollovers into the Plan, employee contributions, catch-up contributions for employees age 50 and over and employer safe harbor contributions and charged with certain administrative fees. Each participant's account is also be credited with an allocation of (a) any Company non-elective contribution, and (b) Plan earnings (losses).

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN: (CONTINUED)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are also 100% vested in the Company's safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Any Company additional discretionary contributions are subject to a 6 year vesting schedule as follows:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures occur when participants terminate employment before becoming fully vested in their benefits under the Plan. Forfeitures may be used to pay administrative expenses or reduce future employer contributions. The balance in the forfeiture account as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$-0- and \$4,036, respectively. Forfeitures of \$5,025 and \$-0-were used for expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Investment options

Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers an assortment of mutual funds and a fixed income account as investment options. Participants may change their investment allocation at any time.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may request loans from the vested portion of their accounts in any amount greater than \$1,000 but limited to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50% of their vested account balances. Loans are for a period not to exceed five years (except, longer terms are available for loans issued for the purchase of a principal residence). Such loans bear interest as determined by the Plan Administrator in accordance with the Plan agreement. Interest rates are 4.25%-9.50%. Such rate must be comparable, at the time of the loan, to that which would be charged by a bank or other professional lender granting loans under similar circumstances. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions in accordance with the terms set forth in the loan application. Upon termination of employment with the Company, any remaining payments are due immediately.

Payment of benefits

On termination of employment or termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or a direct rollover to an individual retirement account ("IRA") or other qualified plan.

Upon written request to the Plan Administrator, participants may request a financial hardship withdrawal from the vested portion of their account.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN: (CONTINUED)

SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 (the “Act”) was signed into law on December 29, 2022, to increase retirement savings, improve retirement rules, and lower employer costs of setting up a retirement plan. Plan amendments required by the Act generally need not to be made until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026, however, plans must operate in accordance with effective date of each new provision.

Major provisions of this Act that may effect the Plan include:

- Effective January 1, 2024, the limit for mandatory cash outs was raised from \$5,000 to \$7,000.
- Effective January 1, 2026, catch up contributions for any participants over age 50 who earn over \$145,000 are now required to be made on a Roth basis.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Basis of presentation

The financial statements for Northstar Recycling Company, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value with the exception of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts which are stated at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). Contract value reflects the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan and is the relevant measure for the portion of assets attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. All investments are participant directed.

The Plan administrator is responsible for determining the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the record keeper, investment advisors and the custodians. See Note 5 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair value, net unrealized appreciation or (depreciation) for the year is reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. The net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of its investments consists of realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Earnings on investments, with the exception of notes receivable from participants, are allocated on a pro rata basis to individual participant accounts based on the type of investment and the ratio of each participant’s individual account balance to the aggregate of participant balances. The portion of interest included in each loan payment made by a participant is recognized as interest income in the participant's individual account.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Since the participant's remaining vested investment balance is sufficient to cover the outstanding loan amount, there is no allowance for doubtful accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023. Interest is calculated and included in the repayment terms of the loan when the loan is initiated and is recognized with the amortization of the loan as each payment is remitted. Loans are monitored for repayment under the original loan terms and defaulted when active participants cease payments past the allowed grace period. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. For terminated participants, once a distribution is requested, the outstanding loan balance will be netted against the remaining vested investment balance.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment fund options through various regulated investment companies. These investments are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating expenses

All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company except certain investment management and transactional fees. Plan expenses related to the management of investments are paid by the Plan and are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

3. PLAN TERMINATION:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

4. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS:

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by Section 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("Empower"), the custodians of the Plan, certified to the Plan Administrator the fair value, contract value and physical custody of investments to be complete and accurate as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, investment transactions for the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and investments and notes receivable from participants included in the statements of net assets available for benefits, interest, dividends, and net appreciation in the fair value of investments included in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and the information contained in Notes 5 and 6 concerning investments and information included in the schedule of assets (held at end of year).

5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The Plan follows established guidelines for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. An asset or liability's classification within the hierarchy is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement. This hierarchy prioritizes the inputs into three broad levels as follows:

- Level 1 Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities. Market price is generally obtained from exchange or dealer markets.
- Level 2 Inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities. Inputs are obtained from various sources including market participants, dealers and brokers.
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity as they trade infrequently or not at all and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

6. GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT:

The Fixed Account is a guaranteed investment contract administered by Empower Annuity Company of America, an affiliate of Empower Retirement, through a group annuity contract and is considered a fully benefit responsive investment contract. The fund invests primarily in investment grade fixed income securities. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The fund is included in the financial statements at contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is established based upon the market interest rates and resets each quarter. The rate was 2.66% and 2.48% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures of spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

7. TAX STATUS:

The Plan and related trust are established under a standardized pre-approved prototype profit sharing plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC, which, in the opinion of the IRS by letter dated November 14, 2022, is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

For the year ended December 31, 2022, Plan management discovered a systematic error whereby the Plan incorrectly excluded bonus and floating holiday in the calculation of participant deferrals and employer discretionary matching contributions which is inconsistent with the Plan's definition of compensation. The Plan corrected the failure for the bonus and floating holiday for Plan year 2022 in August 2025. The correction of participant deferrals and employer discretionary matching contributions for the period January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 was \$19,353.

8. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS:

Certain Plan investments are shares of funds managed by Empower, the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid to Empower by the Plan for certain administrative services amounted to \$2,199 and \$1,060 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included in net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of the investments.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS:

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 12, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
