(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Peerless Clothing International, Inc. 401(k) Trust (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan’s Adoption Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

(a) General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan effective January 1, 1998, covering all employees of Peerless Clothing International, Inc. (the “Company”) who have completed one year of service, defined as 1,000 hours of service. There is no age requirement. Non-resident aliens, employees covered under a collective bargaining unit, and leased employees are not eligible to participate. Participants are eligible to enter the Plan and begin making salary deferrals on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following their eligibility date. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

(b) Contributions

Participants may contribute a percentage or dollar amount of their pretax annual compensation, with a minimum of 2% up to a maximum of 20%, as defined by the Plan. Depending upon a participant’s level of income, participant contributions may be decreased in order to comply with Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) regulations.

The employer match is a safe harbor contribution equal to 100% of the first 5% of an employees’ elected deferral. To be eligible for the safe harbor match, participants must complete one year of service.

The employer may also make a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan. In order to receive the discretionary nonelective contribution, a participant must complete one year of service and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Company did not make a discretionary nonelective contribution in 2024 or 2023.

(c) Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, allocations of the Company’s contributions, and Plan earnings, and debited with the participant’s withdrawals. Forfeited balances of terminated participants’ nonvested accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions.

(d) Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent amounts which could not be paid to terminated participants due to failure to meet vesting requirements. Forfeited non-vested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$532 and \$518, respectively.

(e) Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer safe harbor match plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. The vesting schedule is as follows:

<u>Years of service</u>	<u>Vesting percentage</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 years	100%

(f) Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant receives an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account in a lump-sum amount. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution, or leave the funds in the Plan until retirement age, or transfer to a trustee of another qualified plan or individual retirement account. If the terminating employee's non-forfeitable account balance is less than the \$7,000, excluding rollovers, it is mandatory that the Plan distribute the entire account balance, less forfeitures, if any, as soon as administratively practical.

A participant may withdraw rollover contributions at any time. In-service distributions are allowable within the Plan, once a participant reached age 59½ or the Plan's normal retirement age. The Plan also allows hardship distributions under Federal rules.

(g) Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1 – 5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a principal residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate equal to the Prime Rate reported in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of each month plus 1%, as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid through employee payroll deductions.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

(d) Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(e) Administrative Expenses

Certain investment and administrative expenses regarding distributions and loans are charged to participant accounts or deducted from check proceeds. The other administrative expenses are generally paid by the Company.

(f) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(g) Notes Receivable

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan Document.

(h) Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the Plan's financial statements were available to be used.

(3) Information Certified by the Plan's Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified as being complete and accurate the investments on the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the investment activity reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the investment information included in the supplemental schedule of assets held at December 31, 2024. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified as complete and accurate by the Plan's custodian.

(4) Fair Value Measurements

Generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America establish a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC).

Guaranteed investment contracts: Valued at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit-worthiness of the issuer.

Common collective trust funds: Valued at net asset value (NAV) of units held. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the NAV.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(5) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Additionally, the Company may amend the Plan at any time without the consent of any participant or any beneficiary, provided that no amendment deprives any participant of the participant's non-forfeitable accrued benefit.

(6) Income Tax Status

The Company adopted a Prototype Non-Standardized Profit Sharing Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement as sponsored by Orchard Trust Company. Orchard Trust Company has obtained an opinion letter dated March 31, 2008, stating that the form of the Plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Generally, the plan administrator and the Plan may rely on the opinion letter received by Orchard Trust Company as to the form of the Plan qualifying under the IRC (except as otherwise noted in the opinion letter). The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior before the year ended December 31, 2021.

(7) Related Party Transactions

The Plan has a number of service providers. Such parties are considered parties-in-interest under ERISA.

(8) Withdrawing Participants

All participants who have withdrawn from the Plan and requested their benefits have been paid as of December 31, 2024.
