Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments. Management is also responsible for administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.



In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H (Form 5500), Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The certified investment information in the supplemental schedule agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Services for the Underserved 403(b) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

On January 1, 2009, Services for the Underserved (the Company, Employer, or Plan sponsor) established the Plan as a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is administered by the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The trustee of the Plan is State Street Bank and Trust Company (State Street or Trustee), and Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC (Transamerica) is the recordkeeper.

Participation

An employee becomes eligible to participate in the Plan, with respect to making salary-reduction contributions, on the date of hire or as soon as administratively feasible. Certain employees with a status of nonresident alien who have no earned income from sources within the United States are not eligible to make elective deferrals or participate in the Plan for nonelective contributions.

An employee becomes eligible to participate in the Employer's nonelective contributions when the employee attains age 18; completes one year of service, which is equivalent to at least 1,000 hours of service with the Company during the Plan year, which starts on January 1 and ends on December 31; and is employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts from other eligible retirement plans, as defined by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain annual limitations as prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan sponsor started making an annual Employer matching contribution for non-union employees, equivalent to 100% of the first 2% of employee contributions, including pre-tax, Roth, or catch-up contributions (subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations). Non-union employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year and must have completed at least 1,000 hours of service for the year to be eligible for the Employer matching contribution. For the Plan year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer matching contribution was \$1,301,984 and \$1,185,592, respectively.

The Employer's nonelective contribution is made at the Employer's discretion and is unrelated to whether a participant makes any elective deferrals in that year. The participant's share of the Employer nonelective contribution will depend on how much eligible compensation the participant received during the year and the eligible compensation received by other eligible participants.

Employer contributions are subject to certain IRC limitations. For the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company did not make any nonelective contributions to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's matching contributions and the Employer's nonelective contributions, and related net earnings and losses thereon, and charged for withdrawals and certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are always 100% vested in their employee pretax contributions, the Employer's matching contributions, rollover contributions, and any income or loss thereon. Participants become vested in the Employer's nonelective contributions, as follows:

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of their account with installment payments payable monthly, quarterly, or annually, or partial withdrawals with a \$1,000 minimum. A terminated participant may also elect to maintain the account balance in the Plan or select a direct rollover to an individual retirement account (IRA) or another qualified plan. For the year ended December 31, 2023, if a participant's vested interest in the Plan exceeded \$1,000 and did not exceed \$5,000 and the participant does not direct otherwise, the participant's distribution will be rolled over to an IRA (automatic rollover) in the name of the participant. Effective January 1, 2024, these amounts for automatic rollover were updated to exceeding \$1,000 and not exceeding \$7,000.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their vested account balances a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the prior 12-month period, or 50% of their vested account balance. A participant may have two loans outstanding at any time. The vested account balance will be used as collateral for any loan.

Loans are to be repaid over a period of five years or less, unless used to purchase a principal residence. These loans are subject to certain restrictions as defined by the Plan document and applicable restrictions under the IRC. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions.

The interest rates for loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were between 3.25% and 8.50%.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are used to reduce administrative expenses and future Employer nonelective contributions in accordance with the Plan document. During 2024 and 2023, no forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited nonvested account was \$947 and \$751, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and Trustee. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurement and Note 8 for a discussion on contract value.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants

are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment expenses, which are charged within investments, are presented net of the appreciation in fair value of investments. Direct administrative expenses paid by the Plan totaled \$69,282 and \$62,508 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

3. Certified Investments

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by State Street, a qualified institution.

4. Fair Value Measurement

GAAP establishes a hierarchy for inputs used in measuring fair value that maximizes the use of observable inputs and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs by requiring that inputs that are most observable be used when available. Observable inputs are inputs that market participants operating within the same marketplace as the Plan would use in pricing the Plan's asset or liability based on independently derived and objectively determined market data. Unobservable inputs are inputs that cannot be sourced from a broad active market in which assets or liabilities identical or similar to those of the Plan are traded. The Plan estimates the price of any assets for which there are only unobservable inputs by using assumptions that market participants who have investments in the same or similar assets would use, as determined by the money managers administering each investment based on the best information available in the circumstances. The input hierarchy is broken down into three levels based on the degree to which the exit price (exchange price that would be reviewed for an asset or paid to transfer a liability) is independently observable or determinable, as follows:

Level 1 - At this level, valuation is based on quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities. Since valuations are based on quoted market prices that are readily and regularly available in an active market, valuation of these products does not entail a significant degree of judgment.

Level 2 - At this level, inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - At this level, valuation is based on inputs that are unobservable, significant to the fair value measurement, and reflect management's best estimate of what market participants would use as fair value.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of an input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The Plan's assets and liabilities recorded at fair value have been categorized based upon a fair value hierarchy, in accordance with GAAP. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

A description of the valuation method used for the Plan's major assets measured at fair value is as follows:

Mutual Funds - The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value based upon quoted market prices, which are represented by the net asset value (NAV) held by the Plan at year-end.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Tax Status

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the IRC. The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Transamerica. Transamerica received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated March 31, 2017, which states that the pre-approved plan document, as then-designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Party-in-Interest

Notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant will continue to be 100% vested in their employee pretax contributions and the Employer's matching contributions, and will become 100% vested in their Employer nonelective contributions.

8. Fully Benefit-Responsive Guaranteed Interest Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed interest contract (GIC) with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Prudential). Prudential maintains the contributions in a general account or a guaranteed separate account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals. Prudential is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that are guaranteed to the Plan.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. The contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Certain transfers or withdrawals require 90 days' notice.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuers or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. Inputs used to determine the crediting interest rate include each contract's portfolio market value relative to contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan's administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of funds offered by the Plan. These funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's exposure to a concentration of credit risk is limited by the diversification of investments across various participant-directed fund elections. Additionally, the investments within each participant-directed fund election are further diversified into varied financial instruments.

10. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 17, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events requiring adjustment to the financial statements or disclosures, except the following:

On July 29, 2025, the Plan has been amended to include a discretionary match for Union employees effective January 1, 2025, and expand the auto-enrollment feature effective July 1, 2025.
