We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Niterrra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

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**Note 1. Description of The Plan**

The following description of the Niterra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a section 401(k) defined contribution plan covering all employees of Niterra North America, Inc., NTK Technologies, Inc. and NTK Powerdex, Inc. (collectively, the Company), excluding leased or union employees, nonresident aliens with no income in the United States of America, and employees covered under the retirement plan in Japan. Fidelity Management Trust Company serves as trustee of the Plan. It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon meeting the eligibility requirements of one month of service and being at least 18 years of age.

Effective September 11, 2023, the Plan was amended to change its name from NGK/NTK (U.S.A.) Retirement Savings Plan to Niterra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan.

**Contributions**

Participants may elect to contribute up to 75% of pretax compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts.

The Company makes a matching contribution equal to 100% of participant contributions, up to 6% of compensation that a participant defers to the Plan. Effective January 1, 2014, the Plan was amended to constitute a "safe harbor" 401(k) plan under the IRC. As a result, the Company matching contributions made to the Plan are considered safe harbor matching contributions. In addition to safe harbor matching contributions, at the discretion of the Company, the Company may make additional discretionary contributions in an amount to be determined by the Company's board of directors annually. The matching Company contributions are invested into the same investments at the same percentage directed by participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

**Investment Options**

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and a money market fund.

**Participant Accounts**

In addition to the participant's contribution and employer match, each participant's account is credited with an allocation of plan earnings (losses) and charged with transaction fees related to notes receivable from participants and distributions, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

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***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in all other Company contribution portions of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service (as defined in the Plan) as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested %</u>
Less than 2	0%
At least 2, but less than 3	20%
At least 3, but less than 4	40%
At least 4, but less than 5	60%
At least 5, but less than 6	80%
6 or more	100%

***Notes Receivable From Participants***

Participants may borrow from their vested fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of interest as determined by the plan administrator based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans that would be made under similar circumstances. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates between 4.25% and 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, unless otherwise designated. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Hardship distributions are permitted upon demonstration of financial hardship. In-service distributions of vested account balances are allowed for those participants who have reached age 59½. Upon termination of employment, participants with an account balance less than \$5,000 will be automatically withdrawn from the Plan.

***Forfeitures***

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,508 and \$1,843, respectively. These accounts will be used first to pay plan expenses and then to reduce future Company contributions. During 2024, forfeitures of \$1,129 were used to pay plan expenses and forfeitures of \$1,423 were used to reduce Company contributions.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting***

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on the modified cash basis of accounting, an accounting practice permitted by the Department of Labor (DOL). This method includes recording of plan assets at fair value, but excludes the recording of receivables for participant and employer contributions, interest and dividends receivable on investments, and accrued expenses. The effect of these items has not been determined. This practice differs in some respects from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, which require that the financial statements be prepared on an accrual basis. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present the financial position and changes in net assets available for benefits in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

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***Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

***Notes Receivable From Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

***Administrative Expenses***

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account. Administration expenses for terminated participants are deducted from participant accounts.

***Subsequent Events***

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 4. Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment, and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

These funds are valued using \$1 for the net asset value (NAV). The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

**Common Collective Trust Funds**

The Plan invests in common collective trust fund for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the NAV per share provided by the qualified institution as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. The Plan also invests in a stable value collective investment trust, which contains fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. This stable value collective investment trust is valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common collective trust funds, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The common collective trust funds are not required to be classified within a level in the fair value hierarchy.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Note 5. Plan Termination**

Although it has not elected to do so, the Company reserves the right at any time by action of its Board of Directors to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant shall become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**Note 6. Tax Status**

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the volume submitter plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the trustee by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting guidelines require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected

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to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 7. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain investments of the Plan are various funds of Fidelity Investments, an entity related to Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan. Such investment transactions, therefore, qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Company pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan, including legal and accounting fees. Other administrative services are provided by the Company at no cost to the Plan. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Fees paid by the Plan to the trustee or its affiliates for administrative services and investment holding period fees were \$11,617 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis.

**Note 9. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500**

The Form 5500 has been prepared using the fair value of the underlying investments held by common collective trust investments, instead of using the NAV as the practical expedient to estimate fair value (see Note 4). We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Niterrra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 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**Note 1. Description of The Plan**

The following description of the Niterra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a section 401(k) defined contribution plan covering all employees of Niterra North America, Inc., NTK Technologies, Inc. and NTK Powerdex, Inc. (collectively, the Company), excluding leased or union employees, nonresident aliens with no income in the United States of America, and employees covered under the retirement plan in Japan. Fidelity Management Trust Company serves as trustee of the Plan. It is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon meeting the eligibility requirements of one month of service and being at least 18 years of age.

Effective September 11, 2023, the Plan was amended to change its name from NGK/NTK (U.S.A.) Retirement Savings Plan to Niterra North America, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan.

**Contributions**

Participants may elect to contribute up to 75% of pretax compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts.

The Company makes a matching contribution equal to 100% of participant contributions, up to 6% of compensation that a participant defers to the Plan. Effective January 1, 2014, the Plan was amended to constitute a "safe harbor" 401(k) plan under the IRC. As a result, the Company matching contributions made to the Plan are considered safe harbor matching contributions. In addition to safe harbor matching contributions, at the discretion of the Company, the Company may make additional discretionary contributions in an amount to be determined by the Company's board of directors annually. The matching Company contributions are invested into the same investments at the same percentage directed by participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

**Investment Options**

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and a money market fund.

**Participant Accounts**

In addition to the participant's contribution and employer match, each participant's account is credited with an allocation of plan earnings (losses) and charged with transaction fees related to notes receivable from participants and distributions, and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

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***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in all other Company contribution portions of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service (as defined in the Plan) as follows:

***Notes Receivable From Participants***

Participants may borrow from their vested fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of interest as determined by the plan administrator based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans that would be made under similar circumstances. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates between 4.25% and 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

***Payment of Benefits***

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, unless otherwise designated. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Hardship distributions are permitted upon demonstration of financial hardship. In-service distributions of vested account balances are allowed for those participants who have reached age 59½. Upon termination of employment, participants with an account balance less than \$5,000 will be automatically withdrawn from the Plan.

***Forfeitures***

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$2,508 and \$1,843, respectively. These accounts will be used first to pay plan expenses and then to reduce future Company contributions. During 2024, forfeitures of \$1,129 were used to pay plan expenses and forfeitures of \$1,423 were used to reduce Company contributions.

**Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting***

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on the modified cash basis of accounting, an accounting practice permitted by the Department of Labor (DOL). This method includes recording of plan assets at fair value, but excludes the recording of receivables for participant and employer contributions, interest and dividends receivable on investments, and accrued expenses. The effect of these items has not been determined. This practice differs in some respects from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, which require that the financial statements be prepared on an accrual basis. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present the financial position and changes in net assets available for benefits in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

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***Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

***Contributions***

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

***Notes Receivable From Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

***Administrative Expenses***

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account. Administration expenses for terminated participants are deducted from participant accounts.

***Subsequent Events***

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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**Note 3. Certification of Plan Trustee**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

**Note 4. Fair Value Measurements**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment, and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

**Mutual Funds**

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

**Money Market Fund**

These funds are valued using \$1 for the net asset value (NAV). The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the funds will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

**Common Collective Trust Funds**

The Plan invests in common collective trust fund for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the NAV per share provided by the qualified institution as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. The Plan also invests in a stable value collective investment trust, which contains fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. This stable value collective investment trust is valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common collective trust funds, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The common collective trust funds are not required to be classified within a level in the fair value hierarchy.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**Note 5. Plan Termination**

Although it has not elected to do so, the Company reserves the right at any time by action of its Board of Directors to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, each participant shall become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**Note 6. Tax Status**

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the volume submitter plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the trustee by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting guidelines require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected

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to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 7. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain investments of the Plan are various funds of Fidelity Investments, an entity related to Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan. Such investment transactions, therefore, qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The Company pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan, including legal and accounting fees. Other administrative services are provided by the Company at no cost to the Plan. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Fees paid by the Plan to the trustee or its affiliates for administrative services and investment holding period fees were \$11,617 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis.

**Note 9. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500**

The Form 5500 has been prepared using the fair value of the underlying investments held by common collective trust investments, instead of using the NAV as the practical expedient to estimate fair value (see Note 4).
