NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Environmental Management Services 401 (k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the plan's provision.

General

The plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees. The plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. All regular full-time and part-time employees of EMSI, Inc. who have attained age 18 and a year of service requirement are eligible to participate in the deferral portion of the plan and employer match if any. Entry dates are January 1 or six months later, coincident with or next following satisfaction of the eligibility requirement.

Contributions

Each Year participants may contribute up to 100% of their compensation not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$23,000 for 2024. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The employer will make a matching contribution equal to 25% of participant elective deferrals up to 4%. The employer may also make at its sole discretion a non-elective employer contribution. An employee must be employed on the last day of plan year and work a minimum of 1000 hours of service to share in the employer contribution.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. The plan currently offers various mutual funds as options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's elective deferrals and allocations of (a) the Company contributions and, (b) Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on each participant's earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the company's non-elective and matching contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service under the following:

Forfeitures

As of December 31, 2024, and 2023 forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and administrative expenses. Also in 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$7,934 from forfeited accounts.

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow up to maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as participant directed investments. Loan terms range from one to five years. Loan terms may exceed five years only in the event the loan proceeds are used to purchase or construct the participant's principal residence. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with prevailing prime rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, purchase of an annuity, or payment in equal installments. The distributable amount is equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Employees who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses but do not share in subsequent allocations of discretionary contributions.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Excess Contribution Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contribution to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investments related expenses are included in net appreciation/(depreciation) of the fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103 (a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-08 for the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Reliance Trust Company, a qualified Institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete accurate:

- (a) Investments and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023;
- (b) Total investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024; and
- (c) All information included in the schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as shown in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment included in the financial statements and ERISA-related supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6. NONPARTICIPANTS-DIRECTED INVESTMENTS

The Plan's participants direct all investments. There are no non-participant directed investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 7. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by the trustee Reliance Trust Company. Reliance Trust Company is the trustee for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

NOTE 8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, EMSI, Inc. has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contribution.

NOTE 9. PLAN AMENDMENT AND TAX STATUS

The IRS determined and informed the Company that the Plan and related trust are designated in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Custodian believes that the Plan is currently designed operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) and is tax-exempt as of December 31, 2024.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has an uncertain position that more than likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2020.

NOTE 10. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
