Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of SMG Services, LLC 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the SMG Services, LLC 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

Basis for Opinion

SMG SERVICES, LLC 401(K) PLAN NOTE TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the SMG Services, LLC 401(K) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of SMG Services, LLC (the “Main Sponsor”) and various adopting employers of the controlled group. All employees become eligible to participate in the Plan after completing one year of service, as defined by the Plan. There is no minimum age for Plan eligibility. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The following entities participate in the Plan, referred to collectively as “the Employers”:

SMG Services, LLC
Stellar Management Ltd.
Tivoli BI LLC
Windermere Owners LLC
RP Stellar IP Owner LLC
Harvey Group LLC
Laurence Gluck Charitable Foundation

Plan amendment – In August 2024 the Plan was amended to permit Hardship distributions from all Participant Accounts which are fully vested including the employer’s matching portion.

Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in the designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Sponsor may make a discretionary matching contribution equal to a percentage of the participants salary deferrals. For the Plan year 2024 the employer contributed 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Sponsor made a matching contribution to the Plan of \$144,612. Additional discretionary profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Sponsor’s board of directors and are invested in a portfolio of investments as directed by the participants. No discretionary profit sharing contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts - Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions; the Sponsor’s matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Sponsor’s contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

NOTE TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

Payment of Benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or for other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Partial withdrawals are permitted when participants reach the age of 59½, or in the event of financial hardship.

Forfeited Accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts approximated \$20,800 and \$33,000, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay plan expenses or reduce employer matching contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2024 \$17,000 of forfeitures were used to pay plan expenses.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and change therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. There were no excess contributions payable at December 31, 2024. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants within the required time period.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC No. 820 are described as follows:

Level 1—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at net asset value (NAV) per unit, as determined by the Custodian at year end. These investments are pooled funds that look like mutual funds, but they are not registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. They often are invested in mutual funds or other marketable securities, but the unit price generally will be different from the value of the underlying securities because the fund may also hold cash for liquidity purposes, and the fees imposed by the fund are deducted from the fund value rather than charged separately to investors. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investments for an amount different from the reported net asset value. The underlying securities in pooled separate accounts are listed on national securities exchanges and valued on the basis of year-end closing prices. The Plan has concluded that the net asset value as adjusted (for mutual fund dividends, mutual fund splits and administrative maintenance charges and other items) and reported by the insurance company approximates fair value of the investments. The investments are redeemable at the adjusted net asset value under agreements with the insurance company.

Pooled separate investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share practical expedient are not classified in a fair value hierarchy. The net asset value amounts presented in these tables are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Plan investments are group annuity investment options issued by John Hancock, the custodian and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are denoted as such on the supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

John Hancock provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a recordkeeping agreement between the Sponsor and John Hancock. John Hancock earns revenue in the form of float income and from other income (revenue sharing) from mutual fund providers for services that John Hancock provides to the funds.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Plan is structured and follows a volume submitter profit sharing plan, pre-approved by the IRS. The IRS issued an opinion letter dated March 31, 2008, that the volume submitter plan is acceptable in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan is subject to examinations for three years.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
