Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Libertana Health Services 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Libertana Health Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan's adoption agreement (the Adoption Agreement) for more complete information on the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established effective January 1, 2018 covering substantially all employees of JSI Acquisition, Inc. dba Libertana Home Health of Sherman Oaks (the Company) and its Affiliated Companies. Affiliated Companies are defined as members of a controlled group of companies or other entities that are under common control. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended, and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and has been amended at various dates through December 31, 2024 to comply with applicable laws and regulations.

Plan Administration

The Company is the plan administrator and is responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the Plan. The Plan's trustee, Reliance Trust Company (Reliance), is responsible for the custody and management of the Plan's assets. ADP Retirement Services (ADP) is the recordkeeper of the Plan and is responsible for administering all investment transactions directed by the Plan participants.

Contributions

Employees who are at least 21 years old are eligible to participate upon completion of three consecutive months of service. Effective August 1, 2023, employees must also complete 400 hours of service within three consecutive months of service to be eligible to participate in the Plan. Participants may elect to defer their compensation as employee savings contribution, subject to IRC limitations. Plan participants over age 50 may defer catch-up contributions, subject to IRC limitations.

The Plan adopted an automatic enrollment provision effective August 1, 2023. On this effective date, eligible employees who were not deferring any amount and who did not make a timely election to not contribute were automatically enrolled to defer 1% of their compensation as pre-tax contributions to the Plan. Employees may elect not to defer or choose a different percentage of deferral, subject to the IRC limitations, by submitting a new salary deferral agreement.

As defined by the Plan, the Company makes safe harbor match of the participant's pre-tax elective contributions, dollar for dollar, up to 4% of eligible compensation. The Company may also make employer nonelective contributions to the Plan. Total safe harbor matching contributions amounted to \$638,108 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company did not make any employer nonelective contributions to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN – CONTINUED

Contributions – Continued

Participants may also make a rollover contribution to the Plan that is not matched by the Company. Rollover contributions are assets transferred to the Plan from a qualified plan in which an employee participated prior to employment with the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were \$127,495 in rollover contributions transferred to the Plan.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and their share of the Company's contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan, and they may change their investment elections anytime.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their salary deferral contributions and in the Company's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's employer nonelective contributions and earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment before becoming entitled to their full benefits under the Plan. Forfeitures are used to reduce any employer contribution on an annual basis that would otherwise be made to the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no forfeitures available for future use. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contribution to the Plan amounted to \$11 during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant, which are adjusted to reflect the participant's and Company's contributions, as well as the participant's share of the Plan's income and any related administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN – CONTINUED

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum limited to the lesser of: (i) \$50,000 or (ii) 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Each note receivable bears a reasonable rate of interest, which is determined by the plan administrator, and must be repaid on an installment basis through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, except when borrowed funds are used to acquire a primary residence. The interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of service, the participant or beneficiary may receive a lump-sum payment. The Plan's normal retirement age is defined by the Plan document.

If the vested account balance of a terminated participant is \$5,000 or less, the entire balance will be paid out. For mandatory distributions in excess of \$1,000, the participant may elect to either directly transfer the vested account balance to an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) or another qualified plan or receive the vested benefits in a lump-sum payment. If no election is made, vested benefits are transferred to a separate IRA established by the Plan.

Hardship Withdrawals

Participants may withdraw their vested contributions in the event of hardships as defined by the Plan document. Hardship distributions are distributed as a lump-sum.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the dates of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. The most important of these estimates and assumptions relate to fair value measurements of the Plan's investments. These and other estimates and assumptions are based on the best available information but actual results could be materially different from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Valuation of Investments

In accordance with GAAP, all assets of the Plan are stated at fair value or amounts approximating fair value. Fair value is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustees.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when earned. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a distribution based on the terms of the Plan document.

Recognition of Income

Sales and purchases are accounted for on a trade date basis, and interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends, if declared, are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold during the year as well as held at year-end.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Administrative Expenses

All reasonable expenses related to Plan administration are paid from Plan assets, except to the extent expenses are paid by the Company. Expenses paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Recent Accounting Pronouncements

In the normal course of business, the Plan evaluates all new accounting pronouncements to determine the potential impact they may have on its financial statements. Based upon this review, the Plan does not expect any of the recently issued accounting pronouncements, which have not already been adopted by the Plan, to have a material impact on its financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated for recognition or disclosure subsequent events through the report issuance date and determined that no such events were identified.

NOTE 3 - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted ADP's Prototype Non-Standardized Defined Contribution Plan (Prototype Plan) that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), which stated that the Prototype Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The plan administrator had determined that it was eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS Prototype Plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator believes that the Plan operates in accordance with applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

In accordance with GAAP, the Plan management is required to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, and 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 4 - PLAN AMENDMENT AND TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan document to amend or terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated, the participants' account balances fully vest, and they would be distributed.

NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Pursuant to that regulation, the plan administrator has instructed the independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to information certified by the trustee. Accordingly, the trustee of the Plan has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the supplemental Schedule H, line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reflected in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 6 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value hierarchy prioritized the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three levels, with the highest priority given to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority given to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 6 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value:

- *Mutual funds*: Valued at quoted market prices of shares held by the Plan at year-end.
- *Common/collective trust funds*: Valued using the market approach at a unit price (net asset value as a practical expedient) determined by the portfolio’s sponsor based on the fair value of underlying investments held by the common collective trust fund on the last business day of the Plan year.

In accordance with GAAP, common/collective trust funds are not classified in the fair value hierarchy table. The fair values are included in the table to allow reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the fair value of investments per the statements of net assets available for benefits. The common/collective trust funds measured at net asset value (NAV) may impose, in its sole discretion, a prior notice period of up to 12 months for Plan initiated withdrawal of assets. They may also require that within 90 days from withdrawal from the fund, money from the fund cannot be invested directly into a competing fund, such as a money market fund. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
