Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the BRP US Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 10 to the financial statements BRP US, Inc., the Plan's Sponsor, experienced a reduction of force beginning in 2023 and for the period of September 21, 2023, through December 31, 2024, which resulted in a partial plan termination during 2024. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

As discussed in Note 11 to the financial statements, the Company sold two participating companies subsequent to year-end which resulted in a partial plan termination during 2025. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the BRP US Inc. 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers all employees of BRP US Inc., Triton Industries, Inc., Alumacraft Boat Co. and related entities (collectively, the Company) who are at least 18 years of age and have completed 30 days of service, with certain exceptions. Ineligible employees, as defined in the Plan agreement, include union employees, non-resident alien employees, leased employees, employees classified as independent contractors and expatriate employees who are participating in their home country's retirement benefit Plan. The Plan's 401(k) Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The 401(k) Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective April 30, 2025 and August 31, 2025, the Company sold Alumacraft Boat Co. and Triton Industries, Inc., respectively, reducing the number of participants by approximately 31%. The Plan was amended to remove these participating companies in 2025. Upon the effective date of this amendment, a partial plan termination occurred, and all participants became 100% vested in their accounts.

Contributions: Participants are allowed to contribute a percentage of pretax compensation as defined by the Plan, subject to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), as defined, up to the maximum amount allowable by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants are subject to an automatic deferral amount which requires 6% of eligible compensation to be withheld unless the participant makes a contrary election. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing, a participant may elect to defer 0% and may elect to contribute up to 50% of eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Roth deferrals are allowed.

For employees of BRP US Inc., the Company contributes a match equal to 100% of the first 6% of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, that a participant contributes to the Plan.

For employees of Triton Industries, Inc., the Company contributes a match equal to 100% of elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of elective deferrals that exceed 3% but do not exceed 5% of eligible compensation.

For employees of Alumacraft Boat Co., the Company contributes a match equal to 100% of elective deferrals that do not exceed 1% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of elective deferrals that exceed 1% but do not exceed 6% of eligible compensation.

Additional discretionary contributions may be made at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. There were no Company discretionary contributions made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of: (a) the Company's contributions, and (b) Plan earnings and losses, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Vesting: Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, and actual earnings thereon.

For employees of BRP US Inc., participants are immediately vested in the Company's match, and actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Company discretionary contributions for BRP US Inc. have a four-year graded vesting period. Employees of BRP US Inc. who have completed less than two years of service are 0% vested, employees who have completed at least two years of service are 50% vested, employees who have completed at least three years of service are 75% vested, and employees who have completed at least four years of service are 100% vested.

For employees of Triton Industries, Inc., the Company's match and discretionary contribution portion of their accounts has a two-year graded vesting period. Employees who have completed one year of service are 50% vested and employees who have completed at least two years of service are 100% vested.

For employees of Alumacraft Boat Co., the Company's match and discretionary contribution portion of their accounts has a two-year graded vesting period. Employees who have completed one year of service are 25% vested and employees who have completed at least two years of service are 100% vested.

Investment options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct their account balance in a variety of investment choices as more fully described in the Plan's literature. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants are limited to two loans outstanding at a certain point in time. The term of the loans may not exceed five years unless it is for the purchase of a primary residence in which case the loan term may be up to 15 years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's accounts and bear interest, as defined in the Plan. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are paid to the participant or beneficiary upon death, hardship, retirement or termination of employment or attaining the age of 59½, up to the amount of the participant's vested account balance. Once a participant has reached the age of 59½, distributions may be made, at the participant's election. The Plan allows for the automatic lump-sum distribution of terminated participants' vested account balances that do not exceed \$1,000.

Forfeited accounts: These accounts may be used to reduce future Company contributions and/or to pay the expenses of the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$51,000 and \$79,000, respectively. During 2024, forfeitures of approximately \$16,000 were used to reduce Company contributions.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Contributions: Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be recognized to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The 401(k) Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits: Benefits paid to participants are recorded when paid.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued, but unpaid, interest. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Notes receivable from participants have been classified as an investment asset for Form 5500 reporting purposes and, accordingly, have been included as an investment in the supplemental schedule, Schedule H, line 4i—schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Administrative expenses: Administrative expenses may be paid by either the Company or the Plan, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these Plan financial statements. Notes receivable from participants administration fees are paid by the participant electing the note receivable from participant.

Subsequent events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Other than the item discussed in Note 11, no significant subsequent events were noted.

Note 3. Information Certified or Provided by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the Plan Trustee

The following is a summary of the Plan's asset information as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, included throughout the Plan's financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank (Charles Schwab), a qualified institution.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described below.

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Units of common collective trusts: Valued based on the net asset value (NAV) of units of the common collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Shares of registered investment companies: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Shares of registered investment companies held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 5. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Charles Schwab is the trustee, as defined by the Plan, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Charles Schwab, or its affiliates, were approximately \$206,300 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Certain accounting and administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated September 21, 2020, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since adopting the preapproved Plan document; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 10. Partial Plan Termination

The Company experienced a reduction in force beginning in 2023 and for the period of September 21, 2023 through December 31, 2024, resulting in a partial plan termination. There were 1,223 Plan participants that were affected due to the partial plan termination. There were 778 affected participants who have taken distributions from the plan of approximately \$18,000,000 as of December 31, 2024. Approximately \$13,600,000 remains payable to affected participants. All participants affected by the partial plan termination became fully vested in their accounts. Any previously forfeited amounts were restored along with lost earnings. The previously forfeited amounts related to the distributions taken by impacted participants during the year ended December 31, 2024 were immaterial to the financial statements.

Note 11. Subsequent Event

In 2025, the Company sold two participating companies, Alumacraft Boat Co. and Tritron Industries, Inc., resulting in a partial plan termination. As a result, all participants terminated in 2025 will be fully vested in their accounts.
