Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

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### 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Xellia Pharmaceuticals 401(k) Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### ***General***

The Plan is a safe harbor plan under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") established effective January 1, 2012, covering all employees of Xellia Pharmaceuticals, Inc. ("the Company") who are 18 years of age or older and completed one month of service, except for employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, leased, and non-resident aliens who received no earned income within the United States. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") as amended.

The Plan was restated in February 2023 to add age 18 and one month of service to the eligibility requirements along with removing the hours of service requirement for nonelective employer contributions.

On June 17, 2024, Xellia announced the divestment of its U.S. based institutional activities to Hikma Pharmaceuticals, a leading global supplier of generic injectables. The transaction includes the Cleveland manufacturing site, the in-market institutional commercial portfolio based in Chicago, the drug product R&D pipeline, and the R&D site in Zagreb, Croatia. This transaction closed on or September 10, 2024. Substantially all participants were terminated at that time, resulting in a partial termination. The Plan moved to a MEP with VOYA in July 2025 with the remaining participants with funding concluding in October 2025.

#### ***Contributions***

Each year, participants may contribute up to 90 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Company has a safe harbor match of 100 percent of the first 3 percent and 50 percent of the next 2 percent of participants' eligible compensation which is deferred to the Plan. The match has a true up provision which resulted in a matching contribution receivable at year-end of \$32,835. The Company may also make discretionary nonelective employer contributions to employees that are employed on the last day of the Plan year. The service requirement for the discretionary nonelective contribution is waived for an employee that terminates during the year due to death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age. There were no discretionary nonelective employer contributions for the 2024 plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

#### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions, as well as allocations of plan earnings and any discretionary nonelective employer contributions. Allocations are based upon participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan holds mutual funds with Fidelity Management Trust Company ("FMTC").

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### ***Vesting***

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company safe harbor matching contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Employees become 20 percent vested in the Company's discretionary nonelective employer contributions each year after 2 years of service and are fully vested after 6 years of service. Any accounts that were unvested became fully vested as a result of the partial termination.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. Participants are limited to one outstanding loan at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the rate of prime plus 1 percent, which is commensurate with prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. All loans currently bear rates ranging from 5.25 to 9.50 percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. The Plan loan policy was updated in March 2023 requiring loan repayments to be made directly through the employees' bank accounts to Fidelity. Interest rates are determined by Fidelity, as a co-fiduciary, based on prevailing interest rates.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Hardship distributions are available based on safe harbor criteria from a participant's elective deferral account. The Plan also provides for in-service withdrawals of any vested balances upon attaining normal retirement age.

### ***Forfeited Accounts***

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were \$862 and \$574, respectively in forfeitures. Forfeited accounts may be used to reduce future administrative expenses or employer contributions. No forfeitures were utilized during the plan year for plan expenses.

## **2. Summary of Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

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### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded once there is a distributable event. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were deemed distributed loans amounting to \$22,697.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### ***Expenses***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the payment of benefits are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. The Plan pays for recordkeeping and advisory fees. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

### 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1-** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

**Level 2-** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3-** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

## 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Participants are 100 percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan should be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

## 6. Non-Exempt Transactions

During the 2024 Plan year, the Company failed to deposit participant contributions in the amount of \$180,740 within the required timeframe as stated by the DOL regulations. These transactions constitute non-exempt transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company remitted the contributions during the 2024 and 2025 plan years, and the Company intends to fully correct by remitting lost earnings to the Plan.

## 7. Tax Status

The Plan has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan Document is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan Administrator and the Plan's management believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

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### 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit volatility. Market risks include U.S. and global events that could impact the value of Plan investments. Such events may include public health emergencies, as well as international conflicts, cybersecurity attacks, supply chain disruptions, global monetary policy decisions, inflation, significant economic influences, and other adverse credit and market events and conditions. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### 9. Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are mutual funds managed by FMTC. FMTC is the trustee and, therefore, transactions with these parties qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Direct fees paid to FMTC by the Plan totaled \$56,819 in 2024. Fees paid for advisory services amounted to \$25,000 in direct expenses.
