1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Petersen Automotive Interests, Inc. 401(K) Plan (the Plan) have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

The Plan's investments are primarily invested in pooled separated accounts which are stated at fair value. The securities held in pooled separate accounts are valued at quoted market prices which collectively represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The Plan's other investments are held in a fully benefit responsive contract valued at contract value. This is an investment which is short term and allows participants the ability to withdraw funds at any time. The Voya Fixed Account guarantees principal and a minimum guaranteed interest rate for the life of the participant's account. Furthermore, the contract features two declared interest rates: a current rate determined at least monthly and a guaranteed minimum floor rate declared for a defined period. Interest is credited to the participants account daily.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

The Plan sponsor bears a significant portion of the administrative costs of the Plan.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of the Plan's financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period and, when applicable, disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participants may borrow amounts from the Plan up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested account balance. Note repayments are made by a payroll deduction over a period not to exceed five years (except for the purchase of a primary residence). Notes are reported at the outstanding principal balance and interest is recorded on the economic accrual basis. The interest rate is a reasonable rate of interest as established by the Plan administrator. A participant's failure to repay the note will result in the total outstanding amount of the loan including any accrued interest to be defaulted and deemed distributed to the participant. Accordingly, no allowance for loan losses is necessary.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Petersen Automotive Interests, Inc 401(K) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan covering all employees of Petersen Automotive Interests, Inc., Automotive Finance Company, LLC, and any affiliated employer (collectively, the Company) upon completion of 60 days of service and are twenty-one (21) years of age or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

CONTRIBUTIONS

Each year, participants may contribute any percentage of pretax annual compensation, up to the maximum deferral permitted by law. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company, at its discretion, may contribute a matching and profit sharing contribution.

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate, with a default deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation. Also, on January 1 each year, the deferral rate increases 1% up to a maximum of 8%.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, if any, and (b) Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined.

VESTING

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six (6) years of credited service.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions into selected pooled separate accounts or a group annuity contract that is administered by Voya. The available accounts allow the participant to choose from a variety of investment objectives.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant is entitled to receive the value of his account as soon as the distribution is administratively feasible. Participants withdrawing from the Plan receive their balance by (i) a transfer to another qualified plan, (ii) a transfer to an individual retirement account, or (iii) a lump sum distribution that is subject to applicable federal and state income tax withholdings.

Amounts contributed through salary or wage reductions may be withdrawn by, or distributed to, a participant only upon (1) termination of employment or (2) attaining the age of 59½. Withdrawals prior to attaining age 59½ are not permitted, except in the event of retirement, disability, or as a hardship distribution. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts contributed may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59½.

FORFEITURES

There were no forfeited nonvested accounts for the years ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023. Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer discretionary matching, profit sharing contributions and pay administrative expenses.

3. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to modify, suspend, or discontinue contributions to the Plan at any time, and such action shall not be deemed to be a termination of the Plan. The Plan sponsor also has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

In the event of Plan termination, each participant will become 100% vested in his or her account balance. Each participant, retired participant or beneficiary shall be entitled to receive any amounts then credited to his or her account.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (UNAUDITED)

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets. Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Pooled separate accounts are reported at fair value based on Level 2 inputs. The Level 2 inputs consists of quoted market prices for various securities held in pooled separate accounts. The following table provides a fair value hierarchy presentation for investments reported at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

In addition, the certified information includes investment appreciation and interest on notes receivable totaling \$1,390,784 and \$10,433, respectively.

Guaranteed Investment Contract With Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya). Voya maintains the contributions in a pooled account. The account is credited with actual earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract meets the criteria to be considered fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value.

Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$659,073 and \$619,812, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on an agreed-upon formula with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Voya. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants or the issuer, is probable.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is, therefore, not subject to tax under present income tax law. Since being qualified by the Internal Revenue Service the Plan has been amended. The Plan administrator and the Plan's trustee believe that the plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The sponsor is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST

Plan investments are held in pooled separate accounts managed by Voya. In addition, the Plan sponsor is party to an agreement with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, Raymond James Insurance Group, Inc., and Coastal Pension. Due to the services provided by these Companies, each of them is considered a party-in-interest.

8. MANAGERMENTS' REVIEW

Petersen Automotive Interests, Inc has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events that require recording or disclosure in the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2024.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

10. Secure Act 2.0

The SECURE Act 2.0 was signed into law in December 2022. SECURE Act 2.0 includes numerous reforms to existing retirement law intended to increase retirement savings, facilitate access to retirement savings, encourage employees to save for retirement, and simplify and clarify retirement plan rules.
