As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Bell and Howell 401(k) Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Bell and Howell 401(k) Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Bell and Howell 401(k) Savings Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Bell and Howell 401(k) Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Bell and Howell 401(k) Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants in the Plan should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan became effective on September 12, 2011. It is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Bell and Howell, LLC (the "Company"). For regular employees, defined as one who normally renders or is scheduled to render personal services of at least 1,000 hours per year, there is no service requirement. For non-regular employees, there is a 1,000 hours or one year service requirement.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). Assets of the Plan are held by a plan trustee selected by the plan sponsor. The Company acts as the plan sponsor.

Contributions

Participants are automatically enrolled with a 3% before-tax deferral election once an employee becomes an eligible employee. Additionally, there is an automatic escalation feature of 1% before-tax deferral increase each year on the anniversary of entry into the Plan up to 6%. Participants' elected deferral, as a percentage of their compensation, is treated as a pre-tax employee contribution up to an annual Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") pre-tax maximum or 50% of their eligible pay, whichever is lower. Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to allow participants to contribute up to 75% of their eligible pay. Participants may also elect to defer a percentage of their compensation to be treated as a Roth employee contribution up to a maximum of 25% of their eligible pay. If a participant elects a Roth deferral, pre-tax deferral limits are reduced by the Roth deferral. Participants who obtain age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions, as defined in the plan document and subject to the IRS limitations. The Plan also permits rollover contributions from other qualifying retirement plans. Upon approval by the board of directors, the Company may make non-elective employer contributions. The Company did not make any non-elective contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants' Accounts

Employee contributions, employer contributions, and rollover contributions are maintained separately in each participant's account. Participants direct the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of any employer contributions, Plan earnings, and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account, based on the Plan's vesting schedule.

Vesting

Participants are fully vested immediately in all of their accounts upon enrollment into the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$217. Forfeited accounts may be allocated, as defined, among active participant accounts annually in order to reduce the employer match and may be used to offset administrative expenses.

Payment of Benefits

Generally, the participant becomes eligible to receive benefits on their normal retirement age (65), death, disability, termination of employment, as a qualified reservist, or reasons of proven financial hardship. Participants are also eligible to take in-service withdrawals once they attain age 59½. Participants receive their distributions as lump sum payments.

Hardship Withdrawals

Upon approval by the plan administrator, a participant may withdraw all or part of their elective contributions for immediate and severe financial need. In accordance with IRS regulations, the participant must exhaust all other assets available prior to obtaining the hardship withdrawal.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 from their fund accounts and up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000 reduced by an amount equal to the highest outstanding loan balance during the prior twelve months. Participants may have up to three loans outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and generally bear interest at a fixed rate based on the Prime Rate plus one percentage point (8.50% as of December 31, 2024) as determined on the day of the loan application. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Total notes receivable from participants were \$870,528 and \$925,074 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”) and are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Plan Expenses

Certain plan expenses are paid by the plan sponsor as provided by the plan document. Expenses related to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participants’ accounts.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Plan considers all invested cash balances to be cash equivalents.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All contributions and rollovers are invested at the direction of each participant in any combination of the investment funds offered. Investments in interest bearing cash and cash equivalents and mutual funds are valued at quoted market prices established in an active market which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. The fair value of the collective investment trust funds is based on the market value of all portfolio investments as determined by the trustee on the last business day of the Plan year.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized and unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of investments are allocated to the participant accounts based on participant holdings in each fund.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

3. Income Tax Status

The Plan is a qualified Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan that received a determination letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. Plan management believes the Plan is currently designed and operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

5. Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”), the trustee of the Plan, and was not subject to audit for the years ended December 31:

6. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

Level 1 Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority.

Level 2 Inputs are based on significant other observable inputs such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. The Plan uses Level 2 inputs when market prices are not attainable but other observable inputs are available to arrive at a fair value, and Level 3 inputs were only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There were no Level 2 or 3 investments in the Plan.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds and interest bearing cash and cash equivalents is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

7. Collective Investment Trust Funds

The Managed Income Portfolio Class II Fund (the “Fund”) invests in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions, fixed income securities and money market funds. Under the terms of the contracts, the assets of the Fund are invested in fixed income securities (which may include, but not limited to, U.S. Treasury and agency bonds, corporate bonds, mortgage-backed securities, commercial mortgage-backed securities, asset-backed securities, and collective investment vehicles and shares of investment companies that invest primarily in fixed income securities) and shares of money market funds. The Fund may also invest in futures contracts, option contracts, and swap agreements. Fidelity, as investment manager and trustee of the Fidelity Group Trust for Employee Benefit Plans, has claimed an exemption from registration under the Commodity Exchange Act and is not subject to registration or regulation under the Act. At the time of purchase, all contracts and securities purchased for the fund must satisfy the credit quality standards specified in the Declaration of Separate Fund.

The contracts and securities purchased for the Fund are backed solely by the financial resources of the issuers of such contracts and securities. An investment in the Fund is not insured or guaranteed by the managers, the plan sponsor, the trustee, the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or any other government agency. The contracts purchased by the Fund permit the Fund to account for the fixed income securities at book value (principal plus interest accrued to date). Through the use of book value accounting, there is no immediate recognition of investment gains and losses on the Fund’s securities. Instead, gains and losses are recognized over time by periodically adjusting the interest rate credited to the Fund under the contracts. However, while the Fund seeks to preserve principal investments, it is possible to lose money by investing in this Fund. The contracts provide for the payment of certain withdrawals and exchanges at book value during the terms of the contracts. In order to maintain the contracts subject the Fund and its participants to certain restrictions.

Trust units may be redeemed on a daily basis to meet benefit payments and other participant-initiated withdrawals. The Plan is required to provide 12 months written notice prior to redemption of trust units.

The Prudential Core Plus Bond Fund Class 5 is a collective investment trust fund managed by PGIM Fixed Income. It invests primarily in fixed income securities in the U.S. investment grade sectors, as well as U.S. fixed income securities below investment grade, the debt of developed international markets, and the debt of emerging markets.

The Fidelity Freedom Commingled Pool Class B Funds are collective investment trust funds managed by Fidelity Institutional Asset Management Trust Company. These funds invest primarily in a combination of Fidelity U.S. equity, non-U.S. equity, bond, and short-term pools and funds and seek high total return until their target retirement date.

8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the trustee and other parties-in-interest for contract administration, advisory and investment management services amounted to \$105,296 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also holds notes receivable from participants. As a result, these notes receivable and all related transactions were with a party-in-interest. All of these transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities as directed by its participants. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

11. Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through September 12, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

In December 2022, Congress passed the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2022 (“SECURE Act 2.0”) that continued the retirement system reform previously passed in 2020. Certain provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act are effective at various dates through 2026, with the plan amendment for the adoption of SECURE 2.0 Act due by December 31, 2026. Of the optional SECURE Act 2.0 provisions, the Plan elected to permit withdrawals for qualified birth or adoption, emergency expenses, federally declared disasters, and domestic abuse effective January 1, 2025.
