Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the US International Media 401(k) Plan (formerly Patriot Communications – US International Media Retirement Plan) (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The plan is a defined Contribution plan covering all employees of USIM (the “Company”). Prior to January 1, 2024, the Plan sponsor was Patriot Communications LLC, and the Plan covered all employees of Patriot Communications LLC, and U.S. International Media, LLC.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Company reorganized its structure and consolidated Patriot Communications, LLC and U.S. International Media, LLC into USIM. At that time, the Company adopted a restated adoption agreement and changed the Plan name from Patriot Communications – US International Media Retirement Plan to US International Media 401(k) Plan.

The Plan is intended to satisfy the requirements for a qualified retirement plan under the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) and similar state tax laws, and it is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan initially became effective on August 1, 1999.

Employees will become eligible to participate in the Plan after they have reached the age of 18 and have completed ninety days of service. Plan entry dates are on the first day of each month after satisfying eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, up to the IRC annual maximum. Such contributions may be pre-tax Elective Deferrals (as defined). In addition, participants may make after-tax Roth Contributions (as defined). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (“rollovers”). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The plan includes an auto-enrollment provisions whereby all eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions are invested in a plan designated default fund until changed by the participant.

The Plan allows for the Company to make discretionary matching contributions. The Company matched 25% of employees deferred compensation up to the first 4% of compensation contributed by the employee, resulting in a maximum employer contribution of 1%. Discretionary matching contributions are made on a per-payroll basis.

Note 1: Description of Plan (Continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) Plan earnings or losses, and (c) administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. The Company's matching contributions and earnings thereon will be vested in accordance with the following schedule:

Years of Service	Percentage
Less than 1	0%
1	40%
2	60%
3	80%
4 or more	100%

The vesting percentage for a participant who is an employee on or after the date the participant reaches normal retirement age (as defined by the Plan), will be 100% vested in employer contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account vested balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant account. All loans shall bear an interest rate equal to the prime rate plus 1%, which shall remain fixed throughout the duration of the loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Each participant may have one loan outstanding at a time. For participant loans that become delinquent, the amount of the unpaid loan principal plus any accrued unpaid interest will be treated as a deemed distribution. Deemed distributions are reported as a taxable distribution and remain part of the participant's account balance until a distributable event occurs.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Participants may also elect to rollover their account to another tax deferred account or remain in the Plan until they are legally required to begin taking distributions. All vested account balances not exceeding \$1,000 will be immediately distributed in a lump-sum payment. All vested account balances exceeding \$1,000, up to \$5,000, will be immediately rolled into another tax deferred account. With the Plan administrator's approval, participants may withdraw all or part of their aggregate contributions in the event of financial hardship. Active employees who attain age 59 1/2 are permitted to withdraw at any time any part of his or her vested account.

Note 2: Summary of Accounting Policies

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-allocated accounts totaled \$4,964 and \$859, respectively. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and may be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used to offset employer contributions or Plan expenses.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the plan have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. Under this basis, contributions are recorded when received, with expenses and benefit payments being recorded when paid. Although the modified cash basis of accounting represents a departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, it is an allowable method of accounting for employee benefit plans under the reporting requirements of ERISA.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income and dividend income are recorded on a cash basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowances for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent notes receivable that are deemed by the plan administrator to be in default are treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Deemed Distributions

Plan provisions provide that participants must repay note receivable balances upon termination from the Plan. Outstanding balances that are not repaid are treated as deemed distributions.

Plan Fees and Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Date of Management's Review

Events occurring after December 31, 2024 have been evaluated for possible adjustments to the financial statements or disclosures as of October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common collective trusts ("CCTs"): Units held in common collectives are valued using the daily net asset value ("NAV") practical expedient of the CCTs as reported by the CCTs managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CCTs, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient of a CCTs is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded

Pooled separate accounts ("PSAs"): PSAs are valued at the NAV based on units of the pooled separate accounts. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is generally based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the pooled separate account less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the pooled separate account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. The redemption frequency of the pooled separate accounts is daily, and there are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments related to the pooled separate accounts.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Investments held in self-directed brokerage accounts include corporate common stocks, registered investment companies, and interest-bearing cash. Corporate common stocks are valued at the daily closing price reported on active markets using observable inputs. Registered investment companies, which are publicly traded investment vehicles, are valued at their net asset value (NAV) as determined by the fund administrator based on quoted market prices in active markets. Interest-bearing cash primarily consists of money market funds, whose carrying values approximate fair value due to their short-term maturity. Given the nature and risks of these investments, the Plan has determined that presentation as a single investment class is appropriate.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the following tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

Note 4: Guaranteed Interest Contract

In 2015, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“Empower Insurance”) totaling \$1,237,701 and \$1,643,552 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Empower Insurance maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than zero percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Insurance, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

Note 5: Certified Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, both qualified institutions, have certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment information included in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 6: Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform investment or recordkeeping services for the Plan. The Plan also issues loans to participants, which are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions for which a statutory exemption exists.

Note 7: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the sponsoring Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in any employer contributions.

Note 8: Tax Status

The Plan is a prototype plan that is the subject of a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022. Although the Plan has been amended since its initial effective date, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles under the modified cash basis of accounting require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).
