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REPORT OF INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

To the Plan Administrator of the
Sparton Corporation 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Sparton Corporation 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (“DOL”) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor’s Responsibilities

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor’s report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter — Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Form 5500, Schedule H, Line 4a - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024, is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

A. Description of the Plan

General

The following brief description of the Sparton Corporation 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan includes all eligible employees of Sparton Corporation and its wholly owned United States subsidiaries (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of the Company who have attained the age of 20 and have completed at least 60 days of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan was effective June 1, 1964, and most recently restated effective October 15, 2023.

Effective October 15, 2023, the Plan changed trustees and custodians from Bank of America, N.A. to Principal Trust Company.

Effective December 31, 2024, the Plan merged with and into the Elbit Systems of America Consolidated 401(k) Savings Plan. Accordingly, a transfer out of approximately \$45,491,000 is reported in the Plan’s financial statements.

Contributions

Eligible employees may elect to contribute up to 80% of their compensation, subject to certain limitations. The Plan also offers Roth 401(k) contributions as an alternative to traditional pre-tax contributions. Participants may also make rollover contributions of amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. The Plan provides that the Company may contribute, on a discretionary basis, contributions in the form of matching contributions or non-elective contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 50% of participants’ contributions up to 6% of their eligible compensation. There were no non-elective contributions made to the Plan during 2024 or 2023. All contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code” or “IRC”).

Participants who are eligible to make salary deferral contributions under the Plan and who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are permitted to make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to, the annual limitations imposed by the Code.

Participant Accounts

Each participant account is credited with the participant’s contributions, Company contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. For both employer matching and profit-sharing contributions, active employees who complete an hour of service beginning after January 3, 2011, are 100% vested in the Plan. For employees terminated prior to January 3, 2011, the following vesting schedule applies:

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balances a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. Loan terms range from one to five years, or longer for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts. Loans typically bear interest at the Prime Rate as published in the *Wall Street Journal* plus one percent. As of December 31, 2023, interest rates on outstanding loans range from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Participants withdrawing during the year for reasons of service or disability, retirement, death, or termination are entitled to their vested account balances. Benefits are distributed in the form of a lump-sum payment equal to the vested account balance or, if the vested account balance exceeds \$5,000, the participant may maintain his/her account in the Plan on a tax-deferred basis until the participant reaches age 70 ½. If withdrawing participants are not entitled to their entire account balances, the amounts not received are forfeited.

Benefit Payments – continued

Certain in-service withdrawals are allowed. A participant may also elect to withdraw all or a portion of his/her vested account balance while employed after reaching age 59 ½. A participant may receive a hardship distribution from salary reduction contributions if the distribution is: (1) on account of uninsured medical expenses incurred by the participant, his/her spouse, or dependents; (2) to purchase (excluding mortgage payments) a principal residence of the participant; (3) for the payment of post-secondary tuition expenses; (4) needed to prevent eviction of the participant from his/her principal residence or foreclosure upon the mortgage of the participant's principal residence; (5) payments for burial or funeral expenses for the participant's parent, spouse, children, or dependents; (6) expenses for the repair of damage to the participant's principal residence; or, (7) expenses and losses incurred for the participant on account of a disaster declared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Forfeitures

The Plan's trustees process unclaimed checks through the forfeiture account. Forfeitures are held by the Plan and become available immediately to pay administrative fees related to the Plan, then to reduce employer contributions, and, finally, to be allocated to Plan participants. There were no forfeitures used during the years ended December 31, 2024, and 2023. There were no unused forfeitures as of December 31, 2024. The unused forfeiture balance was approximately \$25,000 as of December 31, 2023.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct the investment of all contributions to the Plan among the investment alternatives made available by the Company under the Plan, which vary in degree of risk. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Plan Expenses

Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions of the Plan with no compensation from the Plan. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Plan pays substantially all costs relating to asset charges and record keeping. Any administrative expenses, if any, that are paid by the Company are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements except for those expenses paid by Plan participants.

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies – continued

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income

The investments of the Plan are stated at fair value as of the end of the year and are subject to market or credit risks customarily associated with equity investments. Fair value measurements are determined in accordance with U.S. GAAP, which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and requires certain disclosures about assets and liabilities measured at fair value.

Investment gains and losses are accounted for using the average cost basis of the securities sold. The net realized and unrealized gains on investments include realized gains and losses on sales of investments during the year and unrealized increases or decreases in the market value of investments held at year-end. Interest income and losses are recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Contributions

Contributions from the Company and participants are accrued as they become obligations of the Company, as determined by the plan administrator, and in the period in which they are deducted, in accordance with salary deferral agreements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at the unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Revenue Credits

The Plan's trust agreement provides for a participant revenue credit arrangement, whereby the trustee allocates quarterly deposits into the accounts of eligible participants who are invested in certain funds. There were no unallocated revenue credits as of December 31, 2024. Unallocated revenue credits as of December 31, 2023, were \$36,261.

C. Fair Value Measurements

U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a three-tier hierarchy that is used to identify assets and liabilities measured at fair value. The hierarchy focuses on the inputs used to measure fair value and requires that the lowest level input be used. The three levels defined in U.S. GAAP are as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs are unadjusted, quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities at the measurement date.
- Level 2 – Inputs (other than quoted prices included in Level 1) are either directly or indirectly observable for the assets or liabilities through correlation with market data at the measurement date and for the duration of the instruments' anticipated life.
- Level 3 – Inputs reflect the best estimate of what market participants would use in pricing the assets or liabilities at the measurement date. Consideration is given to the risk inherent in the valuation technique and the risk inherent in the inputs to the model.

U.S. GAAP requires that management describe the methodologies used to measure the fair value of assets and liabilities. The methodologies used to measure the fair value of the Plan's investments are as follows:

- Mutual funds are valued at the published per share net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. There are no significant restrictions on redeeming these investments at NAV.
- Stable value collective trust funds are composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that are valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

^(a) In accordance with U.S. GAAP, certain investments that were measured at NAV per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

These items are classified in their entirety based on the lowest priority level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the placement of assets and liabilities within the levels of the fair value hierarchy.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share practical expedient as of December 31, 2023. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

D. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2023, and net realized and unrealized gains on investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company and Bank of America, N.A. (the trustees of the Plan).

E. Tax Status

Effective October 15, 2023, the Plan was amended and restated by the adoption of the Principal Financial Group Pre-Approved Savings Plan with CODA, which has a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020. This opinion letter states that the form of the prototype plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Code. The Company may rely on this letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under Code Section 401(a) with certain limitations.

For the period from January 1, 2023 through October 14, 2023, the Plan utilized the Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Inc. Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan with CODA, which has a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020. This opinion letter states that the form of the prototype plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Code. The Company may rely on this letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under Code Section 401(a) with certain limitations.

The Company believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

On March 6, 2025, Sparton Corporation filed a Voluntary Correction Program (“VCP”) with the IRS to correct administrative errors with respect to the adopting employer provisions of the Plan. The Plan Sponsor did not timely correct ADP testing failures that occurred in each of the 2019 through 2022 plan years. To correct the failures, the Plan Sponsor will make qualified non-elective contributions to the Plan. The total amount outstanding as of December 31, 2023, was \$497,524, and is included as other employer receivables in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The amounts were funded to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan Sponsor has not received approval of the VCP filing from the IRS. However, the Plan Sponsor does not expect any significant changes to the Plan financial statements upon approval.

U.S. GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

F. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right to terminate or partially terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event the Company terminates the Plan, all amounts credited to participants' accounts will become 100% vested. See Note A regarding the Plan merger effective December 31, 2024.

G. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

H. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee organization, or relatives of such persons.

Notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. The Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
