Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Reworld Security Fund Plan (f/k/a the Covanta Projects Security Fund Plan) (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year from the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The Reworld Security Fund Plan (formerly known as the Covanta Projects Security Fund Plan) (the “Plan”) is a defined contribution plan covering certain “Designated Units” of Reworld Projects, LLC (formerly known as Covanta Projects, LLC) (the “Company”). Effective April 16, 2024, the legal name of the Company changed to Reworld Projects, LLC and the legal name of the Plan changed to the Reworld Security Fund Plan. This includes any eligible employees of Reworld Babylon, Inc.; Reworld Bristol, Inc.; Reworld Huntington, LLC; Reworld MacArthur, Inc.; Covanta Long Beach Renewable Energy; and Reworld Marion, Inc.; each a “Designated Unit” whose employment is subject to a collective bargaining agreement that provides for participation in the Plan. The Covanta Long Beach location closed and all participants were terminated effective November 8, 2024.

The Administrative and Investment Committees of the Board of Directors of the Company (“Plan Administrator”) control and manage the operation and administration of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). T. Rowe Price Trust Company (the “Trustee”) is the Trustee of the Plan. The Plan is periodically amended to comply with applicable laws.

Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Participation: The Plan is available to all eligible employees of Reworld Babylon, Inc., Reworld Bristol, Inc., Reworld Huntington, LLC, Reworld MacArthur, Inc., Covanta Long Beach Renewable Energy, and Reworld Marion, Inc. who have met the requirements set forth in the collective bargaining agreement entered into by the respective Designated Unit. These employees are not eligible to participate in the Reworld Savings Plan, formerly known as the Covanta Energy Savings Plan (“Savings Plan”).

Effective December 23, 2020, Employees of Reworld Marion, Inc. subject to collective bargaining who are hired on or after December 23, 2020 shall not be eligible to participate in the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, vesting of regular matching contributions, true-up contributions, and employer non-elective contributions transferred from the Covanta Environmental Solutions 401(k) Plan (“CES Plan”) to this Plan shall be subject to a 2-6 year graded vesting schedule. The CES Plan merged into the Savings Plan effective October 1, 2023. Additionally, any portion of a participant’s account classified as a matching contribution that is transferred from the Savings Plan shall be 100% vested immediately and matching contributions or true-up contributions shall be subject to a 2-year cliff vesting schedule.

Effective April 1, 2023, matching contributions of Reworld Plymouth employees transferred from the Savings Plan to this Plan which accrued from January 1, 2023 through March 31, 2023, shall be 100% vested immediately. Further, all employees active on April 1, 2023 and on the date of hire for new employees after April 1, 2023 who are members of the International Union of Operating Engineers will have 0% employer contributions.

Plan Transfers: Effective January 1, 2020, the account balances of certain participants in the Plan that were former participants in the Savings Plan or the CES Plan may be transferred from such former plans to the Plan and vice versa, see Participation disclosure above. Amounts transferred to the Plan will be subject to the same vesting provisions that previously applied to the account balances under the former plans, see Vesting disclosure for additional detail. Net plan transfers during 2024 of \$31,099 were comprised of \$13,650 of transfers into the Plan from the Savings Plan, and \$44,749 of transfers out of the Plan into the Savings Plan.

Contributions: Under the Plan, employees may contribute up to 15% of their annual compensation on a pre-tax basis, considering Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations. Eligible participants, age 50 or older as of December 31, 2024, can make pre-tax catch-up contributions to the Plan. These employees can contribute an additional \$7,500 in 2024 to the Plan if, by the end of the Plan year, they have met the lesser of the IRS salary deferral limit or the 15% pre-tax plan limit. The catch-up contribution limit may be adjusted for inflation in accordance with Section 414(v) of the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”). Salary deferral and catch-up contributions can be made concurrently.

Employer contributions may be made from time to time, for each of its taxable years equal to the amount as stipulated by the respective collective bargaining agreement for such Participant’s Designated Unit which is in effect for such taxable year.

A participant’s elective contributions and employer contributions are invested at the direction of the participant.

Vesting: The Plan provides for immediate vesting of all employee contributions, employer contributions, rollover contributions, and any investment earnings on these amounts. All employer contributions transferred to the Plan from the CES Plan (see Participation disclosure above) are subject to a 2-6 year graded vesting schedule. Employer matching contributions and employer true up contributions transferred to the Plan from the Savings Plan are vested immediately. Employer non-elective contributions transferred to the Plan from the Savings Plan are subject to a 5 year graded vesting schedule.

Administrative Expenses: Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by either the Plan or the Plan’s sponsor as provided in the Plan document.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Loans are made to participants at a minimum of \$500 and up to the lesser of (i) 50% of the vested balance or (ii) \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding balance of loans during the one-year period ending on the day before the date the loan is made. The maximum loan amount to each participant may be based on such participant’s account balance, excluding any non-elective employer contributions transferred in from the Savings Plan. Loans cannot exceed the limitations of the Tax Reform Act of 1986. The maximum repayment period for a loan is 5 years (10 years if used to acquire a principal residence), however, prepayments of the full loan balance are permitted. The maximum number of loans outstanding at one time for an employee is two loans with only one of the outstanding loans being a residential loan for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear a rate of interest equal to the prime rate plus 1% on the first business day of the month during which the loan is made.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, the Company’s contributions, and Plan earnings and is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of expense and losses which are allocated based on the participant’s share of net earnings or losses of their respective elected investment options. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Investment Options: Employees may elect to invest their contributions among the various investment alternatives offered under the Plan. If a participant fails to make an investment election under the Plan, such participant’s account shall be invested in the Plan’s default investment funds, which fund is intended to constitute a “qualified default investment alternative (QDIA)” under Department of Labor Regulations.

Payment of Benefits: A participant shall be entitled to a distribution of the vested portion of his or her account upon termination of employment, retirement or death. Benefits shall be payable in installments or complete or partial lump sum distributions only. If the value of the participant's vested account balance is greater than \$1,000, but less than \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to have the distribution paid directly to him or to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover, the Plan will distribute the participant's account in a direct rollover to an IRA designated by the Plan Administrator. If the value of the participant's vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, a distribution shall be made at the election of the participant. If the value of the participant's vested account balance is \$1,000 or less, and the participant does not elect to have a direct rollover to an eligible retirement plan, the Plan will automatically distribute the participant's entire account as a lump sum cash payment to the participant as soon as administratively practicable.

In the event of financial hardship, as defined, a participant may have available for withdrawal all employee-directed contributions as well as employer contributions. The Plan also permits in-service withdrawals upon a participant's attainment of age 59½.

Pursuant to the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act enacted in December 2019 and effective January 1, 2020, the age at which required minimum distributions must begin was increased from 70½ to 72 for participants born after July 1, 1949. Pursuant to the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) 2.0 Act enacted in December 2022 and effective January 1, 2023, the age at which required minimum distributions must begin was increased from 72 to 73 for participants born after July 1, 1949.

Plan Termination: Any Designated Unit may terminate its participation in the Plan by giving the Administrative Committee prior written notice specifying the termination date which shall be the last day of a month at least 60 days subsequent to the date such notice is received by the Administrative Committee. The Administrative Committee may terminate any Designated Unit's participation in the Plan, as of any termination date specified by the Administrative Committee, for the failure of the Designated Unit to comply with any provision of the Plan and shall terminate a Designated Unit's participation upon complete and final discontinuance of the contributions. The Board of Directors or the Administrative Committee may amend the Plan at any time. No such amendment, however, may retroactively impair any right to any benefit under the Plan which any Participant, Beneficiary or Surviving Spouse would otherwise have had at the date of such amendment. The Board of Directors or the Administrative Committee may, however, make such amendment to the extent required to conform the plan to ERISA or to maintain the continued qualified status of the Plan under the Code.

The Company expects to continue the Plan indefinitely, but reserves the right to suspend contributions or to modify or terminate the plan at any time. In the event of the Plan's termination, the interest of each participant to benefits accrued to such date, to the extent then funded, is fully vested and non-forfeitable.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation: All investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 are carried at fair value. Refer to Note 3 for further details related to the Plan's valuation methods.

Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from Participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participant loan discharges, if any, represent unpaid loan balances written off by the Plan upon participant termination. These amounts are treated as taxable benefits to the participant.

Net Appreciation (Depreciation) in Fair Value of Investments: In the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, the Plan presents the net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments which consists of the net realized gains (losses) and the net unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments.

Security Transactions and Investment Income: Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade date of the transactions. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Income from other investments is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is the exit price associated with the sale of an asset or transfer of a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges (Level 1 inputs).

Collective Trusts: The fair values of participation units held in collective trusts are based on the net asset values per unit as reported by the fund managers. The collective trusts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share, with no advance notice requirement.

Assets recorded at fair value are categorized using defined hierarchical levels directly related to the amount of subjectivity associated with the inputs to valuation of an asset. Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs.

The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1 (unadjusted quoted prices in active markets); Level 2 (observable inputs available at the measurement date, other than quoted prices included in Level 1); and Level 3 (unobservable inputs that cannot be corroborated by observable market data).

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

NOTE 4 - CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by T. Rowe Price Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS

The Plan received a determination letter from the IRS dated November 6, 2015 stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended and restated since receipt of the determination letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended and restated, is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

NOTE 5 - TAX STATUS (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require Plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Department of Labor or Internal Revenue Service, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 6 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, liquidity, credit, and overall market risk, including global events. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the sensitivity of certain fair value estimates to changes in valuation assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA, including: (i) expenses paid for by the Plan, (ii) the Plan's investments in mutual funds issued by an affiliate of the Plan's Trustee, (iii) the collective trusts managed by the Trustee, and (iv) notes receivable from participants.

NOTE 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Company has evaluated all significant activities through October 14, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, employees hired on or after January 1, 2018 who are members of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local 945, shall become Participants in the Plan immediately following commencement of employment. An employer contribution equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of participant's salary reduction account shall be made and will vest on a 5-year vesting schedule.

Effective March 31, 2025, as a result of the closure of the Reworld Marion, Inc. facility, all participants in this location shall cease participation in the Plan. No further contributions shall be made to the Plan and the employer contribution account of participants terminating active participation in the Plan as a result of the closure, shall become fully-vested.
