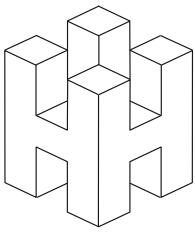

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of DANA F. COLE & COMPANY, LLP 401(k) RETIREMENT PLAN, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Dana F. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Dana F. Cole & Company, LLP 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of Dana F. Cole & Company, LLP (the Employer) who are age twenty-one or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum percentage of compensation and dollar amount permissible under the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6 percent of eligible compensation (increasing by 1% each year to a maximum of 10%) and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. The employers' contribution to the Plan is determined by the employer and is discretionary.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the employer's discretionary matching contributions, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings, and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, rollovers, and the earnings thereon. Vesting in the employers' contribution portion of their accounts is based on continuous years of service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their participant account balance, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time the funds are borrowed as determined by the trustee. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits - Upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of service, a participant (or participant's beneficiary in the event of death) may elect to receive their vested benefits in either a lump-sum distribution or installment payments.

Recent Legislative Update - On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was signed into law, which includes the package of retirement provisions referred to as "SECURE 2.0". These provisions continue the themes and reforms introduced with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on increasing participation in the retirement system and facilitating the accumulation of more assets. These changes have various effective dates starting in 2023 and forward. Since the provisions include both required and optional elements, the Plan administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect.

Note 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Plan follows accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board, commonly referred to as the FASB. The FASB sets generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) that the Plan follows to ensure we consistently report our net assets, and changes in net assets available for benefits. References to GAAP issued by the FASB in these footnotes are to the FASB *Accounting Standards Codification*, sometimes referred to as the Codification or ASC.

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan.

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties - The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Note 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(Cont.) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments is based on the fair value of investments at the beginning of the year, or cost, if purchased during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Deferrals Due to Participants - Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed any 2024 excess contributions, to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the plan sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Plan paid administrative expenses totaling \$41,836 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 3 - INVESTMENTS (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator has obtained certifications from Principal Life Insurance Company, the trustee of the Plan that all of the information is complete and accurate. Information included in the accompanying financial statements as to investments, investment income, and all information in the supplemental schedule is presented in reliance solely upon those certifications.

The levels of inputs used are as follows:

- Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 - Inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly such as outside comparable sales.
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

(Cont.) The assets or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no material changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: (PSA) Fair value of the PSA is measured using quoted prices of underlying assets of the fund. Trading price for all trusts are available to current investors on the Employer website and are deemed to have a readily determinable fair value.

Stable Value Collective Investment Trusts: (CIT) Fair value of the CIT is based on contract value for which a portion of the net assets are attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Trading price for all trusts are available to current investors and are deemed to have a readily determinable fair value.

Note 3 - INVESTMENTS (UNAUDITED)

(Cont.) Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets for the period above are reported in investment income in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 4 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their account balances.

Note 5 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES IN INTEREST

The Plan pays several vendors for record keeping, administrative services, claims processing, custodianship of its investments, benefit consulting services, legal services, and audit services. Transactions with the providers of these services would be considered to be transactions with parties in interest. Further, the Plan receives contributions from the participants' employer, and those contributions would also constitute transactions with parties in interest.

Note 6 - FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The administrator has concluded that any uncertain tax positions would be immaterial to the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not include any provision for uncertain tax positions, and no related interest or penalties have been recorded in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits or accrued in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 7 - TERMINATED PARTICIPANTS

Account balances allocated to terminated participants that had not been paid as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled \$1,669,426 and \$1,934,142, respectively. These amounts represent the vested account balances of terminated participants that had not yet been paid as of year end. For financial statement purposes, these amounts are included in net assets available for benefits.

Note 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In preparing the financial statements, the Plan has evaluated all subsequent events, for potential recognition or disclosure, through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
