We have performed audits of the financial statements of Orion Industries, LTD. Cross-Tested Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2024

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Orion Industries, LTD Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Adoption Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all non-union employees of Orion Industries, Ltd. (the "Sponsor") and its related entities, Orion Industries, LTD and Dimension Bond (collectively, the "Employers"). Employees are eligible upon reaching age 21 and completing 1 year of service. The Plan became effect on February 1, 1992, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA") and the Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC").

Contributions

Each participant may contribute up to the maximum amount allowable, not to exceed the limits of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), as pre-tax or after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan requires Employers make safe-harbor matching contributions of 3% of employees compensation for all eligible employees.

The Employers, at their sole discretion, may also make profit-sharing contributions to the Plan annually on behalf of all eligible participants. No discretionary contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investment options

The Plan's investment assets are held by Matrix Trust Company (the "Custodian"), the custodian of the Plan's investment assets. Under an arrangement with the Custodian and upon enrollment in the Plan, participants direct all contributions in any whole percentage increment to any of the available funds. Participants may change their allocation among the various investment options at any time.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) the Employer's safe-harbor and discretionary contributions, and (c) the earnings and losses of the participant's investments and is charged with any expenses incurred as a result of transactions initiated by the participant. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Each participant is immediately fully vested in the portion of his or her account attributable to his or her contributions and Employers safe-harbor contribution and earnings thereon. Vesting in the portion of his or her account attributable to the Employers discretionary contributions and earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination of employment, attainment retirement age, or for reasons of death or disability, participants may withdraw the vested portion of their account in the form of a lump sum. Participants still employed with the Employers may withdraw all or a portion of their account balance attributable to their salary deferral contributions and actual earnings thereon upon attainment of age 59½ or for reasons of a financial hardship, as allowed under the IRC. A participant whose vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000 will receive a lump sum distribution of their vested account balance as soon as administratively feasible following termination. A terminated participant whose vested account balance is between \$1,000 and \$5,000 and who does not elect otherwise, will have their vested account balance distributed from the Plan directly into an individual retirement account in their name.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of nonvested account balances may be used, at the sole discretion of the Sponsor, to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or reduce Employers contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$95 in funds were forfeited and \$25 was used to reduce the Plan expenses. Accumulated forfeitures totaled \$3,251 and \$3,181 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow, from their fund accounts, amounts ranging from \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. The maximum term of repayment for a loan is five years, unless it is for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the maximum term of repayment is fifteen years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at fixed rates commensurate with prevailing market rates for similar loans, as determined by the plan administrator at the date of origination. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. A participant may have two loan outstanding at a time. Interest rates on outstanding loans at December 31, 2024 and 2023 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employers and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to investment advisory services provided and for the administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of estimates in financial statement preparation

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded at the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains and losses on those investments.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as distributions based upon the Plan's provisions.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent events

The Sponsor has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's (the "DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by the Custodian, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedules.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

- Mutual funds and money market funds: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price, and are deemed to be actively traded.
- Cash, interest-bearing: Valued based on cost.

There were no significant changes in the methodology used during the year ended December 31, 2024. The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Sponsor believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions

to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Employers pay certain costs on behalf of the Plan for insurance, administration and professional services. Recordkeeping and administrative services are also provided by the Employers at no cost to the Plan.

6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan utilizes a volume submitter plan document sponsored by CCH Incorporated, who was informed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the volume submitter plan, as amended, is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has not obtained an advisory letter from the IRS on its adoption of the volume submitter plan. In accordance with Revenue Procedure 2002-6, the Sponsor has chosen to rely on the advisory letter of the volume submitter plan. Subsequent to this advisory letter, the plan has been amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Sponsor believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the tax authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are no audits for any tax periods in progress and the plan administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Employers have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.
