Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Kentucky Primary Care Association Health Plan of the Kentucky Primary Care Association Health and Benefits Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations for the year then ended and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Description of Plan

General

The Kentucky Primary Care Association Health Plan of the Kentucky Primary Care Association Health and Benefits Trust (the Plan) was established on October 1, 2016 (initially funded February, 2017) for certain employers who subscribe to the plans of the trust (Subscribing Employers). The related plans provide medical, dental, accidental death and dismemberment and group life insurance benefits for participating employees of participating Employers and are facilitated by UMR (DBA Administrative Services Group), Contract Administrator. Participating Employers adopt individual welfare plans at the member level and the trust is filed as a group insurance arrangement as defined in the applicable sections of Department of Labor (DOL) regulations. All benefits are paid directly by the insurance companies.

Participants should refer to the applicable *Summary Plan Description* pamphlet and their participation agreement for a more complete description of their respective plan. The individual plans are subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Benefits

The Plan provides health benefits (medical, vision, dental) and disability benefits. The Plan does not cover retired employees. The Plan also provides certain benefits upon termination of employment through the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (COBRA).

Insured Benefits

The Plan fully insures all health and disability benefits. All insurance premium payments are made from Plan assets.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Contributions

Premiums due from Subscribing Employers are billed in advance and recorded as receivables until collected and as unearned employer remittances until the related insurance coverage becomes effective. In addition to the required contributions to purchase fully insured benefits and pay for contract administrative fees, the Plan (beginning in 2019) requires an additional contribution calculated as 0.50% of the health premiums. This additional contribution is used to pay for other administrative costs such as audit fees, bank fees, and fiduciary insurance.

Benefit Obligations

Health costs incurred by participants and their dependents are covered by insurance contracts maintained by the Trust. Benefit obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023 represented premiums due to the insurance companies to continue the benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchased and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as sold during the year.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and benefit obligations. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 5, 2025, the date the combined financial statements were available to be issued.

Recent Accounting pronouncements

In June 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) No. 2016-13, Financial Instruments - Credit Losses (Topic 326), which is effective for the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. This new standard provides financial statement users with more decision-useful information about the expected credit losses on financial instruments and other commitments to extend credit held by a reporting entity at each reporting date. The standard replaced the incurred loss impairment model with a methodology that reflects expected credit losses and requires consideration of a broader range of reasonable and supportable information to inform credit loss estimates. The standard had no material impact on the Plan's financial statements.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Money Market Funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. Money market funds below determine fair value using a calculated net asset per share, or its equivalent.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no unfunded commitments related to these investments. These investments can be redeemed daily with no redemption notice required.

5. Related Parties

UMR, DBA Administrative Services Group, the Contract Administrator, facilitates the collection of premium remittances to the Trust and remits the insurance premiums to the respective insurance companies or their agents; pays or provides for the payment of the Plan itself for all reasonable and necessary expenses of establishment, installation and administration of the Plan; conducts all transactions with the insurance companies or the service contractors or their agents relative to the execution and administration of the insurance or service contracts; and establishes the rules for the administration of the affairs of the Plan. The Contract Administrator is compensated for services by administrative fees based on the number of participating employees of each Subscribing Employer and by other fees charged periodically for services rendered. Administrative fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$169,685 and \$144,045 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Amounts due to the Contract Administrator as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$9,650 and \$0 respectively.

6. Income Tax Status

The Trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets qualifies as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Internal Revenue Service has made a favorable determination in a letter dated August 27, 2019 that the Plan meets the requirements of IRC Section 501(c)(9) and is, therefore, exempt from federal income taxes under IRC Section 501(9).

The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status. The Contract Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirement of the Code and, therefore, believes the related Plan is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosures in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Termination of the Trust

If the Trust were to terminate, the Contract Administrator would be required to use available funds to (1) pay or provide for the payment of all insurance premiums, service contract fees and other charges required to be paid pursuant to the insurance and/or service contracts (2) pay or provide for payment of all reasonable and necessary expenses in connection with or arising out of the establishment, installation and administration of the Trust, and (3) apply any balance to such other purposes as shall best effectuate the purposes of the Trust.
