## Independent Auditor's Report

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Chevron Phillips Chemical Company LP Health and Welfare Benefit Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

**Notes to Financial Statements - December 31, 2024**

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**Note 1 - Plan Description**

The following description of the Chevron Phillips Chemical Company LP Health and Welfare Benefit Plan (the Plan) is subject to and qualified by the more complete information appearing in the Plan document.

The Plan, established on January 1, 2001, is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is available to eligible employees and retirees of Chevron Phillips Chemical Company LP (the Company), as defined in the Plan document.

*Benefits* – The Plan offers medical, dental, vision, prescription drug, behavioral health, wellness, employee assistance and reimbursement accounts for health care benefits and dependent care to eligible employees and their eligible dependents. Medical, dental, vision, prescription drug, and behavioral health benefits are also available to eligible retirees who have 25 or more years of continuous service at retirement, are age 55 or older and have 10 or more years of continuous service at retirement, or are age 65 or older and have completed at least 3 years of continuous service at retirement. Additionally, in accordance with the guidelines of the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA) and subsequent amendments thereto, individuals and their dependents who qualify for continuation of coverage as defined under COBRA, are eligible for continuation of benefits under the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, coverage under the Plan begins on the date of hire.

The Company's Benefits Committee is the designated Plan Administrator. The Plan's comprehensive health care benefits, including medical, dental, prescription drug, behavioral health, and wellness, are mostly self-funded. The Company's self-funded medical and behavioral health benefits are administered by BlueCross BlueShield (BCBS) and the self-funded prescription drug benefits are administered by CVS Caremark. The medical, behavioral health, prescription drug, and dental benefits for participants on long-term international assignments are provided for under a fully insured insurance contract with Cigna. The self-funded dental benefits are administered by Aetna. The self-funded wellness benefits are administered by ActiveHealth Management. The fully-insured vision benefits are administered by VSP. The Company provides employee assistance benefits through a services agreement with Health Advocate.

*Contributions* – The Plan is sponsored by the Company and is funded by contributions from participating employees, retirees, COBRA participants and the Company. Active employees make their contributions for health care benefits on a pre-tax basis under Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the Code). All employee contributions are remitted to the VEBA Trust established to fund the Plan.

*Expenses* – The Company pays certain administrative expenses of the Plan.

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**Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies**

*Basis of Accounting* – The accompanying financial statements were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

*Use of Estimates* – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition* – The Plan’s 401(h) account is maintained in the Chevron Phillips Chemical Company LP Retirement Plan (the Retirement Plan), which participates in the Chevron Phillips Chemical Master Trust (the Master Trust). The associated investments are presented at fair value, which have been determined based on the fair value of the underlying investments of the Master Trust. See Note 4 for further discussion. The Plan’s investments in the VEBA Trust are in short-term investment funds and mutual funds, which are also stated at fair value, based on quoted market prices from national securities exchanges. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

*Risks and Uncertainties* – The Plan invests in various securities, which in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events, which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

The actuarial present value of expected postretirement benefit obligations is reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates and employee demographics that are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimation and assumption processes, it is reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term could be material to the financial statements.

**Note 3 - Benefit Obligations**

*Postretirement Benefit Obligations*

The Company offers medical, dental, vision, prescription drug, and behavioral health benefits to eligible employees and their dependents upon retirement. At retirement, the Company provides eligible retirees with a last hire date before January 1, 2017 with a Retiree Reimbursement Account (RRA) equal to \$1,300 times the number of years of continuous service for unmarried retirees or \$2,500 times the number of years of continuous service for married retirees. This account earns a market rate of interest once established. The RRA may be used to pay for health care coverage, including medical, dental, vision, prescription drug, and/or behavioral health services offered by the Company or by other public and private health care plans. The account may also be used to pay eligible out-of-pocket health care expenses such as deductibles, co-payments and other eligible health care expenses that are not covered by an insured plan.

It is intended that the cost of postretirement health care benefits be borne by the participating retirees via monthly premiums. However, should the cost of postretirement health care benefits exceed the premiums collected in any given year, the excess cost is solely the responsibility of the Company.

In addition to deductibles and co-payments, premium rates for postretirement health care benefits are as follows:

Amounts reported as postretirement benefit obligations represent the actuarial present values of estimated future benefits that are attributed by the terms of the Plan to employees' service rendered through the date of the financial statements, reduced by the actuarial present value of contributions expected to be received in the future from current Plan participants. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for (1) currently retired employees and their eligible dependents and beneficiaries, and (2) active employees and their eligible dependents and beneficiaries after their retirement from the Company. The postretirement benefit obligations represent the amounts to be funded by contributions from the Company and from existing Plan assets to fund the RRAs.

Significant assumptions used in the actuarial valuation include a weighted average discount rate of 5.40% in 2024 and 4.97% in 2023; a mortality rate using the Pri-2012 base tables with generational projection using scale MP-2021; and an average retirement age of 62. Furthermore, the valuation definition of full eligibility includes the last assumed retirement age under the presumption that it accurately reflects the split of the postretirement benefit obligation. The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. Were the Plan to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial present value of postretirement benefit obligations.

The Plan's deficiency of its net assets compared to its benefit obligations primarily relates to postretirement benefit obligations. It is expected that the deficiency will be funded through future contributions from the Company on a pay-as-you-go basis. The measurement of the accumulated postretirement benefit obligations for retiree health care plans assumes a health care cost trend rate of 5.0% in 2024 and beyond.

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##### *Postemployment Benefit Obligations*

Postemployment benefit obligations represent the Company's obligations for employees electing COBRA coverage. These obligations are estimated by the Company based on the actual number of employees electing COBRA coverage and claims payment history.

##### *Other Plan Benefit Obligations*

Plan obligations at December 31, 2024 and 2023 for amounts currently payable, which include claims payable and claims incurred but not reported, were estimated by the Company or the third-party administrator based on existing unpaid claims, actual claims paid subsequent to year-end and claims payment history.

#### **Note 4 - Investments**

##### *401(h) Account*

The Plan allows for the discretionary funding of certain retiree health care expenses through an account established pursuant to Section 401(h) of the Internal Revenue Code (the 401(h) account). The 401(h) account is maintained in the Retirement Plan, which participates in the Master Trust, and the required disclosures regarding the 401(h) account are reported in the Retirement Plan's 2024 financial statements. The related obligations for health care benefits are reflected as obligations in the financial statements of the Plan. The Company funds the 401(h) account in amounts that the Company, at its discretion, deems appropriate. The 401(h) account may not be used for, or diverted to, any purpose other than providing healthcare benefits for retirees and their eligible dependents.

Investment information regarding the 401(h) account and the Master Trust were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity, the trustee of the 401(h) account and the Master Trust.

##### *Other Investments*

The Plan's investments in the VEBA Trust, consisting of short-term investment funds and mutual funds, are held by the Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A. (BNY Mellon).

All other investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplementary information, including investments held and interest income receivable at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of mutual funds and investment income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by BNY Mellon, the trustee of the VEBA Trust.

**Note 6 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of such termination, amounts previously contributed to the trust funding the Plan would be utilized for payment of participant benefits and would not revert to the Company.

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**Note 7 - Income Tax Status**

The VEBA Trust funding the Plan received an exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated October 17, 2001, stating that the trust is tax exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)(9) of the Code as a Voluntary Employees' Beneficiary Association. The Plan and VEBA Trust are required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status of the VEBA Trust. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the related VEBA Trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 8 - Related Party Transactions**

Certain of the Plan's investments are managed by BNY Mellon, the trustee of the VEBA Trust, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

**Note 9 - Fair Value Measurements**

Accounting standards require disclosures that categorize assets and liabilities measured at fair value into one of three different levels, depending on the observability of the inputs employed in the measurement. Level 1 inputs are quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities. Level 2 inputs are observable inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly through market-corroborated inputs. Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability reflecting significant modifications to observable related market data or our assumptions about pricing by market participants.

The fair value of the Plan's 401(h) account at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was disclosed in the Retirement Plan's 2024 financial statements. The fair value of the Plan's mutual fund investments held in the VEBA Trust was \$22,769,715 and \$24,881,297 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, valued at Level 1 in the fair value hierarchy.

**Note 10 - Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
