Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Postretirement Welfare Benefits Plan for Employees of Young Brothers, Limited, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and of plan benefit obligations as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and of changes in plan benefit obligations for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Postretirement Welfare Benefits Plan for Employees of Young Brothers, Limited's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Restatement of Previously Issued Consolidated Financial Statements

As discussed in Note 2 to the financial statements, the financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, have been restated to correct a misstatement. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Postretirement Welfare Benefits Plan for Employees of Young Brothers, Limited, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Postretirement Welfare Benefits Plan for Employees of Young Brothers, Limited's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Postretirement Welfare Benefits Plan for Employees of Young Brothers, Limited (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – Young Brothers, Limited (the Company), provides postretirement health and group life insurance benefits to eligible employees under the Plan by paying premiums to purchase insurance coverage through various group contracts and by paying Medicare reimbursements.

Eligibility – An employee of the Company who retires after qualifying for a pension benefit on the date of termination under either the Young Brothers, Limited Pension Plan (BU Employee) or the Young Brothers, Limited Salaried Pension Plan (NBU Employee) is eligible for postretirement benefits under this Plan. Only BU Employees are eligible for postretirement health benefits. BU and NBU Employees are eligible for postretirement group life insurance benefits.

Eligibility for health benefits for a BU Employee's spouse depends upon the retirement date of the retired BU Employee. Spousal eligibility extends only to a spouse who is married to the eligible BU Employee on the retirement date of the eligible BU Employee. If an eligible retired BU Employee gets divorced, the ex-spouse and any subsequent spouse are not eligible for benefits under this Plan. Coverage continues for the life of the eligible retired BU Employee and his/her eligible spouse. The spouse of a BU Employee who retired after December 31, 1991, is eligible for health benefits provided such spouse is ineligible for comparable coverage under a plan of another employer.

Benefits

Health – The Plan provides postretirement health benefits by paying premiums or a percentage of the premiums to purchase insurance coverage through various group contracts. The percentage of the premiums paid under this Plan depends on the retirement date of the eligible, retired BU Employee and the number of years of service such eligible, retired BU Employee has accrued upon retirement. Benefits are fully insured and payments for covered claims are payable by the insurers issuing the group contracts and are not paid by the Plan.

Health benefits offered under this Plan include one or more of the following: comprehensive medical benefits, including hospitalization, drug and vision benefits. The availability of the different types of health benefits depends on the retirement date of the eligible, retired BU Employee.

Effective December 1994, the Plan was amended for eligible BU Employees who retire on or after January 1, 1995, and for their eligible spouses. When such an eligible, retired BU Employee or related eligible spouse reaches age 65 and becomes eligible for Medicare, the comprehensive medical group contracts offered under the Plan change to group contracts that are supplemental to Medicare. In addition, for eligible BU Employees who retire on or after January 1, 1995, the percentage of premiums paid under the Plan depends on the number of years of service the eligible BU Employee has accrued upon retirement. The Plan pays 100% of health benefit premiums for an eligible BU Employee and eligible spouse retiring on or after January 1, 1995, with at least ten years of service as of December 31, 1996. The Plan pays 100% of the health benefit premiums for an eligible BU Employee and spouse who retired prior to January 1, 1995. For the remaining retirees, the percent of premiums paid for by the eligible participant or spouse, depends on their length of service. Medicare Part B premium reimbursements to eligible plan participants are currently made on a monthly basis by the Plan. Effective December 7, 2023, the date a memorandum of agreement was signed by the Company and the Collective Bargaining Unit, retroactive to July 1, 2022, the reimbursement covers the full premium. Previously, the reimbursement was a \$24.80 per person per month stipend.

Life – The Plan also provides postretirement group life insurance benefits for eligible retired BU and NBU Employees by paying premiums to purchase life insurance coverage through group contracts. Spouses of eligible, retired BU and NBU Employees are not eligible for group life insurance benefits under the Plan. The amount of death benefit depends on the date of retirement of the eligible retired BU Employees and the age at which the eligible retired BU Employee dies. For eligible, retired NBU Employees, the death benefit is 50% of annual compensation for Retirement Plan purposes in the year of retirement to a maximum death benefit of \$12,500. Benefits are fully insured and are paid by the insurer issuing the group contracts and are not an expense of the Plan.

Contributions and Funding

The Young Brothers, Limited Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association Trust for Bargaining Unit Employees (BU VEBA) is the primary funding vehicle for the Plan. There are no employee contributions. Retirees may be required to fund their portion of premium expenses. The Company is not required to make any contributions to fund its obligations under this Plan. The benefits offered under this Plan may remain partially or completely unfunded. However, the Company intends to fund the cost of the anticipated future premiums for the group contracts and a portion of the anticipated Medicare Part B payments by making contributions. Monthly insurance premium payments are initially paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan, and subsequently reimbursed to the Company by the BU VEBA, to the extent the benefit is for BU participants or their beneficiaries. Any amounts due to the Company at December 31 are reported as accrued liabilities on the statement of net assets available for benefits.

During the year ended December 31, 2013, the Company elected to terminate the Young Brothers, Limited Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association Trust for Nonbargaining Unit Employees (NBU VEBA). Upon termination, benefits provided to the eligible NBU VEBA participants did not change. The Plan's sponsor intends to directly fund the cost of the anticipated future premiums for the group contracts for NBU participants on a pay-as-you-go basis.

Administrative expenses – Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by either the Plan or the Plan's sponsor, as provided in the Plan document.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 2 – Restatement of Previously Issued 2023 Financial Statements

During 2024, the Plan has restated the accompanying financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2023, along with certain footnotes to the restated financial statements. During 2024, the Plan determined certain 2023 benefit obligations were misstated due to renegotiations of Medicare Part B benefits with the collective bargaining unit. The resulting impact have been restated in the accompanying financial statements and footnotes.

The nature and impact of this adjustment on the Plan's previously issued 2023 financial statements is summarized in the table below. Impacted amounts and associated disclosures are restated within the accompanying notes to the financial statements.

Note 3 – Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements, and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – The investments are stated at fair value. The Plan's trustee, The Bank of New York Mellon, certifies the fair value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation or depreciation of those investments.

Payment of benefits – Premiums paid by either the Company or the BU VEBA trust are recorded as premium expense and Medicare Part B premium reimbursements to participants in the accompanying

statement of changes in net assets available for benefits when paid. As of December 31, 2024, and 2023, the Medicare Part B premium reimbursements not yet paid totaled \$409,124 and \$238,238 respectively.

Postretirement benefits – The amount reported as the postretirement benefit obligation represents the actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed to employees' service rendered to the date of the financial statements. Postretirement benefits include future premiums expected to be paid for, or reimbursements expected to be paid to, currently retired employees and their beneficiaries, and active employees and their beneficiaries, after retirement from service with the Company. The postretirement benefit obligation represents the amount that is to be funded by contributions from the Company and from existing plan assets. Prior to an active employee's full eligibility date, the postretirement benefit obligation is the portion of the expected postretirement benefit obligation that is attributed to that employee's service rendered to the valuation date.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligation is determined by an actuary and is the amount that results in applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims-cost data to estimate future annual incurred claims costs per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The foregoing assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. If the Plan were to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of the postretirement benefit obligations.

The health care cost trend rate assumptions have a significant effect on the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements. If the assumed rates increase by one percentage point in each year, the postretirement benefit obligation as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, would increase by approximately \$6.320 million, \$3.608 million, and \$3.555 million, respectively.

The changes in actuarial assumptions reported in the statement of changes in plan benefit obligations are due to the increase in discount rate from 5.27% to 5.72%, an update to the per capita claims cost assumption, which were updated based on actual 2024 medical premiums, updates to the retiree spousal medical coverage election percentage assumption and an update to the medical trend rate assumption.

Expenses – The Plan's expenses are paid by the Plan or the Company, as specified in the Plan document. Expenses that are paid by the Company, unless reimbursed by the Plan, are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the

Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are deducted from investment earnings, as disclosed in the investment prospectus, and thus are not separately disclosed in the accompanying financial statements.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4 – Plan Termination

The Plan was adopted with the expectation that it will continue, but the continuation of the Plan and the benefits provided under the Plan, and the payment of any contribution thereunder, is not assumed as a contractual obligation by the Company. The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan or discontinue the benefits offered under the Plan at any time. Upon the termination of the Plan by the Company, assets of the Plan would be applied in accordance with the provisions of the BU VEBA.

On December 3, 2013, the Company elected to terminate the NBU VEBA Trust. The termination was effective at such date when the NBU VEBA Trust exhausted its assets, which occurred during the year ended December 31, 2014.

Note 5 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds) – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Collective trusts – Units held in collective trusts (CTs) are valued at the NAV determined by the daily closing price as reported by the portfolio of securities and other assets held by the fund.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 6 – Certified Investment Information

The following information related to investments was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by The Bank of New York Mellon, a qualified institution:

- Investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment information reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and in the schedule of reportable transactions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 7 – Tax Status

On November 29, 2000, the Internal Revenue Service issued an exemption letter on the qualification of the Plan under Section 501(a) of the Code. Therefore, the Plan's trust is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c) of the Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the exemption letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible, that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The actuarial present value of benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, health care inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

Note 9 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Company makes premium payments based on broker invoices and the Plan reimburses the Company.

Note 10 – Medicare Part D

The Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement and Modernization Act of 2003 (the Act) introduced a prescription drug benefit under Medicare as well as a federal subsidy to Plan sponsors that provide a benefit that is at least actuarially equivalent to Medicare Part D. The Plan's postretirement benefit obligation does not reflect an amount associated with the Medicare subsidy under the act because the Plan is not directly entitled to the Medicare subsidy. Should the Company include the effects of the Medicare subsidy in measuring its postretirement benefit obligation, the Plan's postretirement benefit obligation will differ from that of the Company.

Note 11 – Reconciliation to Form 5500

The Form 5500 has certain classifications of assets and income that differ from amounts shown on the accompanying financial statements. These differences relate to classification only and have no effect upon net assets available for benefits for either period.
