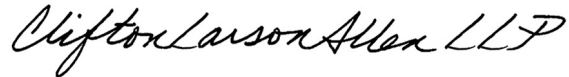

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. (the Company) established the Plan effective February 1, 1975. The Plan was last restated and amended effective January 1, 2024. The Plan is a defined contribution plan intended to constitute an employee stock ownership plan (ESOP) and is designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan covers all employees of the Company and participating affiliates who have completed the eligibility requirements including the completion of one year of service (complete at least 1,000 hours of service) and attainment of age 18. Eligible participants enter the Plan on the first day of each plan year quarter following the completion of the eligibility requirements. Effective January 1, 2024, new hires who are expected to complete 1,000 or more hours of service in their first year of employment will become participants retroactive to their date of hire if they are employed on December 31 of the Plan year in which they begin employment. New hires who are not expected to complete 1,000 hours of service in their first twelve months of employment do not become Participants unless they complete 1,000 hours of service in their first 12 months of employment or in a subsequent Plan Year. Such an individual becomes a Participant as of January 1 of the Plan Year in which they complete the service requirement. The Plan is designed to invest primarily in securities issued by the Company and is authorized to borrow money for such investments. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Plan purchased Company common stock using the proceeds of notes payable to the Company and holds the stock in a trust established under the Plan (see Note 6). As the Plan makes debt payments, an appropriate percentage of stock will be allocated to eligible employees' accounts in accordance with applicable regulations under the IRC.

The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the ESOP. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to:

- (a) the accounts of employees with vested rights in allocated common stock (Allocated) and
- (b) common stock not yet allocated to employees (Unallocated).

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Contributions

Each year, the Company may contribute to the Plan up to 25% of covered compensation as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions may be in the form of shares of common stock or cash. Contributions for each year are never less than the amount required to enable the Plan to discharge its current obligations, without regard to whether some or all of such contribution may fail to qualify for an income tax deduction by the Company. In order to receive an allocation of Company contributions, a participant must complete 1,000 hours of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year unless termination is due to death, disability or retirement. Contributions by Plan participants are not permitted by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant's account is credited as of the last day of each plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company's common stock released by the Trustee from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant's eligible compensation, relative to total eligible compensation, as defined. Plan earnings or losses are allocated based on each participant's share of the investment at the beginning of the year, less distributions and withdrawals during the year. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's account.

Vesting

Vesting of participant's accounts is based on years of credited service with the Company. A participant's account becomes fully vested after the completion of six years of credited service with the Company, under a graded vesting schedule. A participant is fully vested upon reaching normal retirement age, death, or permanent disability.

Voting Rights

Each participant is entitled to exercise voting rights attributable to the shares allocated to their account and is notified by the Trustee prior to the time that such rights are to be exercised. The Trustee is not permitted to vote any allocated share for which instructions have not been given by a participant. The trustee is required, however, to vote any unallocated shares on behalf of the collective best interest of Plan participants and beneficiaries.

Put Option

Under federal income tax regulations, the Company stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase with interest over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation service in the Plan may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six-year period. In each of the first five years, a participant may diversify up to 25% of the number of post-1986 shares allocated to their account, less any shares previously diversified. In the sixth year, the percentage changes to 50%. Participants who elect to diversify receive a cash distribution.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions from the Plan will be made in the form of a lump sum or installment after a participant retires, dies, or becomes disabled in the year following termination. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize a lump-sum payment without the participant's consent. Prior to 2024, if the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. Effective in 2024, if the balance of the terminated participant's account is between \$1,000 and \$7,000, the Plan Sponsor may authorize that the benefit payment be rolled into an individual retirement account in the participant's name. If the vested balance of the terminated participant's account does not exceed \$25,000, the value will be paid in one lump-sum payment. For accounts greater than \$25,000, the distribution will be made in substantially equal annual installments over a period of five years. The Plan also allows participants whose employment is terminated on or after reaching the age of 60 and their Company Stock allocated to the vested portion of the participant's account balance has been divested, then the distribution of the participant's account balance may be paid, at the election of the participant, either as five-year annual installments or a lump sum payment.

Forfeited Accounts

Plan forfeitures are allocated to each participant's account based upon the relation of the participant's compensation to total compensation for the Plan year. Forfeitures of terminated nonvested account balances allocated to remaining participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$30,810 and \$60,164, respectively. There were no balances in forfeited nonvested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Allocations

The financial statements of the Plan present separately the assets and liabilities and changes therein pertaining to (a) the accounts of employees with rights in allocated stock (allocated) and (b) stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The shares of Company common stock are valued at estimated fair value. The other investments are valued at fair value. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recorded on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expense.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 5, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 INVESTMENTS

The Plan's initial investment in Company securities consisted of 46,417 shares of the outstanding common stock of St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. The shares were acquired on December 31, 2013 for \$25.22 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at that time. On August 1, 2014, the Plan purchased the remaining shares of St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc., 3,583 shares for \$125.00 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at that time. On December 31, 2019, St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. redeemed 10,960 shares of common stock. The Plan subsequently purchased the 10,960 shares of common stock from St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. on December 31, 2019 for \$404.00 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at that time. On December 28, 2022, St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. redeemed 13,865 shares of common stock. The Plan subsequently purchased the 13,865 shares of common stock from St. Cloud Industrial Products, Inc. on December 28, 2022 for \$450.00 per share, which was the estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal, at that time. The estimated fair market value, as determined by independent appraisal as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$711.14 and \$565.64 per share, respectively.

During 2024 and 2023, 1,369 and 1,369 shares, respectively, were released and allocated to participants.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Company Common Stock: The fair value of the Company common stock held by the Plan is valued at fair value based on an independent third-party appraisal. This appraisal is based upon a combination of the market and income valuation techniques. The appraiser took into account historical and projected cash flow and net income, return on assets, return on equity, market comparables and estimated fair value of Company assets and liabilities.

Money Market Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund which is \$1.00.

On August 1, 2014, the Plan entered into a \$447,899 term loan agreement with the Company. On December 31, 2019, the Plan entered into a \$4,427,840 term loan agreement with the Company. On December 28, 2022, the Plan entered into a \$6,239,616 term loan agreement with the Company. The proceeds of the loans were used to purchase the Company's common stock. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loans. Shares are released from collateral and allocated to participants as payments of principal and interest are made.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

The Company reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to Plan provisions. Upon such termination of the Plan, the interest of each participant in the trust fund will be distributed to such participant or his or her beneficiary at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Plan administrator shall direct the Trustee to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund and to sell shares of financed stock held in the loan suspense account to the extent it determines such a sale to be necessary in order to repay the loan. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company, by a letter dated September 18, 2013, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan investments consist primarily of the Company's common stock, which is exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows and/or other such techniques. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment in the common stock and to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumption process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's assets, which consist primarily of Company common shares, are held by the trustee of the Plan. Company contributions are held and managed by the Trustee, which invests cash received, interest and dividends income and makes distributions to participants. The Trustee also administers the payment of interest and principal on the loan.

The Plan is administered by the Company and certain administrative functions are outsourced to a third-party administrator. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.
