Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Bryan College Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (2024 Financial Statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Bryan College Retirement Savings Plan's 2024 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. We are required to be independent of Bryan College Retirement Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements


Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the 2024 financial statements.

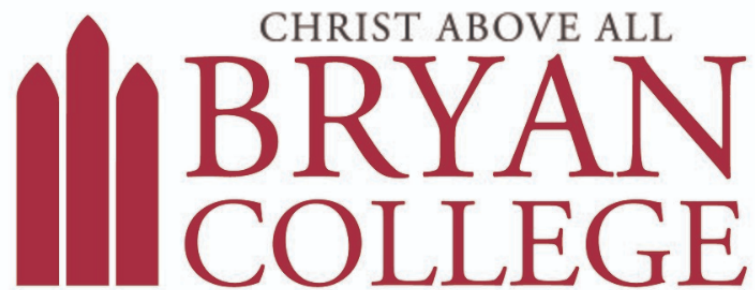

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

Note 1 – Plan Description

The following description of the Bryan College Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Bryan College (the “College”), excluding non-resident aliens and students. Participants may enter the Plan on the first of the month following their date of hire. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants contribute up to the maximum dollar amount allowed by law as pretax contributions or make post-tax Roth deferrals, as defined in the Plan. New participants are automatically enrolled with 3% pretax deferrals, unless a contrary election is made. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The College may make discretionary matching and nonelective contributions to eligible participants excluding adjunct faculty, employees that normally work less than 20 hours per week, and highly compensated employees as defined by *Internal Revenue Code* Section 414(q)(1)(B), at the sole discretion of the College. During June 2024 the Board approved to increase the College’s discretionary matching percentage from 1% to 2% which became effective in August 2024. There were no discretionary nonelective contributions during 2024. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution, the College’s matching and nonelective contributions, an allocation of earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the College portion of their account plus actual earnings thereon.

Payments of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant (or beneficiary) may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution, partial payments, installment payments, or annuity payments equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. In-service, hardship, ad-hoc, and qualified reservist distributions are also permitted, as defined.

Notes from Participants

Generally, participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$200 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the present value of their account balance. The maximum loan amount may be less; however,

depending on the amount of a participant's accumulation and whether any other loans have been granted from the Plan within the last year. Note terms range from one to five years unless the note is for purchase of a primary residence, in which case the term may exceed five years. Notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of Prime + 1.00%, as defined. The interest rates ranged from 5.00% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024.

Forfeitures

Prior to January 1, 2024, the Plan utilized a graded vesting schedule with participants becoming fully vested in the College's discretionary match after 5 years of credited service, as defined. Forfeited non-vested accounts were used to reduce employer contributions, as defined by the Plan.

Note 2 – Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the modified cash basis of accounting. This basis differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America in that interest and dividend income and contributions to the Plan are recognized when received rather than when earned and benefits and expenses are recognized when paid rather than when incurred.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income is recorded when received. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Notes from Participants

Notes from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances.

Benefit Payments

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Substantially all Plan fees and administrative expenses are paid by the Plan or College on a discretionary basis.

Reclassification

Certain amounts in the prior year have been reclassified to conform to the current year presentation.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's mutual funds, pooled separate account, and non-benefit-responsive traditional annuity investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority; Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets; and Level 3 consists of unobservable inputs and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair values of mutual funds and the pooled separate account are based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

The non-benefit-responsive TIAA Traditional Annuity is valued at fair value which equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts less any withdrawals. The significant unobservable inputs used in the fair value measurement of the Plan's Level 3 investments include interest rates and the terms of individual underlying annuity contracts. Significant changes to the terms of these contracts or interest rates could have resulted in

Note 4 – Investment Contract with Insurance Company

Non-Benefit-Responsive

Participants may choose to invest in a TIAA Traditional Annuity account that is not a fully benefit-responsive traditional investment contract. This contract pays a guaranteed rate of interest plus additional amounts that are not guaranteed but may be established on a year-by-year basis. These additional amounts, when declared, remain in effect through the end of the “declaration year,” which begins each March 1. Contributions to a participant’s account provide a guaranteed amount of lifetime annuity income. The guaranteed minimum interest rate is generally 3.00%.

Fully Benefit-Responsive

At December 31, 2023 and from January 1, 2024 to October 21, 2024, the Plan held an investment contract with American United Life Insurance Company ("AUL"). This contract, AUL Stable Value Account – met the fully-benefit responsive traditional contract criteria and, therefore, was reported at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

For the AUL Stable Value Account, interest rates were declared in advance as described in the contract and would always equal or exceed the contractually guaranteed rate. All monies in the stable value account would earn interest at the guaranteed rate until that guaranteed rate was changed. AUL declared a new guaranteed rate that became effective on January 1 of each calendar year. Declaration of a new rate would be at least 30 days in advance of the effective date of the new rate and any increase would not exceed 1% above the previously declared rate. Effective October 21, 2024, the AUL Stable Value Account was liquidated and its proceeds were transferred to and allocated within the applicable GuideStone participant accounts.

The following represents the total contract value of this investment contract held by the Plan at December 31, 2023.

When a participant's account in the non-benefit-responsive TIAA Traditional Annuity is annuitized based on available options, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the account balance. This annuitization is accounted for as an annuity settlement option, a type of distribution from the Plan used to purchase individual annuity contracts. The subsequent stream of annuity payments from the individual contract occurs outside of the Plan and does not represent an obligation of the Plan.

TIAA issues various types of contracts as funding vehicles for retirement plans. Certain contract types contain liquidity restrictions on the redemption of TIAA Traditional Annuity accumulations, which could impact the value realized upon exiting the contract.

Note 5 – Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the College. These employees are also Plan participants. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Plan investments are managed by TIAA, CREF, American United Life Insurance Company, and GuideStone Trust Services, the Plan's service providers, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. For the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses were paid to the Plan's service providers in the amount of \$14,551.

Note 6 – Plan Termination

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the College has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Note 7 – Tax Status

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan adopted a simplified ERISA 403(b) volume submitter document sponsored by GuideStone Financial Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated August 7, 2017, stating that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the *Internal Revenue Code (IRC)*. The Plan has been restated since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the *IRC* and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

Note 8 – TIAA, CREF, AUL, and GuideStone Certifications
